

July 2005 he was invested as an Officer Brother of the Most Venerable Order of the Hospital of St. John of Jerusalem, an order of the Anglican Church by approval of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. In September 2002 Mr. Krupp received the Jewish National Funds Tree of Life award.

Dear Mr Krupp, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I am happy to meet with you at the conclusion of the important symposium organized by the *Pave the Way Foundation*. I know that many eminent scholars have participated in this reflection on the numerous works of my beloved predecessor - the Servant of God Pope Pius XII - accomplished during the difficult period around the time of the second world war. I warmly welcome each of you especially Mr Gary Krupp, President of the Foundation, whom I thank for the kind words expressed on your behalf. I am grateful to him for informing me how your work has been undertaken during the symposium. You have analyzed without bias the events of history and concerned yourselves only with seeking the truth. I also greet those accompanying you on this visit, as well as your family members and loved ones at home.

The focus of your study has been the person and the tireless pastoral and humanitarian work of Pius XII, *Pastor Angelicus*. Fifty years have passed since his pious death here at Castel Gandolfo early on the ninth of October 1958, after a debilitating disease. When one draws close to this noble Pope, free from ideological prejudices, in addition to being struck by his lofty spiritual and human character one is also captivated by the example of his life and the extraordinary richness of his teaching. One can also come to appreciate the human wisdom and pastoral intensity which guided him in his long years of ministry, especially in providing organized assistance to the Jewish people.

Thanks to the vast quantity of documented material which you have gathered, supported by many authoritative testimonies, your symposium offers to the public forum the possibility of knowing more fully what Pius XII achieved for the Jews persecuted by the Nazi and fascist regimes. One understands, then, that wherever possible he spared no effort in intervening in their favour either directly or through instructions given to other individuals or to institutions of the Catholic Church. In the proceedings of your convention you have also drawn attention to his many interventions, made secretly and silently, precisely because, given the concrete

The founders of the Pave the Way Foundation have sought to improve relations between religions

On October 1, Pope Francis will officially name Gary and Meredith Krupp, as Knight of the Grand Cross and Dame of the Grand Cross, honors conferred by the Vatican's Order of St. Gregory the Great. The Krupps are the founders of the Pave the Way Foundation (PTWF), a non-profit dedicated to improving relations between different religions.

The recognition marks the first time since Order of St. Gregory the Great was created in 1831 that a husband and wife will be knighted together.

As founders of the Pave the Way Foundation, the Krupps have sought to break down obstacles between adherents of different religions and encourage interreligious dialogue through cultural exchanges, talks, pilgrimages and work with young people.

The organization has condemned extremist violence carried out in the name of religion, and has called on all religions to do the same.

In addition, the foundation has worked to facilitate improved relations between the Vatican and the State of Israel, and has fought for the rights of Christians working and living in the Holy Land.

The Pave the Way Foundation has also been behind recent historical research on Pope Pius XII, who has been called "Hitler's Pope" for his alleged Nazi sympathies.

Evidence that has emerged as a result of the research has gone far to rehabilitate Pope Pius' reputation. Mark Riebling's book, *Church of Spies*, for example, made use of primary sources discovered by the foundation's research to assert that Pius took part in a plot to assassinate Hitler. Other research has revealed that the pope was directly involved in sheltering Jews in Rome from the Nazis.

In 2000 Pope John Paul II made Gary Krupp a Knight Commander of the Order of St. Gregory for his work in acquiring medical equipment for the Casa Sollievo della Sofferenza Hospital in Italy. He was only the seventh Jewish person to receive the honor.

Two years later, Krupp founded the Pave the Way Foundation, which he dedicated to improving relations between the Catholic and Jewish religions.

New York (kath.net) January 27, 2020 was celebrated worldwide as the 75th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz and the commemoration of the six million victims of the Holocaust. For the new nuncio and permanent representative of the Holy See to the United Nations, Archbishop Gabriele Caccia, it was even more: it was time to recall the numerous attempts by the Catholic Church to overcome anti-Semitism and the Jews in this darkest To help hour of their story. "We never say again, we say we remember, but we also have to act here and today," he told almost 500 diplomats, Dignitaries and representatives of various religious communities for the opening of the three-hour commemoration "Remembering the Holocaust" in the UN Trusteeship Council Chamber in the headquarters of the United Nations in New York, right next to the conference room of the UN Security Council. In order to adequately document "The efforts of the Holy See and the Catholic Church to save lives", he had invited eight international experts who found evidence of the activities of the World War II Pope Pius XII and his helpers in numerous historical archives. He used the worldwide network of the New York-based "Pave the Way Foundation" by the Jew Gary Krupp,



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In his opening lecture, Krupp recalled how he first learned about the Holocaust when his father, a World War I veteran, told him about the liberation of the Buchenwald concentration camp and showed him pictures of the bodies. "Throughout his life he warned me to do everything I could to ensure that this never happens again." For decades, Krupp believed the "black legend" of the "silence of the Pope" until he met eyewitnesses in Italy. Today he knows that Pius XII. In Rome alone, 6381 Jews were hidden in 696 monasteries, church institutions and private apartments. "It is an unfortunate irony



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
of fate that this one man in occupied Europe, who did more than anyone else to prevent these terrible crimes, became a scapegoat for everyone else," said Krupp.

