Father Donahoe was able to identify the availability of the Bodmer Papyrus, which is the oldest written version of the Gospels of St. John and St. Luke and contains the oldest written version of the Lord's Prayer which was written sometime between 175 and 225 AD.

Pave the Way initiated contact between Fr. Donahoe with the Vatican Library. It was also through the efforts of Pave the Way that a donor was identified, Mr. Frank Hanna III of Atlanta, Georgia, who helped make available this historic acquisition for worldwide study. It remains in the care of the Vatican Library. Apostolic Nuncio to the United States, Archbishop Pietro Sambi, was instrumental in helping to realize this historical event.

Pave the Way Foundation is extremely pleased to have played a key role in The Bodmer Papyrus Project.









Maimonides was an enlightened Rabbi, philosopher and physician, whose writings are revered by the Christian, Jewish and Muslim religions. He died 800 years ago, but his writings and message of reconciliation, born of understanding the similarities of the three faiths, is extremely relevant today. He wrote in both Hebrew and Arabic and his manuscripts highlight the convergence of these faiths. Some of these writings have been housed in the Vatican Library. Many of these important historical and theological works have never been available for public viewing before this project.

Paul II, to thank him for his great strides and leadership regarding religious reconciliation.

NEW YORK, **January 5**, **2005** – Pave the Way Foundation announced today that it has been granted a special private audience with His Holiness Pope John Paul II in Vatican City on Tuesday, January 18, 2005.

A group of some 160 Jewish leaders, rabbis and cantors from throughout the United States, Europe and Israel – which is the largest group gathering of Jewish leaders to ever meet with a sitting pope — will attend the audience and thank the Holy Father for all the work he has done to reconcile the two faiths. They will recognize the Pope's efforts during his 26-year pontificate in bringing down the walls of hate, as well as his contribution towards religious reconciliation with the Jewish people and the State of Israel. The Rabbis intend to recite a special prayer in his honor at the ceremony.

Gary Krupp, President and founder of the Pave the Way Foundation, stated, "Our mission at Pave the Way is to bring together men of good will, no matter what their religious background and to ruthlessly tear down any wall that stops this from happening."

"Pope John Paul II has been doing just that for decades. It is only fitting that we humbly thank him for all he has done for the Jewish people of Earth and, in turn, making inroads toward true peace on Earth," added Mr. Krupp, who is the seventh Jewish man in history to be knighted by the pope to the order of St. Gregory the Great. The group attending the audience will include Oded Ben-Hur, Israeli Ambassador to the Holy See; Amire Ofek, Israeli Consul for Media in New York; Rabbi Adam Mintz, president of the New York Board of Rabbis; Rabbi Shmuel Rene Sirat, Former Chief Rabbi of Europe and France; Rabbi David Lincoln, Chief Rabbi of the Park Avenue Synagogue, New York; Rabbi Shlomo Riskin, Chief Rabbi of Efrat, Israel, Rabbi Joseph Arbib of the Great Synagogue in Rome and Gadi Golan, former Director of Religious Affairs for the Israeli Foreign Ministry.

The group also will include over 12 Cantors, who on Monday, January 17, at 8 p.m. will present a concert at the Great Synagogue in Rome for the delegation and representatives of the Vatican and the Roman Jewish Community. Mr..

Krupp pointed out that Pope John Paul II has a very long history of supporting the rights of the Jewish people and of speaking out against anti-Semitism and, factually, of discrimination of any group. In 1978 he characterized anti-Semitism as "opposed to the very spirit of Christianity." In 1987, he called on all Christians to develop, together with the Jewish community, "common educational programs which...will teach future generations about the Holocaust so that never again will such a horror be possible. Never again!" "Pave the Way Foundation has been instrumental in helping to close the gap between the Vatican and the State of Israel in their talks to finalize full diplomatic relations", says Elliot Hershberg Chairman of Pave the Way. As further evidence of the effectiveness of their efforts, Mr. Krupp announced that the Vatican has given permission for the loan of the Maimonides Manuscripts along great Jewish writings to the Israel Museum for its 40th anniversary exhibit in spring 2005.

Mr. Krupp, who initiated the loan request of the manuscripts from the Vatican Library, commented that. "This is the first time these historic manuscripts will be on Israeli soil."



Truth does not become more true by virtue of the fact that the entire world agrees with it, nor less so even if the whole world disagrees with it. – Maimonides With the opening of the new Yad Vashem (Holocaust Memorial in Jerusalem) exhibit in 2005, there was an historically incorrect placard placed above a photo of WWII Pope Pius XII in the "Hall of Shame." There was international outcry to remove troubling remarks about the Church's supposed inaction during the Holocaust.

PTWF was asked to help resolve this issue, which has plagued Jewish Catholic relations for the past 47 years.

On July 1, 2012, after six years of work to identify and post online 76,000 pages of documents, news articles, official published works, and videotaped, eye witness testimonials from survivors, Yad Vashem revised their controversial placard to reflect a more accurate and balanced view. **PTWF applauds this move** towards historical accuracy, which Yad Vashem has clearly taken. In furtherance of the mission of PTWF, we are attempting to remove obstacles between the religions. Mindful of this, we have initiated an independent investigation of the Papacy of Pope Pius XII. This time in history has been a source of friction between the Jews and Catholics for over 70 years. PTWF has privately undertaken an extensive investigation of this important and controversial historical period. We believe that our work will eventually result in eliminating one of the greatest obstacles to religious unity between these two groups.

The Valican, under Pius XI, Achille Rattl, and represented by the Secretary of State Eugenio Pacelli, signed a concordat with Nazi Germany in July 1933, in order to preserve the rights of the Catholic Church in Germany.

The reaction of Pius XII, Eugenio Pacelli, to the murder of the Jews during the Holocaust is a matter of controversy among scholars. From the onset of World War II, the Vatican maintained a policy of neutrality. The Pontiff abstained from signing the Allies' declaration of December 17, 1942 condemning the extermination of the Jews. Yet, in his Christmas radio address of December 24, 1942 he referred to "the hundreds of thousands of persons who, without any fault on their part, sometimes only because of their nationality or ethnic origin (stirpe), have been consigned to death or to a slow decline." Jews were not explicitly mentioned. When Jews were deported from Rome to Auschwitz, the Pontiff did not publicly protest. The Holy See appealed separately to the rulers of Slovakia and Hungary on behalf of the Jews. The Pope's critics claim that his decision to abstain from condemning the murder of the Jews by Nazi Germany constitutes a moral failure: the lack of clear guidance left room for many to collaborate with Nazi Germany, reassured by the thought that this did not contradict the Church's moral teachings. It also left the initiative to rescue Jews to individual clerics and laymen. His defenders maintain that this neutrality prevented harsher measures against the Vatican and the Church's institutions throughout Europe, thus enabling a considerable number of secret rescue activities to take place al different levels of the Church. Moreover, they point to cases in which the Pontiff offered encouragement to activities in which Jews were rescued. Until all relevant material is available to scholars, this topic will remain open to further inquiry.



Pius XII's reaction to the murder of the Jews during the Holocaust is a matter of controversy. In 1933, when he was Secretary of the Vatican State, he was active in obtaining a Concordat with the German regime to preserve the Church's rights in Germany, even if this meant recognizing the Nazi racist regime. When he was elected Pope in 1939, he shelved a letter against racism and antisemitism that his predecessor had prepared. Even when reports about the murder of Jews reached the Vatican, the Pope did not protest either verbally or in writing. In December 1942, he abstained from signing the Allied declaration condemning the extermination of the Jews. When Jews were deported from Rome to Auschwitz, the Pope did not intervene. The Pope maintained his neutral position throughout the war, with the exception of appeals to the rulers of Hungary and Slovakia towards its end. His silence and the absence of guidelines obliged Churchmen throughout Europe to decide on their own how to react.