Prof. Edouard Husson from the Cy Cergy University in Paris examined the origins of National Socialist ideology and anti-Semitism, which the Catholic Church condemned from 1928 as "heresy" (heresy).

Prof. Ron Rychlak from the University of Mississippi quoted witnesses, including the former head of the Romanian secret service, Mihau Pacepa, who spoke of a targeted campaign by the Soviet secret service with the aim of helping the Catholic Church and Pius XII. to defame. With the play by the German scandal dramatist Rolf Hochhuth, the "Fakenews" campaign, which went so far as to imply a secret sympathy for the Nazis, the Pope, who defied Hitler.

The German historian Michael Hesemann showed that Eugenio Pacelli maintained personal friendships with Jews long before he was elected pope and even supported the Zionist movement. As early as 1917, when he was a nuncio in Munich, he campaigned to prevent the impending massacres of Jewish settlers in Palestine, which was then occupied by the Ottoman Empire. When he was elected Pope in 1939, Jewish newspapers explicitly portrayed him as a "loyal friend of the Jews" and opponent of the Nazis. In fact, Pacelli, who had been following Adolf Hitler's rise in Munich since 1923, described National Socialism as "probably the most dangerous heresy of ours in 1925 Zeit "and the" Führer "a few years later as" criminals "and" abysmally bad people ". After Kristallnacht, Hesemann used documents to show that he discovered in the Vatican Secret Archives wanted Pacelli, now Cardinal Secretary of State of Pius XI, to enable 200,000 Jews - almost all of the Jews in the German Reich - to flee abroad; however, the company failed due to the lack of willingness to cooperate among the global community, which was not prepared to issue them with so many visas. Prof. Luigi Napolitano presented details of such rescue operations. Mark Riebling, author of the bestseller "The Pope's Spies", demonstrated that Pius XII. Collaborated with the German resistance since October 1939 - a conspiracy aimed at killing Hitler. "The men of this network, from which Count Stauffenberg also emerged, kept warning him not to protest, because Hitler would have used this as an excuse to smash the Catholic Church in Germany. an advocate for the democratic post-war Germany they had planned. "One result of these efforts, in which Catholics and Protestants were involved, was ecumenical dialogue in the post-war period, but also the "Nostra Aetate" declaration of the Second Vatican Council,

Johan Ickx, head of the Vatican State Secretariat's Historical Archive, spoke of what historians will find when, as announced by Pope Francis, on March 2, 2020, a good dozen Vatican archives stocked their holdings on the Pius XII pontificate. - a total of over 15 million pages of documents. It would show that bishops and nuncios, who have long been honored as "righteous among the peoples" (Gentiles who saved the Jews) at the Yad Vashem Holocaust Memorial, can only be honored in close consultation with and on the instructions of Pius XII. have acted. "So here we have the absurd situation that the employees were honored, but not their manager who gave them the job."

The seven historians who spoke at the United Nations are also waiting impatiently for the "big day". "It is time that the truth about Pius XII becomes indisputable, that his opponents can no longer hide behind the excuse 'we are waiting for the archives to open'," explains Michael Hesemann, who wrote in 2018 for his book "The Pope and Holocaust "has already evaluated 5,300 documents previously published by the Vatican and 77,000 pages that have been put online by" Pave the Way (ptwf.org). "Pope Pius XII. was a light in the darkness that enveloped most of Europe at that time. He acted wisely and managed to save almost a million Jews, whose descendants now make up a third of all Jews, while the nations of the world mostly watch idly.

uando, nel gennaio 2005, portò in Vaticano 160 personalità del mondo ebraico per ringraziare Giovanni Paolo

II «per tutto quello che aveva fatto per riavvicinare la Chiesa cattolica al popolo d'Israele», in quello che divenne un incontro storico con il Papa polacco pochi mesi prima della sua morte, erano in pochi a sapere chi fosse questo imprenditore newyorchese, fra gli unici tre ebrei all'epoca (ora sono sette), insignito nel 2000 dell'Ordine pontificio di san Gregorio. Oggi, dopo che l'impegno con la sua Fondazione «per rimuovere gli ostacoli non teologici fra le religioni» ha portato Gary Krupp ad ingaggiare una dura battaglia per «ristabilire la verità storica su come Pio XII salvò oltre 800 mila ebrei» dalla furia nazista, persino il New York Times si è trovato un anno fa a dedicargli un articolo in prima pagina. Un segnale che neppure i principali media potevano più permettersi di ignorare il carismatico 64enne filantropo ebreo «appassionato di papa Pacelli» che annovera solide amicizie tra uomini d'affari e politici americani, incontra regolarmente ministri e rabbini israeliani e fa parte da 11 anni della Famiglia pontificia.

FIGLI DELL'UNICO DIO. Nato nella Grande Mela da una famiglia ebraica, Krupp racconta come sia stata l'educazione laica e rispettosa del pluralismo impartita dalla madre ad aver gettato il seme che lo ha portato a fondare nel 2002 la Pave the Way Foundation. «Quando ero piccolo - spiega - mia madre mi insegnò come ognuno di noi può pregare Dio in modo diverso, ma come tutti crediamo in un unico Dio. IL PAPA CHE SALVÒ GLI EBREI.

La battaglia più aspra è iniziata quando Krupp ha cominciato ad interessarsi alle periodiche polemiche sul ruolo di papa Pacelli nel salvataggio degli ebrei durante la seconda guerra mondiale. «Io stesso ero cresciuto con l'idea che

non avesse fatto nulla per salvare gli ebrei: non c'era nessuno più anti-Pio XII di me», dice oggi con un sorriso. «Potete immaginare la sorpresa quando ho scoperto che le idee nelle quali ero vissuto erano false». Negli ultimi tre anni Krupp ha raccolto e filmato testimonianze di superstiti salvati dal clero e di sacerdoti che avevano ricevuto precise istruzioni da parte della Santa Sede per mettere in salvo il maggior numero possibile di israeliti, come il diplomatico vaticano mons. Giovanni Ferrofino (oggi quasi centenario) che su incarico del Papa riuscì a procurare il salvacondotto per 10 mila ebrei che trovarono scampo nella Repubblica dominicana. Ha organizzato un convegno a Roma, osteggiato dalla Comunità ebraica capitolina, per divulgare i risultati di queste indagini. Ma soprattutto ha reso disponibile sul sito della fondazione gran parte della documentazione disponibile su Pacelli.

Parte dell'establishment ebraico non lo ama. Altri lo accusano di muoversi con dilettantismo nei campi minati della ricerca storica e dei rapporti fra gli Stati. Lui fa spallucce: «Non sono uno storico professionista. Sono solo un cittadino in cerca di verità». Jewish papal knight from Wantagh says retired pontiff was 'very special'

While most Long Islanders woke up Saturday to news from the Vatican about the retired pontiff's death, the Vatican awakened Gary Krupp with the news.

Krupp, a 75-year-old Jewish papal knight who met with Pope Benedict XVI on 19 occasions, had a close and unique connection to the man. So much so that the Wantagh resident got calls from Rome notifying him of Benedict's passing Saturday.

"He was just a fantastic, very shy, very pensive, brilliant, scholarly . . . he was a very special person," Krupp said.

Krupp, who a New York Times columnist once de-

scribed as "the Vatican's most outspoken Jewish ally," heads Pave the Way Foundation, a nonsectarian organization whose mission is to identify and eliminate nontheological obstacles between religions.

His most notable work with Vatican centered on whether Pope Pius XII, the pon-tiff during World War II, did enough to save Jews from the Holocaust.

Krupp said his organization's work extended beyond Catholicism and Judaism to many other religions, but was not religious work.

"We deal with obstacles and problems and so it's unusual," he said. "We don't deal with religion ever. That's like walking in deep mud."

Krupp received the honorary title as Commendatore Gary Krupp, Knight Commander of the Pontifical Equestrian Order of St. Gregory the Great from Pope John Paul II in 2000.

A retired medical equipment dealer, he was awarded his title after persuading manufacturers to donate more than \$10 million in medical equipment to an Italian hospital.

Benedict, who had a love of history, gave Krupp papal authority to use Vatican documents on his organization's website free of copyright restrictions.

Krupp said his relationship with Benedict, who came of age in Nazi Germany as Pius XII led the Roman Catholic Church, grew from the respect the retired pope had for his organization's work toward religious reconciliation.

As a member of the papal household, Krupp was notified of the retired pope's death via a telephone call from the Vatican secretary of state at 4 a.m. Sat-

"We sort of expected this to happen," Krupp said of Benedict's death, saying he had gotten health updates from a German colleague. "This is what life is.'

Krupp noted that Benedict did a lot of work to advance his foundation's mission, saying they "now have an advocate in heaven."

"He was a loving man," Krupp said. "It's very, very sad."

Centre, an active leader at the St. Agnes school and parish, described Benedict as a "gentle intellectual." She admired the way he "stayed under the radar" after Pope Francis took the reins.

"In giving up the papacy, he was true to himself," Boylan said. "And I think that took a lot of courage to do that. He's served us well."

Visitors to St. Agnes on Saturday said given his age and recent reports of his health they were not surprised to learn of his passing, but it was nevertheless a somber day.

"Just God bless him," said Audrey Lavin of Carle Place. "God bless all of us.'

Kathy Hutchinson of Valley Stream said she's thankful for the guidance and direction of the retired pope.

Phyllis Zagano, a research associate at Hofstra University who has studied the role of women in the church, said that Benedict, whom she described as an "extraordinary theologian," played a central part in "almost all major church discussions throughout the latter part of the 20th and early 21st century."

Specific to her own studies, Zagano noted that while Benedict is "known as the architect of every contemporary statement against women priests," he codified the distinction between the priesthood and the diaconate, paving the way for female deacons.

Benedict's legacy is clouded by the church's handling of the sex abuse scandal that erupted in his time as a cardinal, continued into his time as pope and returned in the form of a report

earlier this year that revealed he personally mishandled four abuse cases while he was an archbishop in Germany.

For Long Island survivors of the abuse, his death has given rise to mixed feelings.

"Nobody's happy when a pope dies, but Benedict has endangered children around the world," said Mary McKenna of the Nassau County chapter of SNAP, a group of clergy sex abuse survivors.