Resolving Controversy Resulting from Incorrect Information - Lifting of Ban on Society of Pius X

Pope Benedict XVI lifted the excommunication of a group that included a known Holocaust denier. This action upset both Jewish and Catholic leaders. PTWF interceded and helped quell the firestorm by releasing correct and full information to the public and advising the Vatican to openly address the issue.

PTWF interceded to define the action of Pope Benedict XVI, as he attempted to reach out to the 1970 breakaway, schismatic Society of Pius X, to bring them back to the Roman Catholic fold.

His Holiness lifted the ban of excommunication, decreed by the illicit ordination of bishops, which only allowed the Vatican to negotiate the return to church teachings. Many of the world's religious leaders and organizations perceived that the Pope was lifting the ban against Richard Williamson, an illicitly ordained bishop who is an infamous Holocaust denier. This action raised major international concerns. Pave the Way Foundation immediately acted to advise the Vatican to issue a press release explaining to the public that the ban did not bring the group back to full communion with the Catholic Church.

Lifting the Ban of Excommunication by the Vatican

Recently, The Vatican lifted the ban of excommunication to the Society of Pius X, an ultra-right wing group, and to its four illicitly ordained Bishops. The bishops were ordained by the breakaway Archbishop Marcel Lefebvre. Archbishop Lefebvre split from the Vatican for several reasons, one of which was the action of the Second Vatican Council in adapting and passing Nostra Aetate.

This is a document of tolerance of other religious beliefs. On the commemoration of the 50th anniversary of the Second Vatican Council, Pope Benedict XVI used this occasion to lift the ban of excommunication, which was generated when Archbishop Lefebvre ordained four Bishops in direct violation of a papal order not to, issued by Pope John Paul II. It was this act of defiance against the Papal order that generated the excommunication. After the announcement of the lifting of the ban was made on January 21, 2009, a video interview with one of the Bishops, Richard Williamson, surfaced where he quite plainly denied the holocaust impact on the Jewish people and stated that not one Jew had perished in any gas chamber. This Holocaust denial set off a firestorm of protests and negative remarks, which created a temporary rift in Jewish Catholic relations.

Unlike many other inter-religious organizations, Pave the Way did not immediately release a statement condemning the Church for lifting the ban. Instead, we launched an investigation to discover the facts behind this alleged

action.

Finalize the Affirmation of His Beatitude Theophilos III Greek Orthodox Patriarch of Jerusalem

The Greek Orthodox Church has duly elected a new Patriarch of Jerusalem. This process was legally conducted and the newly elected Patriarch, His Beatitude Theophilos III, immediately enjoyed full endorsements by all other Christian Churches, by the Jordanian Government and by the Palestinian Authority. These are the required approvals. The Israeli government must also affirm the legal status of the Patriarch. The Israeli's process is taking additional time and consequently the new Patriarch cannot discharge his duties or take possession of the residence or business affairs of his Church.

In the interest of inter-religious harmony and positive, improved relations, Pave the Way Foundation has requested that the Prime Minister of Israel and the King of Jordan give this problem their attention. We have requested that the required affirmation be granted as soon as possible, in the interest of religious freedom, harmonious relations, and the separation of politics from religious practice.

October 2006, the Israeli Inter-ministerial Director advised the government of Israeli that he recommended Theophilos III be affirmed. We are now waiting for the conclusion of this process. PTWF urges the government of Israel to complete this process quickly, in the interest of positive interreligious relations. PTWF intervenes by Fedexing a letter to the high Court of Israel. After receipt of our **letter**, this endless 6 month trial postponements ended, and Theophilos III was named Patriarch

PTWF is exploring the notion of removing historic obstacles between those within the same faith. We are exploring historic projects that will "pave the way" to improve relations between good people of all religions.

Complaints of Tel Aviv Airport security's abrupt and disrespectful treatment of religious clergy were common, impacting tourism. PTWF created a manual, now required reading for airport personnel, on how to properly treat persons of various world religions. Complaints have markedly decreased.

In our quest to increase tourism in the Holy Land and to Israel, we discovered that many Christian clergy were complaining about "abrupt" security measures taken at Ben Gurion Airport. Many expressed a negative sense when they underwent questioning at the airport and felt somewhat violated when searched or questioned about their religious vestments. Certainly no one denies the necessity of strict security measures at Ben Gurion Airport, but the way security personnel

were treating Christian clergy needed to be addressed.

The Airport Authority, working in tandem with the Ministry of Tourism, understood this problem existed and was very happy to accept our offer to help. PTWF developed a "Manual of Etiquette" specifically designed to help educate airport personnel in these delicate matters. This informative book is now required reading, and it has been reported to PTWF that there is now a marked *decrease* in complaints.

PTWF wishes to compliment the Israeli Airport Authority for recognizing this problem and so quickly acting to eliminate it. Responding to such concerns is a very important factor in increasing tourism to the region. Tourism helps everyone in the Holy Land.

Palestinian – Israeli Peace

Throughout the history of the modern State of Israel, peace has eluded all of the people of the region. PTWF is working with prominent Palestinians who wish to give the Palestinian people another choice. Contrary to media coverage of this region, both the Palestinians and the Israelis desperately want peace. The media seems to only report on the exceptional few extremists. The truth is, people from both sides have the same message. For three generations we have been at war and we don't want our children to have to continue this. It is the special interest of an elite few, which has driven this region to constant conflict.

They carry the legal authority of the Holy Q'uran.

The Dajani family is beginning a movement towards starting a third electoral party in Palestine, called Wasatia. PTWF is committed to help make this a reality.

In Dr. Dajani's own words, the essence of the Wasatia Party:

"wasatia is a concept extracted from the Arabic word "wasat" which means "middle of the road", and "center of the circle." It is used in Arabic to mean also "balance" "moderation". In the Holy Quran, it is used to mean "goodness", "righteousness", "justice", and "straightforwardness." Wasat is said to be that which is in the midst of extremes such as hot and cold, rich and poor, empty and full, generosity and stinginess, courage and cowardice.

It is time for wasatia creed to emerge and rise in the Moslem world that it may draw the best and the brightest from among the Moslem community. The new initiative adopts the wasatiah Islamic tradition and the shura Islamic concept as its' main pillars. Al-Wasatiah calls for Muslims to take mid-ground that stands between those who sanctify strict tradition and those who opt for rational thinking in reading and explaining the Holy Quran in compliance with the Surah in the Holy Quran: {And so we have created you a midway nation.}



Finalizing Vatican-Israeli Relations - Identifying **Obstacles to the Fundamental Agreements**

Efforts for full diplomatic relations between the Holy See and Israel have been stalled since 1994, leading to legal actions and animosity. Since 2002, PTWF has worked with officials to overcome obstacles in legal, fiscal, and property matters. Progress has been made but the effort is still ongoing.

A Gesture in Peace



Since 2002, we have been attempting to help to finalize the fundamental agreements between Israel and the Holy See. These are critical agreements dealing with legal, fiscal, (taxation issues) and property issues that have remained unfinished since 1994. The absence of which have caused many legal conflicts and malevolent attitudes.

We have met with three Israeli ambassadors to the Holy See, three Israeli Prime Ministers, the President of Israel two Vatican Secretaries of State and the Foreign Minister of the Vatican State to move the negotiations to a successful conclusion.

To date the taxation schedules have been assembled and the legal personality and property agreements have been completed. As of this writing the agreements must be translated into Hebrew for ratification by the Knesset.



Pave the Way Foundation Recognizes the Historic Significance of Assisi in Protecting Jewish Refugees with Upcoming Exhibition

Wantagh, NY, January 27, 2022—Pave the Way Foundation (PTWF), whose mission is to initiate historical projects and remove obstacles between religions, is sponsoring an historic presentation in New York with the Diocese of Assisi, Italy, recognizing the lifesaving actions taken by clergy and citizens of Assisi in protecting Jewish refugees during the Holocaust. With Northern Italy occupied by German troops in 1943, the historic town of Assisi, home of Saint Francis of Assisi, found itself thrown into the atrocities of war. Archbishop Nicolini, acting on requests from Rome, rallied Assisi's citizens and clergy to come together and save the lives of their Jewish brethren, being hunted down by the Nazis.