McKenna noted that Benedict was, however, the first pope to act against the abuse, leaving a legacy of "pros and cons" for survivors.

Duffy spoke of having an audience with the pope, a powerful encounter in Rome in 2005 that he said bolstered his calling to become a priest. Twenty years old at the time, he was among thousands in an audience hall when the pope approached him. He shouted, "Holy Father, I want to be a

"He spun around on his heels and he came right over to me and he grabbed me with two hands, and he shook me and he blessed me and I kissed his ring," Duffy said.

In a statement Saturday, Barres praised Benedict as a "great theologian and pope.'

"Growing up in Nazi Germany and experiencing first-hand the bitter fruits of Nazi ideology, Pope Benedict XVI understood that ideas have consequences in history," Barres said. "As a result, throughout his life, as a priest, professor, bishop, cardinal and pope, he championed the Catholic belief in the harmony of faith and reason - a principle that is so critical to the unity of truth and so vital to Catholic identity, missionary activity, harmonious ecumenical and interreligious charity and peace in the world."

He added: "Today, we pray for the soul of this great pope and give thanks for how the Holy Spirit led him and inspired us."

Cardinal Timothy Dolan, archbishop of New York, offered prayers at St. Patrick's Cathedral for Benedict Saturday morning. In a statement, he described the retired pope as an "erudite, wise, and holy man, who spoke the truth with love."

"The family of the Church especially mourns his death, while grateful for the gift he was of a good shepherd and Holy Father," Cardinal Dolan wrote. "This archdiocese remembers with love his pastoral visit here in 2008."

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A Saint's Work for the Sick

Interview with Monsignor Riccardo Ruotolo

SAN GIOVANNI ROTONDO, Italy, JUNE 13, 2002 (ZENIT.org (http://www.zenit.org/)—Avvenire (http://www.avvenire.it/)).- Padre Pio left humanity two special gifts: the House for the Relief of Suffering, a center for medical and spiritual assistance in this southern Italian town; and the Prayer Groups scattered throughout the world.

The director of both these legacies today is Monsignor Riccardo Ruotolo. Here, he talks about his experience: "Padre Pio wished to leave the clinic to the Holy See. Padre Pio said, 'If I leave the work in the Pope's hands I am certain it will not fail.'"

Q: A gift involving commitment ...

Monsignor Ruotolo: I knew nothing about hospitals. I said this to Cardinal Giuseppe Caprio when he asked me to come here, on Dec. 15, 1977, to study the situation. I told him I had never even been in San Giovanni Rotondo.

Q: And what did the substitute of the Vatican State secretariat reply to you?

Monsignor Ruotolo: "Good, so you go there with a fresh mind, free of prejudices." He asked me to make a report in six months. The Holy See had to decide if it was to keep the administration of the House of Relief or hand it over to the regional government.

Q: Were there debts?

Monsignor Ruotolo: Six months later, when I presented the financial report, I had paid those debts and come to an agreement with the region. The then Monsignor Caprio told me: Good. Now go back to San Giovanni Rotondo and continue to work.

Q: You have been there for 25 years.

Monsignor Ruotolo: Providence decides.

Q: And what have you accomplished in these years?

Monsignor Ruotolo: I have tried to respect faithfully Padre Pio's wish. On May 5, 1957, he expressed in writing the plan, the hope, to double the number of beds. Today the beds have trebled, thanks to the faithful's donations: There are more than 1,000.

Q: So far as I know, the House of Relief is the only hospital where there are guided tours: from the kitchens to the operating theaters. The visitor can see it all.

Monsignor Ruotolo: It is the first hospital in the south of Italy in terms of attracting patients. Twenty-three percent of those hospitalized and patients come from outside the region, including from the North; especially in the oncological sector, which in addition to 34 beds in the department, has a day-clinic with 20 beds; medical visits, examinations, treatments. We have four nuclear accelerators to shorten the waiting lists.

Q: To shorten the waiting lists?

Monsignor Ruotolo: We are trying to do away with them. I think we are the first hospital in Italy to do so.

Q: Is this due to good administration or to a miracle of Padre Pio?

Monsignor Ruotolo: Listen, that question was already asked of Padre Pio: "When you are no longer here, what will happen to this gigantic work?" his friends would ask him. And he would answer: "When I am no longer here, I will pray to Providence, who will help you more and better than at present."

Q: Is there some evidence of this intervention?

Monsignor Ruotolo: Who knows, perhaps Mr. Krupp.

Q: Mr. Krupp?

Monsignor Ruotolo: Gary Krupp, an American Jew from New York, is the intermediary of advanced electromedical equipment: He has sold us nuclear medicine machines, radiology equipment, two new mammographic machines. He says he is "in love" with Padre Pio and gives us a hand.

Q: A hand?

Monsignor Ruotolo: For example, he gave us a discount of more than \$1 million on the magnetic resonance machine. He has often said publicly that he is "in love" with Padre Pio.

An eyewitness account

t is January 18, 2005 at 11:30 a.m., Rome time. I am a dentist who practices in Great Neck, N.Y. and resides in Manhasset, N.Y. This was the experience of a lifetime. Dreams are rarely this good. Imagine being in the Clementine Hall of the Apostolic Palace in the Vatican where there is a worldwide delegation of Jews seated in the audience waiting for a private audience with His Holiness John Paul II. It is to be a meeting of gratitude within the tone of reconciliation.

The marble floors of the palace stretch to highly polished ancient wood and marble walls, which climb at least 40 feet. About halfway up, these walls are adorned with the most incredible frescoes created some 500 years ago, perhaps by the likes of Michelangelo, Raphael, or other legendary artist. The sheer size of the artistry boggles the mind. I was seated in the front row with my childhood

friend, Gary Krupp. I never would have imagined that such an event would take place with my participation. My friend was making good on a dream — his dream of peace on earth and goodwill to all men. This is a story that has been 800 years in the making. It would read like a novel except that it is true. It all happened.

Some years ago, my friend Gary performed some special favors for the Vatican. A children's hospital was being built in Italy. Difficulties occurred and Gary was asked to assist. He did so unselfishly. Gary wouldn't accept any payment for his services. Sometime later, he was asked once again to assist with more problem solving. Again, he refused payment. The pope was so impressed with this Jewish gentleman's unselfish and philanthropic behavior that he bestowed upon him the title of Knight of Saint Gregory the Great. He is the seventh Jewish person ever given this

honor by a pope. What happened next intensifies my story. Sometime later, Gary found himself at a benefit dinner where some rabbis were discussing the desire of Jewish scholars to see the Maimonides papers. These papers reflect the writings of Maimonides, a Jewish philosopher, rabbi, and physician who lived during the 12th century. These documents have been in the custody of the Vatican library for centuries, and Jewish scholars have been denied access to them. During this benefit dinner, one of the rabbis wondered if they would ever be able to see them. Someone told them to speak to Gary. The rabbis looked at this person wondering if this was a joke or if he was serious. They approached Gary and he said he would look into it. They did not know that Gary had been made a member of the papal household. Weeks later, Gary called the rabbis and stated that the Vatican had agreed to their momentous request. A trip to Rome allowed the eyes of these Jewish scholars to view these sacred manuscripts

from the ancient sage. The Vatican greeted this august assembly with much warmth and generosity. Upon returning home, many celebratory events were held to honor Gary's accomplishment. Then I got the phone call.

Gary told me that he wanted to devote his life to peace among religions, especially in the Middle East. How does one react to that kind of a statement? You may as well attempt to move the ocean across the street with a spoon. Gary was firm, sure of himself, and aggressively ambitious in this pursuit. He felt that attaining his title from the pope was more than happenstance. With the respect of the Jewish people and now the Roman Catholic Church, he would have the ability to accomplish much. The *Pave The Way Foundation* is the result of his desire. It is an organization that is paving the way for peace in various regions of the world. It is a not-for-profit foundation working to reach various worldwide religious and governmental levels of support. Gary asked me to be on his Board of Di-

rectors. It seemed a natural thing to do, as we have been friends since the age of 16 and have always respected each other's opinion. What happened next astounded me.

Pave The Way Foundation began to shuttle between New York, Rome, and Jerusalem, with stops in England and other cities. Relationships began to build between Pave The Way Foundation and various ambassadors to the United Nations, cardinals, bishops, Israeli and Palestinian officials, and more. The Foundation was able to negotiate the amazing loan of the Maimonides papers to Israel as a gesture of goodwill from the Vatican. This was all being done through Pave The Way Foundation. Much can be accomplished through a gesture of goodwill. Just when I thought things could not realistically get any better, Gary announced, "Pave The Way Foundation has been granted a private audience with His Holiness John Paul II."

During a Board of Directors meeting, Gary let it be

known that he had been working on a meeting of gratitude and thanks to His Holiness for his defense of Jews before his papacy as well as during it. Under his pontificate, the Vatican recognized the State of Israel by exchanging ambassadors. Pope John Paul II was the first pope since St. Peter to visit a synagogue. He also visited the Western Wall in Jerusalem and left an inscribed message within the wall asking for forgiveness. He also has made it a sin to be anti-Semitic. He has been a friend to the Jewish people and has tried to bridge the ancient gap. Pave The Way Foundation would bring a worldwide delegation of 100 rabbis, 12 cantors, and Jewish leaders to offer prayers of thanks and gratitude to His Holiness. The pope happily agreed to this request.

On January 18th at 11:30 a.m., we all assembled within the Vatican's Apostolic Palace to meet Pope John Paul II. Our speech was presented first, as follows:

"Your Holiness:

We are a group of people who represent a cross section of Judaism, who have traveled here with the blessings of millions of our faith in order to thank you.

Soon after your ascension to the throne of St. Peter, you made a telling trip to Auschwitz in order to pay homage to victims of the holocaust. You have defended the Jewish people at every opportunity, as a priest in Poland and during your 26-year pontificate. You have denounced anti-Semitism as a 'sin against God and humanity.' This tone of reconciliation has been the cornerstone of your papacy and its relations with the Jewish people.

On April 13, 1986, you became the first pope since St. Peter to visit a synagogue. Upon presenting his credentials to you in June 2003, Israeli Ambassador Oded Ben-Hur expressed this enormous gesture best when he said, 'On that day you took upon your shoulders the 2,000-year-old church, back to the first-century synagogue of Capernaum, where Jesus used to pray, thus closing an historic circle.'