Elliot Hershberg, Pave the Way Foundation Chairman, remarked "at a time in history when forces around the world would strive to divide rather than unite, we are reminded by this exhibit of the historic, lifesaving acts of conscience Roman Catholics performed, at their own peril, to help and save so many Jewish victims of Nazi barbarism."

The exhibit features panels from the "Museo della Memoria Assisi" (The Museum of Memory) and includes a roundtable discussion led by Professor Johan Ickx, Archivist for the Historical Archives of the Vatican Secretary of State, and Elizabeth Bettina, author of "It Happened in Italy." Also attending: Archbishop of Assisi, Domenico Sorrentino; Monsignor Anthony Figueiredo; and the Mayor of Assisi, Stefania Proietti.

"How happy we are to bring our museum to America," Archbishop Sorrentino notes. "Not only to remember a light that shone through a dark time in history, but also to tell the world that good can and must win over evil. Like the Jews, too many people are stripped of their dignity as human beings. St. Francis stripped himself to be a universal brother. In his footsteps, we welcome the initiative of Gary Krupp, his Chairman and Board and thank all of our gracious hosts who help us 'pave the way' together to witness fraternity and peace."

The museum's founder and curator, Marina Rosati, also attending, looks forward to, "this important opportunity to make known the extraordinary history of Assisi in the dark period of the Holocaust. Some 300 Jews were welcomed and saved, not one was deported or killed. Yad Vashem has recognized seven of the heroes of Assisi as Righteous Among Nations."

Two events are planned: April 5, 2022, at Temple Israel in New Rochelle, and April 6 at St. John's University in Queens. Rabbi Jay Rosenbaum and Temple Israel stated "We are honored to host The Assisi Museum Exhibit, and excited to lead the roundtable discussion. The congregation of Temple Israel and I welcome this unique opportunity to fulfill the Mitzvah of Zachor, remembrance of the Shoah in a world seemingly filled with moral amnesia. With this exhibit, we not only memorialize the 6,000,000 Jews who were murdered by the Nazis, but the righteous of Assisi who risked everything to save innocent Jewish lives. May their souls be bound up in the bond of eternal life, as we honor them through this project of reconciliation and hope with the light of love."

"It is a privilege and honor to welcome the Assisi Museum of Memory Exhibit to St. John's," commented Joseph Sciame, Vice-President for Community Relations at St. John's University. "By doing so, we honor the memory of so many who afforded our Jewish sisters and brothers in those dark days in Italy, what one might call 'the gift of life' from the citizenry in that area, as well as so many other communities in Italy at that time."

"The images of these manuscripts are copies of covenants, which contain a picture of a hand. This image, plus original wax seals, shows that the originals were touched and approved by the Prophet Muhammad, Blessings and Peace be upon him. As authenticated primary documents, which predate the compilation of the Sunnah, these covenants carry the same legal authority as the Holy Qur'an.

These covenants order the followers of the Prophet, Blessings and Peace be upon him, to protect peaceful Christians, Jews, and other allied communities

until the end of days. They order that the churches and synagogues and Holy Shrines equally must be protected. They declare that Christians and Jews are believers in one God who form an integral part of the Muslim Ummah or Community. They are not infidels or non-believers.

What has happened? The existence of these covenants has been hidden from the believers, by agents of Satan who lie and pervert the goodness of Islam for their evil purposes. These agents of Satan are disguised as religious leaders to trick the good people into performing evil acts, which are not in service of Allah but only serve Satan. How many of these false leaders, who preached violence and hatred, have sent their own children out to die?

We want to warn all true Muslims who listen to the lies of these agents of Satan to repent if they wish to save their souls. Do not act on their evil demands, do not give them money or any support, shun them and denounce them if you truly wish to enter paradise.

Muhammad's Promise to the Monks of St. Catherine's Monastery Until the End of Days:

"This is a message from Muhammad ibn Abdullah, as a covenant to those who adopt Christianity, near and far, we are with them.

Verily I, the servants, the helpers, and my followers defend them, because Christians are my citizens; and by Allah! I hold out against anything that displeases them. No compulsion is to be on them. Neither are their judges to be removed from their jobs nor their monks from their monasteries. No one is to destroy a house of their religion, to damage it, or to carry anything from it to the Muslims' houses. Should anyone take any of these, he would spoil God's covenant and disobey His Prophet. Verily, they are my allies and have my secure charter against all that they hate.

No one is to force them to travel or to oblige them to fight. The Muslims are to fight for them. If a female Christian is married to a Muslim, it is not to take place without her approval. She is not to be prevented from visiting her church to pray. Their churches are to be respected. They are neither to be prevented from repairing them nor the sacredness of their covenants.

No one of the nation (Muslims) is to disobey the covenant till the Last Day (end of the world)."

A book made covenant with them, he who violates the covenant that is in it, disobeyed it for something else, and trespassed: his affair is nothing but a violation of God's covenant; he voids his pact, and mocks his religion, and deserves a curse, whether he was a sultan (authority) or someone else from the Muslims believers:

- Do not foreseeably change a bishop of his bishopric, nor a monk of is monkhood, an anchorite from his cell (cave), or a hermit of his hermitic; and do not destroy nor sell any patrimony of their churches. Do not utilize anything (capital or materials) from church construction into the construction of a mosque or that of the homes of Muslims. He who does something like that, has broken the covenant of God and has violated his Messenger. Jizya (a fine tribute) or penalty is not to be taken from monks, bishops or worshipers, and I preserve their pact wherever they are on land or sea, East or West, North or South. They are in my conscience and charter, and protection from all evil.
- Do not argue with them except in a way that is best, have mercy on them, and protect them from hated harm wherever they are and wherever they go.
- Assist in reconstruct (patch, remodel) their churches and monasteries, and this would be as aid to them in their religion and for their commitment to the covenant.

Ali bin Abi Taleb wrote this covenant with his handwriting in the Prophet's Mosque, and witnessed this covenant the Companions of the Messenger of God, peace be upon him.

Meaning: bring the good news to the believers a warner to the disbelievers. Meaning: covenant.

Capital letters used in Mighty and Wise because these are some of the many synonyms for the word God in Islam.

"hermit of his hermitic" is the closest translation to سایح من سیاحته. The verbatim translation for سایح is tourist. However, the author was not referring to our current day tourist and tourism; he refers to a spiritual ranking in the Coptic Orthodox church that can only be achieved through prayer, fasting, and being in hermit. When one reaches the level "tourist" in the Coptic Orthodox church, it means that he can travel from point A to point B without using transportation and he can enter a building without having to go through the doors or window.

Jezya: a fee that was paid by non-Muslim men to Muslims for protection. Women, children, and elders were exempt from paying it.



Translation of the supporting documents

God is great and governeth, from whom all the prophets are come, for there remaineth no record of injustice against God; through the gifts that are given unto men, Mohammed, the son of Abdallah, the Apostle of God, and careful quardian of the whole world, has written the present instrument, to all those that are his national people, and of his religion, as a secure and positive promise to be accomplished to the Christian nation and relations of the Nazareen, whosoever they may be, whether they be the noble or the vulgar, the honourable or otherwise, saying thus: I. Whosoever of my nation shall presume to break my promise and oath which is contained in this present agreement, destroys the promise of God, acts contrary to the oath and will be a resister of the faith (which God forbid!) for he becometh worthy of the curse, whether he be the king himself or a poor man, or what person soever he may be.

II. That whenever any of the monks in his travels shall happen to settle on any mountain, hill, village, or in any other habitable place, on the sea or in deserts, or in any convent, church, or house of prayer, I shall be in the midst of them, as the preserver and protector of them, their goods and effects, with my soul, aid and protection, jointly with all my national people, because they are a part of my own people, and an honour to me.

III. Moreover, I command all officers not to require any poll tax of them or any other tribute, because they shall not be forced or compelled to anything of this kind.