You moved the Holy See to initiate the process of normalizing diplomatic relations with the state of Israel in 1992, the beloved biblical homeland of the Jewish people, symbolically acknowledging the existence of Eretz Yisrael yesterday, today, and forever.

Your pilgrimage to Israel and the Holy Land on March 21, 2000, was immortalized in the hearts and minds of the Jewish people around the world, when you placed your prayer asking for forgiveness in the Western Wall.

Your solemn remarks during your visit to the Hall of Remembrance, Yad Vashem profoundly moved us and touched our hearts.

It is impossible to describe the emotional impact these milestones have had on Jews worldwide. Your Holiness, these reconciliatory acts have, in fact, been a hallmark of your pontificate as you have also tried to repair the ancient rifts in all of the religions in the world. The Jewish Ethics of the Fathers beautifully captures, in verse, the love you have exhibited for all humanity. Rabbi Hillel says: 'Be among the disciples of Aaron, by being a lover of peace, a pursuer of peace, a lover of all humanity and bringing them closer to religion.'

For your acts of love of all humankind and your implacable pursuit of peace and reconciliation of all the faiths, your Holiness truly is the personification of these ideals and spirit of Aaron, the high priest of ancient Israel.

In closing, you have referred to us, the children of Abraham, as your beloved elder brothers. My prayerful wish is that Jews, Christians, and Muslims, the three children of Abraham, may soon bond together in one common cause and voice to defend all humanity against those who defame God by committing wanton acts of violence in his holy name.

Your Holiness, Thank you, thank you, thank you. Shalom, Shalom, Shalom."

As a thunderous applause erupted from the audience, I could see that Pope John Paul II was visibly moved. He applauded and smiled. He looked at each and every one of us. A feeling of love and brotherhood flowed throughout the room. Then he responded.

"Dear Friends,

With affection I greet the members of the Pave The Way Foundation on your visit to the Vatican, and I thank Mr. Krupp for the kind words which he has addressed to me on your behalf. This year we will be celebrating the 40th anniversary of the Second Vatican Council's Declaration Nostra Aetate, which has significantly contributed to the strengthening of Jewish-Catholic dialogue. May this be an occasion for renewed commitment to increased understanding and cooperation in the service of building a world ever more firmly based on respect for the divine image in every human being.

Upon all of you, I invoke the abundant blessings of the Almighty and, in particular, the gift of peace. Shalom aleichem."

More joyful thunderous applause filled the room. Most people in the great hall were aware of the Second Vatican Council's Declaration Nostra Aetate which stated that Jews were not collectively responsible for the death of Christ, and that "...in her rejection of every persecution against any man, the Church, mindful of the patrimony she shares with the Jews and moved not by political reasons but by the Gospel's spiritual love, decries hatred, persecutions, displays of anti-Semitism, directed against Jews at any time and by anyone."

Then, a few members of the Board of Directors and I arose to present the pope with a gift. It was a glass sculpture of two open-palmed hands holding the globe. It signified a humanitarian award to the pope. He graciously accepted it. Three rabbis stood up and approached him. They spoke a prayer and blessed him. This was the first time that anyone in the Vatican could remember the pope being blessed and not the other way around. He then blessed our congregation. Twelve cantors began to sing songs of prayer filling the room with optimism and hope. The pope physically extended his hand to members of Pave The Way Foundation. One by one, we shook his hand as we looked into each other's eyes. Then something wonderful happened.

Pope John Paul II asked the entire congregation to step forward so he could shake their hands as well. Members of the papal household started to hand out gifts to all of us. His Holiness was in a very good mood and wanted to share this feeling with all of us. It was then that I remembered the Pave The Way Foundation slogan, Embrace our similarities, savor our differences. What an experience.

We had no idea at the time, but since writing this article, I have been informed that our delegation was the last private audience of Pope John Paul II before his death in April. We shall remember him always, with gratitude.

'Shades of Truth": film su Pio XII piace a ebrei e cattolici*


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onsensi unanimi da parte di ebrei e cattolici alla proiezione del film Shades of Truth di Liana Marabini tenutasi in Vaticano, a Palazzo Cardinal Cesi, al termine del simposio internazionale, "Le radici ebraiche del Cristianesimo", a cui ha assistito una vasta e qualificata platea di storici, prelati, illustri studiosi e una folta rappresentanza della comunità ebraica di New York, a Roma per vedere il film che fu accolto in maniera controversa alla sua

The presentation is slated for April 5 and 6 at Temple Israel in New Rochelle and St. John's University in Queens, respectively. Both presentations will also be held virtually. Anyone can attend.

Pave the Way was founded in 2002 with the mission to eliminate disinformation and barriers between religions. The foundation was cofounded by Meredith Krupp, 73, and Gary Krupp, 74.

Gary, a Queens native, said the foundation was approached by the Archbishop of Assisi to co-sponsor the presentations, which will discuss historically accurate actions of the people of Assisi. When Northern Italy was occupied by German troops in 1943, Assisi was forced into action. Archbishop Nicolini – acting on requests from Rome – rallied Assisi residents to save Jewish peoples that were being hunted by Nazis.

"These people in Italy and in Europe risked their lives to save the lives of people they didn't even know," Gary said.