IV. None shall presume to change their judges or governors, but they shall remain in their office without being deposed.

V. No one shall molest them when they are travelling on the road.

VI. Whatever churches they are possessed of, no one is to deprive them of them.

VII. Whosoever shall annul any of these my decrees, let him know positively that he annuls the ordinance of God.

VIII. Moreover, neither their judges, governors, monks, servants, disciples, or any others depending on them, shall pay any poll tax or be molested on that account, because I am their protector, wheresoever they shall be, either by land or sea, east or west, north or south; because both they and all that belong to them are included in this my promissory oath and patent.

IX. And of those that live quietly and solitary upon the mountains, they shall exact neither poll tax nor tithes from their incomes, neither shall any Mussulman partake of what they have, for they labor only to maintain themselves.

X. Whenever the crop of the earth shall be plentiful in its due time, the inhabitants shall be obliged, out of every bushel, to give them a certain measure.

XI. Neither in time of war shall they take them out of their habitation, nor compel them to go to the wars, nor even then shall they require of them any poll-tax.

In these eleven chapters is to be found whatever relates to the monks; as to the remaining seven chapters they direct what relates to every Christian.

XII. Those Christians who are inhabitants, and with their riches and traffic are able to pay the poll-tax, shall pay no more than 12 drachmas.

XIII. Excepting this, nothing more shall be required of them, according to the express word of God, that says: 'Do not molest those that have a veneration for the Books that are sent from God, but rather, in a kind manner, give of your good things to them, and converse with them, and hinder every one from molesting them.'

XIV. If a Christian woman shall happen to marry a Mussulman, the Mussulman shall not cross the inclination of his wife to keep her from her chapel and prayers and the practice of her religion.*

XV. That no person hinders them from repairing their churches.

XVI. Whosoever acts contrary to this my grant, or gives credit to anything contrary to it, becomes truly an apostate from God and his divine Apostle, because this protection I have granted to them according to this promise.

XVII. No one shall bear arms against them, but, on the contrary, the Mussulmans shall wage war for them.

XVIII. And by this I ordain that none of my nation shall presume to do or act contrary to this promise until the end of the world.

This present was written by the leader, the successor of Ali, the son of Abu Thaleb; the prophet marking it with his own hand at the mosque of the Prophet (on whom be peace!) in the second year of Hegira, the third day of the month of Machorem.

* Turkish lawyers give as an example of this point, that the Mussulman son of a Christian mother is bound to convey her, when old or infirm, to the church door, upon a beast (horse or a mule etc.); and should he be poor and possess no beast, he is bound to carry her on his shoulders."[1]

PTWF is Responding to Disproportionate Educational Funding in Israel

Pave the Way Foundation has partnered with the <u>Center for Jewish-Christian Understanding & Cooperation</u> in order to respond to the recent disproportionate funding of Christian schools, declared by the Israel ministry of Education. Bear in mind, that only in Israel are Christians fully protected and free to practice their faith in the Middle East. The problem of disproportionate educational funding will only become more acute.

- Since the beginning of September 2015, Christian schools have been on strike, protesting the severe budget cuts by Ministry of Education. Prior to 2008, Christian schools received 75% of state funding, but now, they receive just 29%. The Center for Jewish-Christian Understanding and Cooperation (CJCUC) and the Galilee Center for Studies in Jewish-Christian Relations (CSJCR) at Yezreel Valley College, in cooperation with Pave the Way Foundation believe it is time for both Jews and Christian around the world to join forces and advocate for 100% funding for Christian schools in Israel.
- We have created a <u>campaign letter</u> (<u>efcs.cjcuc.com</u>) asking both Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and Minister of Education Naftali Bennett to find a quick and just solution to the budget crisis of Christian school education. Please review the letter, fill in the details and hit "submit." It will be emailed to both the Prime Minister and the Minister of Education. I kindly ask you to promote this email to your networks of influence.
- Next month, the official celebrations for the 50th anniversary of Nostra Aetate will be occurring around the world. Part of the festivities will be honoring the unprecedented dialogue between Jews and Christians in the last half century, which has created long lasting friendships and brought millions of Christian visitors to Israel. Particularly at this time, it is important that both Jews and Christians around the world make this issue of funding Christian education in Israel a number one priority.

Improving Tourism in Israel and the Holy Land.

Continuous violence and conflict has had an enormous adverse financial impact on the regional tourism industry. Both sides of the conflict suffer profound loss, not just in terms of life and human dignity, but in terms of economic and financial losses as well. During the Intifada, Israeli unemployment hit 11%. The rate in the territories has been as high as 30-60%. Everyone is suffering. Pave the Way is trying to change the course of this harsh reality, by encouraging special visits to the Holy Land, by Christian leaders. Some of these prelates have been charged with the pastoral care and diocesan responsibility of millions of faithful Christians.

It is our belief that, as economies improve, the seeds of violence and radicalism will fail to take root. Pave the Way is working with the Israeli Ministry of Tourism to encourage these most important pilgrimages.

Partnering with Israeli government officials, Pave the Way has been successful in facilitating the removal of several protocol and procedural barriers that have long been problematic to an already decimated tourism industry.

Removing Ban on Educating Priests in Halki Seminary Progress Made but Project Still Ongoing

The Turkish government closed the only Greek Orthodox Seminary in Turkey in 1970. PTWF and Gary Krupp's have achieved partial success in reopening it, with the religious basis removed with Muhammad's Covenants of Protection. PTWF continues to petition the Prime Minister for reopening and has been working with the Turkish ambassadors to the EU, United States, and United Nations.

May 2012, PTWF intervened based on the <u>Prophet Muhammad's</u> <u>Covenants of Protection of the Christians and Jews</u>, through the Turkish Ambassadors for the EU, the United States and the United Nations with a <u>letter addressed to the Prime Minister</u> requesting the reopening of the Greek Orthodox Halki (Heybeliada) Seminary.

In 1970 the Turkish government declared that the Ecumenical Patriarch of Constantinople can on be a Turkish citizen. The government then closed the only Greek Orthodox Seminary in Turkey

Partial success- Islamic director in Turkey Mehmet Görmez stated: "As the Religious Affairs Directorate, we see non-Muslim citizens living in Turkey as an integral part of this country. Regarding religious freedoms — freedom of religion, freedom to receive an education and the sacredness of places of worship — we demand for them the same rights that we demand for ourselves. We think it is a fundamental right for people from every ethnicity and religion not only in our country but also in every part of the world to practice their religion freely, educate their children in accordance with their beliefs and raise their own theologians,"

Improving Vatican Israeli Relations

When diplomatic relations began with Israel on Dec 30, 1993, a few important issues were never settled and remain outstanding today. Improved relations with the Holy See, will have enormous benefits to Israel, both economically and politically. Better communication will also

ensure that this relationship will continue into the next Papacy. Through recurrent, ongoing meetings with Father David Jaeger, spokesperson for the Franciscan Custody and legal representative of the Holy See in Israel, and <u>Archbishop Antonio Franco</u>, Apostolic Nuncio and Papal Delegate for the Holy See in Israel and the Holy Land, we have been able to focus on specific, problematic issues between Israel and the Vatican.

Several problems have been identified, which the Vatican would like to resolve in order to further this cordial relationship. Similarly, Pave the Way has raised a number of issues to the Israeli government's attention, which were easily rectified. For example, the issuance of Christian visas and other low level restrictions on travel in Israel and the territories, which hampered the resurgence of Christian pilgrimages, have been successfully addressed.

PTWF also acted immediately when behind the scenes obstacles were hampering advancement of the bilateral negotiations. We are proud to have been acknowledged as the one organization which acted decisively in order to keep these negotiations on track. We continue to monitor <u>progress</u> as an outside interested party, in order to see these problems resolved.

We have pledged the support and action of Pave the Way to further normalize this relationship. In encouraging and supporting productive relations between Israel and the Vatican we hope to establish a major cooperative liaison, resulting in broad cultural exchanges of artifacts between both Israel and the Vatican. Pave the Way continues to address unresolved issues, which remain open from the original negotiations and <u>agreement from the 1993 accords</u>.

Pave the Way Initiates Gift of the Tikkunei Zohar to The Vatican Library

Late last month, Pope Francis received a local gift from New York that served as a goodwill gesture to promote greater understanding among people of different faiths.

Pave the Way Foundation — a Wantagh, L.I.-based organization whose mission is to "end the malevolent use of religion" — organized a trip to Rome to present the pope with a copy of a Jewish sacred text for use in the Vatican Library.

The document was a replica of the English translation of the "Tikkunei Zohar," an ancient sacred text of the Jewish Kabbalah, a mystical movement that interprets the Bible. The Tikkunei Zohar is a collection of 70 commentaries written in Aramaic on the opening of the Torah, the Hebrew Bible.



Pilgrims: A not so big "Welcome" to Bethlehem, Jericho and

Emmaus.

Jerusalem (AsiaNews) – There are obstacles placed in the way of pilgrims wanting to visit the Holy Land. Over the past few days Israeli border officials have been passing a leaflet in English and Arabic to travelers arriving in Israel and Palestine. Written In large print is a great big "Welcome to the State of Israel". However the leaflet specifies that "entry into the territories under the control of the Palestinian Authority" (i.e. Gaza, Judea and Samaria) "is forbidden". This means that it is impossible for pilgrims to reach Bethlehem, Jericho, Emmaus and Qumran, traditional destinations for all Christian pilgrims

A written request is necessary to enter these territories, while waiting for the authorization from the Israeli military government, which promises to respond within 5 working days.

The request itself does not authorize any entry. Only a written response from the military government's Foreign Relations Office constitutes a valid authorization.

Anyone daring to enter these territories without authorization risks serious sanctions: "legal measures" and even "deportation and refusal of future re-entry into the State of Israel".

Special instructions are given for those requesting entry into the Gaza Strip. The request must be submitted directly to the Foreign Relations Office, located in the "Erez" crossing, recently the stage of a suicide attack.

Pilgrims no longer limited to travel through Judea and Samaria

Rome (AsiaNews) -There are no longer problems and obstacles for pilgrims wanting to reach Bethlehem and the Occupied Territories. Israel's ambassador to the Holy See, Oded Ben Hur, told AsiaNews today that the Tel Aviv airport no longer passes out leaflets stating that visits to the Occupied Territories are limited and that it has "returned to previous procedures".

Last Jan. 22 AsiaNews reported that Tel Aviv airport military personnel handed out leaflets to pilgrims wanting to travel to the Occupied Territories (Bethlehem, Jericho, Emmaus, Qumran, etc.), informing them they needed special authorization to visit these places.

Military authorities were given the final authority to grant permission or not. Israeli sources confidentially told AsiaNews the procedure risked stopping tourism in the Holy Land.

The Ministry of Tourism, worried about the procedure's consequences on the flow of tourism (which was already tested by problems with terrorism and Israeli-Palestinian tension), attempted to put the brakes on requiring such special authorizations.

Yesterday, Feb. 18. the Israeli tourism minister, Raphael Ben Hour, issued a statement in Hebrew, asking "to get rid of the leaflet informing tourists that their travel to Palestinian Authority territories, in Judea and Samaria, was prohibited."

In the statement he said "instructions have been given to border police to stop passing out the leaflet ... at Ben Gurion airport" so that "tourist travel to Judea and Samaria will be permitted according to the rule and norms" of the past. In his statement he makes no mention of Gaza, which has been placed under tight control following the latest terrorist attacks."

During a telephone call with AsiaNews, Ambassador Oded Ben Hur said "all this (the leaflet and its stipulated travel restrictions) was a mistake and we have corrected it."

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Exposed Propaganda Bus Ads in Rome – Ads Intended to Create Controversy Quickly Removed

International uproar ensued when ads using Vatican Travel Office logos without authorization appeared in Rome and purported to separate Jews and Catholics. This was detrimental to Jewish/Catholic relations. Gary Krupp took swift action using contacts and trust gained from previous gestures, exposed this as intentional propaganda, and the ads were promptly removed.

Discovered Historic Documents on Armenian Genocide – Search of Secret Vatican Archives



PTWF Director for Germany, Dr. Michael Hesemann, has for years researched the Vatican Apostolic Archives (formerly known as the Secret Archives) for Pave the Way in an attempt to uncover evidence of the Vatican's life-saving actions undertook to protect and save Jewish lives during WWII. In conducting this research, he discovered over 2,000 pages of primary source documents, evidencing the Ottoman Turkish Empire's systematic murder of over 1.5 million Armenians from Constantinople. He was also able to find documentation proving that the Holy See had intervened to stop this tragedy from occurring.

From Wikipedia, the free encyclopedia **Armenian Genocide** (<u>Armenian</u>: Յայոց ցեղասպանություն, <u>Inote 3</u>] *Hayots tseghaspanutyun*), also known as the **Armenian Holocaust**,[9] was the <u>Ottoman government</u>'s systematic extermination of 1.5 million rmenians, [note 2] mostly citizens within the Ottoman Empire.[10][11]

The starting date is conventionally held to be **24 April 1915**, the day that Ottoman authorities rounded up, arrested, and deported from Constantinople (now Istanbul) to the region of Ankara 235 to 270 Armenian intellectuals and community leaders, the majority of whom were eventually murdered. The genocide was carried out during and after World War I and implemented in two phases—the wholesale killing of the able-bodied male population through massacre and subjection of army conscripts to forced labour, followed by the deportation of women, children, the elderly, and the infirm on death marches leading to the Syrian Desert. Driven forward by military escorts, the deportees were deprived of food and water and subjected to periodic robbery, rape, and massacre.[12] Other ethnic groups were similarly targeted for extermination in the Assyrian genocide and the Greek genocide, and their treatment is considered by some historians to be part of the same genocidal policy.[1][2] Most Armenian diaspora communities around the world came into being as a direct result of the genocide.[13]

Raphael Lemkin was moved specifically by the annihilation of the Armenians to define systematic and premeditated exterminations within legal parameters and coin the word *genocide* in 1943.[14] The Armenian Genocide is acknowledged to have been one of the first modern genocides,[15][16][17] because scholars point to the organized manner in which the killings were carried out. It is the second most-studied case of genocide after the Holocaust.[18]

Turkey <u>denies the word genocide</u> is an accurate term for these crimes. In recent years, Turkey has been faced with repeated calls to recognize them as genocide. [19] As of 2018 [update], 29 countries have <u>officially recognized the mass killings as genocide</u>, as have most genocide scholars and historians. We sent these documents to the Vatican prior to the meeting of President Biya and Pope Francis and with Cardinal Parolin Secretary of State.



Mr. Krupp, who is the seventh Jewish person since 1831 to receive this particular Pontifical Honor, has been recognized by the Holy See for his tireless and outstanding efforts in assisting the *Casa Sollievo della Sofferenza*, a health care facility in Italy started by Blessed Padre Pio. Through the generosity and commitment of Mr. Krupp, this state-of-the-art hospital has been able to acquire some of the most advanced medical equipment in Europe, thereby helping to expand the outstanding medical attention, care and compassion of the Catholic health care system for countless men, women and children.

The Pontifical Honor was conferred upon Mr. Krupp by His Excellency Archbishop Renato R. Martino, Apostolic Nuncio and Permanent Observer of the Holy See to the United Nations., who was assisted by His Excellency Riccardo Ruotolo, President of the Casa Sollievo dell Sofferenza, His Excellency Bishop Ignatius Catanello, of Brooklyn, and His Excellency Bishop Luigi Sposito, of Italy, during a ceremony at Saint Thomas the Apostle Church in West Hempstead, New York on August 19, 2000.