Both presentations will feature panels from the Museo della Memoria Assisi, or the Museum of Memory in Assisi. It will include an hour-long roundtable discussion led by Johan Ickx, Archivist for the Historical Archives of the Vatican Secretary of State and Elizabeth Bettina, author of "It Happened in Italy." The Mayor of Assisi, Stefania Proietti, will also attend.

In 2006, Gary conducted research into Pope Pius XII – a well-known figure who was the head of the Catholic Church and ruler of the Papal States during the Nazi era. Gary admitted that he was under the impression that Pope Pius XII was anti-semetic, until Gary discovered documents from the Palestine Post, and New York Times archives, that indicated otherwise. It sparked his overall interest in publishing accurate historic records.

Gary – who has been knighted three times for his commitment to breaking down religious barriers – said close to 847,000 Jews were saved during World War II. "Twenty-five percent of the world's population of Jews today are alive because of the actions of the Vatican during World War II," he said. "It's going to be an exciting event – especially now at a time where everyone is talking about all the hatred, anti-semitism, and negativity going around."

"How happy we are to bring our museum to America," Archbishop of Assisi, Domenico Sorrentino, said in a press release. "Not only to remember a light that [shined] through a dark time in history, but also to tell the world that good can, and must, win over evil."

Meredith, Gary's wife of 51 years, was named Dame of the Grand Cross, the Highest Vatican State order that can be awarded to a person. She said she hopes the event sheds light on the life-saving actions of Assisi's residents.

"Our world is so divided," said Meredith. "The least we could do is to bridge the gaps."

Knighted by decree of Pope Francis, Meredith received the honor of being awarded Dame of the Grand Cross, the Highest Vatican State order that can be awarded to a lay person. Gary received the Knight of the Grand Cross in 2018.

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Jewish historian honored by the Vatican speaks at Saint Stephen

n March 14, 2015, Gary
Krupp, a member of the papal
household and most decorated Jewish person in Vatican
history, came to Saint Stephen the First
Martyr parish in Sanford. Knighted by
Pope John II to the order of Saint Gregory
the Great in 2000, Krupp shared with the
audience of 120 people his ongoing efforts
to reveal the truth about Pope Pius XII,
and that Pope's efforts to save Jewish lives
during World War II.

Krupp also spoke of the Pave the Way Foundation, which he founded with his wife, Meredith, 12 years ago. According to Krupp, Pave the Way is "the only organization in the world devoted to removing obstacles among the major world religions through gestures of goodwill." Krupp's philosophy is simple: when gestures of goodwill are extended, trust develops and obstacles are overcome.

Knighted by Saint John Paul II because of the charitable

work he did for Padre Pio Hospital, Krupp found himself in the perfect position to speak to the Vatican on behalf of rabbis and scholars who had previously been denied the opportunity to view the writings of Maimonides, the texts of which were kept in the Vatican library. As a result, through his diplomatic relations with the Vatican, Krupp arranged for a group of rabbis to view the writings of this great Jewish philosopher, texts they had longed to read in their original form. These rabbis were received by Pope John Paul II in the largest Jewish audience in history and his last private

audience before his death in 2005. Thus, with this first gesture of goodwill, the idea for Pave the Way Foundation was born.

Pave the Way Foundation also arranged for the donation to the Vatican library of the Bodmer Papyrus, the oldest written version of the Gospels of St. John and St. Luke, containing the oldest written version of the Lord's Prayer (circa 175-225 AD). The Bodmer Papyrus was presented to Pope Benedict XVI in 2007.

When it comes to Pope Pius XII, Krupp has an intensely personal reason for pursuing his years' long efforts to restore the Pope's good name. Growing up, Krupp believed Pope Pius XII was "Hitler's Pope." Krupp said this began with a smear campaign created by the Russian KGB with production of the play The Deputy in 1963. As a Jew, Krupp admits to growing up hating the Pope. "I was lied to," he says. Krupp noted that in the years between 1939 and 1948, no negative news articles were written about the Pope. Only after the smear campaign did the Pope's reputation as a Nazi sympathizer start to spread.

After reviewing tens of thousands of original documents and interviewing World War II Holocaust survivors who had been personally rescued by the actions of the Pope, Krupp discovered that the Roman Catholic Church saved as many as 847,000 Jews, from whom 25 percent of the world's 16 million Jews today are descended.

Through Pave the Way, Gary and Meredith Krupp, along with the support of scholars and contributors, the truth about Pope Pius XII is now coming to light.

The Power of a Gesture

A gesture is a powerful thing. It is a symbol of trust, proof that you've done the right thing, and a way to connect to people. A gesture can also be reciprocal, an invitation for a gesture in return. Gary and Meredith Krupp, Founders of Pave the Way

<u>Foundation</u> (PTWF), believe that a gesture is "a handshake, a promise that you're not there to do harm."

can use religion as a justification to do harm. In speaking with Krupp, he wonders whether "there are some who use religion to defend these conflicts while secretly acting to achieve a private agenda." PTWF's goal is to "end the malevolent use of religion" by disseminating information and building trust between different religions through concrete gestures. The initiative began in the 1980s, when Krupp, a Jewish man, volunteered his expertise for 20 years to help a Catholic hospital in Italy obtain high tech medical equipment. Pope John Paul II returned Krupp's gesture in 2000 with a gesture of gratitude: Krupp was invested to a rare Papal Knighthood and now had the ability to initiate many more projects with the Vatican City State and the Catholic Church.