The Order of Saint Gregory the Great was founded by Pope Gregory XVI in 1831, who named it after his predecessor, Pope Saint Gregory the Great, and is most frequently bestowed as a special mark of favor of the Holy See for persons who diligently serve the Catholic Church, or who have distinguished themselves by their accomplishments benefitting society, regardless of their religion or gender.

Please allow me to thank you - and the Pave the Way Foundation - for your committed efforts to help promote a positive outcome to the negotiations underway between the Catholic Church and the State of Israel on completing the initial normalisation of relations, initiated on 30 December 1993 by the signing of the Fundamental Agreement between the Holy See and the State of Israel. Having been involved since the beginning, as the legal adviser to the delegation of the Holy See on the Bilateral Permanent Working Commission between the Holy See and the State of Israel - and now also as a member of the Governing Board of the Franciscan Custody of the Holy Land (entrusted with the care of the Holy Places on behalf of the Catholic Church) - I am particularly anxious to see the current negotiations succeed, and particularly grateful to find you fully sharing this concern.

Essentially the Fundamental Agreement was intended to accomplish the normalisation of formal relations - it soon led to the establishment of diplomatic relations between the Holy See and the State of Israel (June 1994) - together with security for the acquired rights of the Church in the territory that became the State of Israel in 1948. To this end, the Church has sought recognition of the fiscal exemptions that were in place when the State of Israel was created. A commitment to negotiate a treaty on these matters was included in the Fundamental Agreement, and the treaty was expected to be ready by 1996. It was to include other matters too, notably property matters. The Church is seeking the return of certain properties, including certain Shrines, as you know, as well as some property unjustly occupied by public bodies, notably the Hebrew University of Jersualem.

The negotiations have proved to be difficult and protracted, and today, on the eve of the tenth anniversary of the Fundamental Agreement, are not yet concluded. The failure of these negotiations - God forbid! - would cast a pall over the achievement of the Fundamental Agreement (which would thereby remain without much actual substance) and complicate the Catholic-Jewish relationship generally. On the other hand, success in the negotiations would revalidate the Fundamental Agreement, give the lie to the "prophets of doom," and signal a major, historic qualitative advance in the relationship, opening the door to many more developments of genuine benefit to both sides. It is therefore imperative that we succeed, together. To do this, it is

worldwide Catholic Church - to the State of Israel and to the Jewish People everywhere. What is required for this is essentially very little: effective confirmation of numerous Israeli promises through the decades to respect the acquired rights of the Church, and the restitution of a small, finite number of properties, mostly. I know you have been trying to sensitise Israeli leadership to this, both directly and through friends of Israel in America, and, once more, I am more grateful than I can say.

Your personal position, as you have shared with me, as one of seven Jewish men invested as as a Knight Commander of the Order of St. Gregory the Great, a leading Papal honour, evidently consitutes for you a unique motivation to reach out to individuals in the Israeli government and in the American Jewish community. I believe you are singularly suited to interpreting our concerns to each other, and to helping all to focus on the common goal. To me personally your commitment is very consoling. As you know, it has been my life's work to help bring the Church and Israel together, and I shall therefore, on my part, spare no effort, and leave no road untaken, in the endeavour to validate and make succeed the Fundamental Agreement.

I am writing you today to alert you to growing situation, which you may or may not be aware of, between the State of Israel and the Vatican. A fellow Long Islander, Mr. Gary Krupp, KCSG, has reached out to me, to try to garner support for an effort to finalize the relations between the two States. Mr. Krupp has the unique distinction of being one of only seven Jewish men in history to be Knighted by the Pope to the Order of St Gregory the Great and is now only one of three who are still alive. It is in his position as a Jewish member of the Papal Household that he has been a strong advocate for improving relations between Israel, the Jewish people and the Worldwide Catholic Church. In addition, Mr. Krupp has been attempting to create gestures of inter-religious goodwill by bringing about important cultural exchanges through his foundation, the Pave the Way Foundation. For more information, please visit Pave the Way's website at www.pavethewayfoundation.org.

The problem, as Mr. Krupp has informed me, is that the Holy See has been in negotiations for over 4 ½ years with representatives of the Israeli Government. In 1993 the Holy See initiated normalization with Israel but there were a few incomplete items which were, according to the original agreement, to be finalized by 1996. These items are still incomplete. Many negotiated solutions for the final agreements have languished simply because they Prime Minister's office has not given this issue a priority for completion.

Father David Jaeger, spokesman of the Franciscan Custody in Israel and lead legal council to the Holy See, has been disappointed by recent Israeli cancellations of all future mandated talks. To make matters worse, certain Israeli tax authorities have initiated enforcement action against Catholic Institutions, notably St Joseph's Hospital in Jerusalem counter to Israel's undertaking to refrain from such action pending the outcome of negotiations.

Please allow me to write you once more to express my gratitude and appreciation for the enormous efforts you are expending for the furtherance of the relationship between the Jewish People and the Catholic Church.

This is a time when the relationship appears both more necessary and more needy than ever before in my experience over the last quarter century or so. The very great advances that had been made must be preserved, and the risk of deterioration averted. Further progress to this end is imperative. The inexplicable decision of the Government of Israel to cancel all planned meetings of its delegation with that of the Holy See, in the framework of the Bilateral Permanent Working Commission, has cast a pall over relations, and has rendered it all but impossible to celebrate properly the tenth anniversary of the Fundamental Agreement. Grave questions remain while no negotiations are taking place, and while implementation of previous Agreements hangs in the balance.

Given the daily news, I trust it is not necessary for me to expand here on the vital need to mend the bilateral relationship to allow us all to join forces in opposing any recrudescence of antisemitism, and in promoting friendship, good will and cooperation across religious demarcation lines. It is absolutely vital therefore that the State of Israel be encouraged to return to the negotiating table, and to comply with its existing commitments in relation to the Catholic Church.

At a time when official contacts have been curtailed by the withdrawal of the Israeli Government from the talks, your personal diplomacy has been invaluable, and if and when talks are resumed. I have no doubt whatsoever that



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significant credit will belong to you.

I have heard the most encouraging "echoes" of your contacts with officials, diplomats and other influential persons in Israel, and in Israel's missions abroad.

It was my privilege to accompany you, in a purely personal capacity on my part, to your recent meeting with the Director of the Vatican Library, and to witness the respect and friendship with which you were received, and the great receptivity to your project of arranging for the public exhibition of unique Jewish manuscripts, as a way to promote cultural exchanges at a time when positive events are so truly needed.

So much may depend more directly on your ability to continue the good work. I am thinking particularly at this time of the poor Franciscan Sisters whose modest convent is occupied in part by the Hebrew University under the most improbable pretenses. Your personal diplomacy in this matter, the rapport you have established with persons at the university, looks so very promising to me. The gesture we are asking of the university could be very powerful in creating the positive climate for which we all long so much.

Take heart, and thank also any who may be supporting you in this enterprise, for which your ties to the Catholic Church, through your Papal Knighthood, together with your just pride in your Jewish heritage, and your palpable love for, and loyalty to, the Jewish People, make you so exceptionally well fitted.

Dear Mr. Krupp,

Pleas allow me to send you this further message expressing heartfelt - and growing - appreciation for your unique role, with the Pave the Way Foundation, in "rescuing" and building up the relationship between the Catholic Church and the Jewish People, specifically the State of Israel. I apologise for the e-mail format, but am travelling, and will be for a while, and have not wished to delay discharging this obligation. After decades of growth in friendship between Catholics and Jews, the Fundamental Agreement between the Holy See and the State of Israel (1993) was expected to consolidate these achievements and show the road to further progress. In recent times though, serious difficulties have emerged, repeatedly, and there has been a need for brave persons and organisations to step into the breach, to heal rifts, and to help put the relationship once more on a positive track. While I keep in touch on this with a great number of persons and entities, I can and must say that your role has been precisely unique. I do not think I can thank you enough. Just in recent months you were able to be decisively instrumental in resolving quickly a truly major problem before it got out of control when you intervened to have the Israeli government withdraw what was, in effect, a warning to pilgrims not to viist Bethlehem. It was a move not meant to have that effect, but which would have had it, and would have provoked a major clash, had it not been especially for your timely and fruitful intercession. All sides owe you thanks! It is also my sense that your intercession is having a very significant effect towards resolving an even larger crisis, the two year old problem of visas denied in large numbers to Church personnel in the Holy Land. I cannot say that it is resolved yet, but things have definitely taken a turn for the beter, and you are a very significant part of that. Most of all though, I am grateful for your grasp of the need for

negotiations between the State of Israel and the Holy See to resume, after Israel walked out on them on August 28 last. As all concerned acknowledge, only serious and sustained suasion from influential individuals and bodies in the United States, can achieve a purposeful return by Israel to the negotiating table. You have already proved your ability at such suasion, and I hope you keep at it! For Israel to continue to stay away, would cast a pall over the entire historic relationship and endanger the achievements of the Fundamental Agreement, by suggesting to Catholics that it was not sincerely meant, and was all in vain anyway, with consequences possibly reaching far into the future that I prefer not to contemplate. I refuse to contemplate them because I am not giving up. And it is comforting to know that Pave the Way is not giving up either!

Quite recently I have the sense that the goal is achievable. I have been to Israel recently and have met people close to the Prime Minister. We need just that extra (mighty) "push" from the U.S. for the Israeli delegation to be sent back to the table, and for a reasonable bilateral agreement to come out of it. You know better than I just how important that would be to the cementing of the friendship between the Catholic Church and the Jewish People, so necessary at this time.

Once more I feel impelled by events - this time happily positive developments - to express my profound gratitude and appreciation for the unique contribution you have been making, with the Pave the Way Foundation, to securing onward progress in building up the relationship between the Catholic Church and the Jewish People.

It should please you to learn that, thanks in a truly significant measure to your efforts, the Government of Israel has now resolved to return to the negotiations with the Holy See, from which the Israeli delegation pulled out on 28 August last year. The talks are set to resume on 5 July, and it is hoped to have made substantial progress by the middle of September.

When the Government of Israel withdrew from the negotiations last August it was a crisis of unprecedented seriousness, with possible dire consequences for the entire edifice that both sides had been constructing with such shared determination since the Fundamental Agreement of 1993. For some of us, on both sides, it was a time of tremendous anxiety, and even despondency, but you held fast to the hopes we all share, refused to give up, moved heaven and earth, as the saying goes, to help bring about the healing of the relationship. Your unrivalled, unparalleled access to officials and others on both sides, has been crucial to the enterprise. And it has got results!

Please allow me to insist on the uniqueness of the role of Pave the Way. There are, of course, many organisations devoted to advancing Catholic-Jewish dialogue and friendship. None, however, has equally grasped the indispensable requirement of a healthy relationship between the Church and the State in Israel as

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a condition of possibility, and a powerful stimulus, for that continuous growth in friendship between the Catholic Church and Jewish People that the Fundamental Agreement called for. A rules-based relationship between Church and State in largel is the essential requirement for avoiding friction, and increasing cooperation, there and everywhere else. To allow that relationship to fail might have had reverberations well beyond Israeli territory itself. It was a prospect none of us cared to contemplate, and now - thanks to your extraordinary dedication and ability - may indeed never have to consider.

On the verge of the resumption of the negotiations, with prospects for their ultimate success as yet somewhat uncertain, I respectfully urge Pave the Way not simply to rest on its well-deserved laurels, but to continue to work mightily for the talks to conclude positively, for new Agreements to be forged, for the way ahead to become truly paved. Thus my words of thanks and praise for the Pave the Way Foundation come together with an appeal, an appeal for you to stay the course, to maintain - and increase - the effort to mobilise both Jews and Catholics to support the sincere shared striving for concord and prophetic working together, starting from Israel, and centred on Israel.

It is with sincere appreciation that I acknowledge your interest in my work on Pope Pius XII and the Catholic Church. In particular, I thank you wholeheartedly for your letter to the Board of Directors of Yad Vashem, dated June 7, 2006, in an effort to correct the misrepresentation of the contribution of this Pontiff toward saving the lives of hundreds of thousands of Jews during the Holocaust. I believe there is a pattern of deliberate exclusion of the truth in the media. Only organizations like *Pave the Way Foundation* are in a position to counteract the past calumnies that have been presented to the general public. I want to assure you that Pius XII will bless your efforts to promote the truth.

Jews firmly believe in justice and truth. They were unanimous in their praise of Pius XII and expressed their gratitude. I agree with you that the statement below the portrait of Pope Pius XII in Yad Vashem, must be repudiated. It is contrary to the truth and is unjust. With your insistence, I am sure Yad Vashem will correct the following errors beneath this photo. My comments follow in italics: "Pius XII's reaction toward the killing of Jews during the period of the Holocaust is controversial. In 1933, as the Vatican Secretary of State, in order to maintain the rights of the Church in Germany, he signed a Concordat with the Nazi regime even at the price of recognizing the racist Nazi regime. When he was elected Pope in 1939, he put aside an encyclical against racism and anti-Semitism prepared by his predecessor." Pius XII wrote his own encyclical, Summi Pontificatus, which did deal with racism. "Although reports about the assassination of Jews reached the Vatican, the Pope did not protest either by speaking out or in writing." This is not true. Whenever Pius XII spoke out, there was immediate retaliation by the Nazis. There were more than 60 protests! "In December of 1942, he did not participate in the condemnation by members of the Allies regarding the killing of Jews. Even when the Jews were being deported from Rome to Auschwitz, the Pope did not intervene." The Pope did indeed intervene. After that first day, the SS were ordered to stop the deportation of the Jews in Rome. "He maintained a neutral position except toward the end of the war when he appealed on behalf of the government of Hungary and of Slovakia. His silence and the absence of directives obliged the clergy in Europe to decide independently how they should behave toward the persecuted Jews." This is not true. Members of the Church were ordered to protect all refugees and Jews.

Dear Prize Committee:

I am writing to recommend Mr. Gary Krupp for the Templeton Prize. Mr. Krupp has long been involved in promoting improved relations between the Catholic and Jewish communities, in his role as a Knight of the Vatican, and his tremendously important work deserves to be recognized and encouraged in every possible way.

Mr. Krupp's work is unique in a number of ways. One of its important aspects is that he has encouraged not only human relations between Catholics and Jews, but also has done much to advance the cause of shared scholarship and to help this scholarship to bring about greater interreligious understanding and education. I have seen the importance of this kind of work through my own teaching and research on the Dead Sea Scrolls. These documents, because of their importance for the early history of Judaism and for the background of Christianity, have fostered a level of interreligious study that has crossed boundaries and has done much for Jewish Christian understanding.

In the same way, Mr. Krupp has undertaken efforts to make available for exhibit and study some of the rare Vatican Hebrew and Judaic manuscripts. One of his greatest successes has been the arrangements of exhibits of these manuscripts in Israel at the Israel Museum. One cannot underestimate the importance for Jewish Christian relations of tens of thousands of Israelis going to see Vatican manuscripts sent for exhibit at the Jewish people's most important museum. A very important byproduct of this work has been the digitization of some of the important illuminated Vatican manuscripts, which will greatly aid in the study and research of these manuscripts.

There can be little question that such exhibits and the common interreligious research that they engender will be continued in a myriad of ways by Mr. Krupp and the Pave the Way Foundation. One of the most important areas in which he is hoping to succeed is in opening the Vatican archives and making them available for research with the help of digital technology.

We should also point out that in the age of growing secularity, the sharing of important religious texts, their study, and exhibits devoted to them help to make the point again and again of the great contribution that our common religious tradition has made to the history of Western Civilization. Krupp's efforts have helped this cause immeasurably.