The first project began in 2002, when PTWF facilitated a visit of Rabbis and Jewish scholars to the Vatican Library to view the writings of Maimonides, a revered Torah scholar from the Middle Ages. The group was able to view the original works and clarify questions about the text. This coming together of Catholic and Jewish leaders later led to a loaned exhibit of Maimonides's works at the Israel Museum in Jerusalem, as well as a preservation project so that every-day people can access the rare manuscripts.

Several of PTWF's projects – all gestures aimed at building trust between religions – have healed major conflicts between religions. During World War II, Pope Pius XII

came under attack for his supposed lack of action against Hitler's regime in Europe. Through international partnerships with researchers, historians and archivists, PTWF was able to facilitate the publication of primary source documents that revealed Pope Pius XII's secret efforts to help hundreds of thousands of Jews survive during the Holocaust. Additionally, through its partnership with the Greek Orthodox Church, PTWF also facilitated the uncovering of a document signed by the Prophet Muhammad which instructed Muslims to protect Christians and Jews until the end of their days. The Covenant of Protection has allowed for Muslims, Christians, and Jews to heal over a common will to protect. Another initiative facilitated by PTWF is Operation Baby, a collaboration between Christian, Muslim and Jewish entities to help needy Muslim, Jewish and Christian mothers in Israel. Currently, PTWF is working to help Arab minorities persecuted by the conflicts in the Middle East



Much of this work

is about disseminating the right information, about changing the narrative around religious conflict in the world. For Krupp, addressing disinformation is one of the most important things we can do to heal these conflicts. That first gesture – and the chain reaction of gestures that follows – are each mechanisms of trust that move us towards a more "positive and practical appreciation of the world's diverse religions and beliefs." The act of doing something unexpected and surprising for someone else changes the nature of a relationship, and this is the guiding principle behind what Krupp means to accomplish with PTWF.

It is important for Krupp, however, that the focus is on those that are helped and those that are helping, not about PTWF itself. He says, "We're not looking for publicity. That

would take away from the gesture, and the gesture is about the different entities, not about the nonprofit or foundation or philanthropist." The foundation works with a very low budget, and thanks to the executive board, the advisory board, and the Board Chairman Elliot Hershberg, all funds raised go directly to projects. The all-volunteer group of representatives is incredibly active and spread out across 16 countries. This distributed model allows them to focus on their mission rather than their public image.

Their directors have called them "the most famous organization in the world that no one has ever heard of." This is because PTWF focuses on their primary mission: the gesture. Krupp's advice for other nonprofits is to recognize that, while they can view their work as a series of gestures that cause great things to happen. "If you consider the larger network of relationships you're a part of, you can cause a chain-reaction" that builds trust between communities and lasting change.

In 2002, Gary and Meredith Krupp founded the <u>Pave the Way Foundation</u>, an organization whose mission is to encourage cultural, educational, charitable, and technological gestures, as well as to recognize and eradicate non-theological obstacles between the faiths. Pave the Way is an international foundation, which actively operates in 16 countries. Prior to his work with Pave the Way, Mr. Krupp had a successful career in manufacturing, and medical development. In 2000 Mr. Krupp was named Knight Commander of the Pontifical Equestrian Order of St. Gregory the Great by Pope John Paul II. He has received numerous awards and honors, including the Jewish National Fund's Centennial Tree of Life Award, an investment by permission of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II into the Anglican Order of St. John of Jerusalem, the Servitor Pacis Award (Servant of Peace) from the Holy See mission of the United Nations, the Bronze and Silver Benemerenti Medals of Good Works Sacred Constantinian Order of Francis I, the Nostre Aetate Award by Sacred Heart University, the Inside Vatican Magazine's King Solomon Bridge Builder for Peace Award, the Giuseppe Sciacca International Award for History at the Pontifical Urbaniana University in Rome, and Pope Benedict XVI raised Mr. Krupp to the rank of his pontifical order to Knights Commander with a Silver Star. In 2011, he was named Inside Vatican Magazine's one of the top ten people in the world. Mr. Krupp is a guest lecturer who has spoken on behalf of the projects of Pave the Way Foundation worldwide. His published compilation of researched documents called Pope Pius XII and World War II-The Documented Truth: A Compilation of International Evidence Revealing the War Time Acts of the Vatican.

I recently had the opportunity to go to Rome. Gary Krupp, an author I work with through the author publicity division at my company, Bohlsen Group, used to build medical facilities in New York, but his life has taken a more esoteric turn. For the last few years, Gary and his wife, Mary, have been running a non-

profit called Pave the Way Foundation, whose main goal is to build relationships between religions. They helped the Vatican digitize its archives, are helping to re-open the Orthodox Halki Seminary in Turkey and regularly help arrange interfaith tours to Israel, among numerous other things.

One of the projects they are working on now, be it by providence or happenstance, ended up being assigned to me. "Pope Pius XII and World War II: The Documented Truth" is a compilation of primary-source international evidence that reveals the wartime acts of the