Krupp's projects are unique in that they attempt to reach both the large-scale popular audience and a smaller scholarly audience. In this way, the general community is encouraged to understand the important role of religion and the shared culture of Judaism and Christianity. However, at the same time scholars are given the opportunity to inspect and study material that would otherwise have to be kept under lock and key to protect it

A further example of this kind of achievement is his success in arranging the gift of the Bodmer Papyrus to the Vatican library. This manuscript constitutes the oldest version of the Gospel of Luke and John with the oldest written version of the Lord's Prayer in existence. The manuscript was copied circa 175-225 CE. Here again, we can expect that the exhibit and study of this material will do much to advance the cause of Jewish Christian understanding and to throw light on the importance of religion and spirituality for the history of our culture and its current maintenance.

Full these reasons I heartily recommend Mr. Gary Krupp for this distinguished prize. I hope you will give him your every consideration.

As a Professor of American Studies at Al Quds University, a Muslim of Palestinian lineage I wish to nominate Mr. Krupp who is a Jewish man working quietly and behind the scene for several years for international peace. Mr. Krupp has come to identify religious extremism in every faith and contributing factors of the media as forces which need to join the bandwagon for the promotion of world peace.

While there are literally thousands of worthy organization trying to make a difference, Gary Krupp's work is very different. Not a wealthy man or a scholar but just a simple man who has come to realize that we must collectively come to recognize the cause and most prevalent tool used to justify conflict and violence. Mr. Krupp focuses on the dangers of religious extremism in all faiths, and how negative journalism and media fuels conflict. He recognizes the power of religion in a practical sense and uses his relations with religious leaders to advance this most important message. Mr Krupp recognized many years ago that if one institutes a gesture of good will he can use the positive warmth of that gesture to establish trust and in turn move the agenda of opposing religious zealots. He and his wife Meredith formed Pave the Way Foundation in order to promote his vision of a peaceful world.

Some enormous gestures that Gary Krupp initiated which have been felt world wide have been the following: He requested and was granted permission to bring the first loan of manuscripts from Maimonides from the Vatican Library to the Israel Museum in Jerusalem. Symbolically, Maimonides is revered by Christians, Muslims and Jews. He organized and sponsored the largest Jewish audience to simply thank Pope John Paul II for his work on religious reconciliation. He was able to obtain the Bodmer Papyrus, the Gospels of St. John and St. Luke written in 175 AD, through a private donor to be placed on permanent loan with the Vatican Library for world wide learning for the first time in history. He is working on building bridges of understanding with the Grand Mufti of Jerusalem and other important Islamic leaders worldwide, including the Islamic community in the United States. We are very privileged to have been included among your many projects, which have resulted in the digitization of numerous priceless documents in the Israeli Museum, the Vatican Archives, the Julliard School of Music and the New York Public Library.

The oldest documents in the Historical Archive of the Custody of the Holy Land date back to the 14th century. These are documents from Popes and sultans which were, so to speak, apparently inherited after the foundations of the Custody of the Holy Land (in 1342, the juridical and historical date of reference). Until the end of the 16th century, this archival material, with some very rare exceptions, consisted of documents from European ecclesiastical and civil authorities (mostly from popes and Heads of State). There are also documents from the Arab-Turkish civil authorities; those of sovereigns, i.e., sultans, are very numerous.

A number of centuries ago, the archives were divided into two separate collections, distinguished in more recent times from the historical-juridical point of view; they are the most important collections of the entire archive. They are not very large numerically, as the western collection does not contain more than two hundred items, whilst the oriental one is much larger, encompassing more than three thousand documents. Both collections, on the other hand, include documents which are particularly solemn in content and form.

The Firman Collection is made up of this well defined type of document. This name was given to the collection to place greater emphasis on one particular element, the most important by solemnity if not by number, taking a part for the whole. The collection contains juridical documents in Arabic and Turkish, pertaining primarily to property, rights, etc. These documents were issued by authorities in civil offices and by local and central governments. In the latter case, from the origins to 1517, the documents came from the Egyptian government; from 1517 to the 1920s, they were issued by the Turkish Government in Istanbul, followed by those of the British mandate. There are also private documents; however, they are consistently legal in nature, such as deeds of purchase, sale, donations, transactions and declarations.

Your foresight and experience has created an astonishing opportunity for publishing rare documents online, and in your partnership with Mr. Ardon Bar Hama, the Israeli photographer, this potential has, to a certain extent, been realized. For this, you both deserve the thanks and respect of museums, archives, libraries and academic institutions around the world.

We are also very grateful to Mr. Gary Krupp, President of the Pave the Way Foundation, for introducing you to us.

We wish you continued success in your ambitious project of digitization. We hope that one day the majority of the world's important documents will be available on the Internet for users of all ages and backgrounds!

ADDRESS OF HIS HOLINESS BENEDICT XVI AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE SYMPOSIUM ORGANIZED BY THE "PAVE THE WAY FOUNDATION"

Hall of the Swiss, Castel Gandolfo Thursday, 19 September 2008

Dear Mr Krupp, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I am happy to meet with you at the conclusion of the important symposium organized by the *Pave the Way Foundation*. I know that many eminent scholars have participated in this reflection on the numerous works of my beloved predecessor - the Servant of God Pope Pius XII - accomplished during the difficult period around the time of the second world war. I warmly welcome each of you especially Mr Gary Krupp, President of the Foundation, whom I thank for the kind words expressed on your behalf. I am grateful to him for informing me how your work has been undertaken during the symposium. You have analyzed without bias the events of history and concerned yourselves only with seeking the truth. I also greet those accompanying you on this visit, as well as your family members and loved ones at home.

The focus of your study has been the person and the tireless pastoral and humanitarian work of Pius XII, *Pastor Angelicus*. Fifty years have passed since his pious death here at Castel Gandolfo early on the ninth of October 1958, after a debilitating disease. This anniversary provides an important opportunity to deepen our knowledge of him, to meditate on his rich teaching and to analyze thoroughly his activities. So much has been written and said of him during these last five decades and not all of the genuine facets of his diverse pastoral activity have been examined in a just light. The aim of your symposium has been precisely to address some of these deficiencies, conducting a careful and documented examination of many of his interventions, especially those in favour of the Jews who in those years were being targeted all over Europe, in accordance with the criminal plan of those who wanted to eliminate them from the face of the earth. When one draws close to this noble Pope, free from ideological prejudices, in addition to being struck by his lofty spiritual and human character one is also captivated by the example of his life and the extraordinary richness of his teaching. One can also come to appreciate the human wisdom and pastoral intensity which guided him in his long years of ministry, especially in providing organized assistance to the Jewish people.

Thanks to the vast quantity of documented material which you have gathered, supported by many authoritative testimonies, your symposium offers to the public forum the possibility of knowing more fully what Pius XII achieved for the Jews persecuted by the Nazi and fascist regimes. One understands, then, that wherever possible he spared no effort in intervening in their favour either directly or through instructions given to other individuals or to institutions of the Catholic Church. In the proceedings of your convention you have also drawn attention to his many interventions, made secretly and silently, precisely because, given the concrete

situation of that difficult historical moment, only in this way was it possible to avoid the worst and save the greatest number of Jews. This courageous and paternal dedication was recognized and appreciated during and after the terrible world conflict by Jewish communities and individuals who showed their gratitude for what the Pope had done for them. One need only recall Pius XII's meeting on the 29th of November 1945 with eighty delegates of German concentration camps who during a special Audience granted to them at the Vatican, wished to thank him personally for his generosity to them during the terrible period of Nazi-fascist persecution.

Ladies and Gentlemen, thank you for your visit and for the research you have undertaken. Thanks also to the *Pave the Way Foundation* for its ongoing activity in promoting relationships and dialogue between religions, as witnesses of peace, charity and reconciliation. It is my great hope that this year, which marks the fiftieth-anniversary of my venerated predecessor's death, will provide the opportunity to promote in-depth studies of various aspects of his life and his works in order to come to know the historical truth, overcoming every remaining prejudice. With these sentiments I invoke upon you and the proceedings of your symposium an abundance of divine blessings.
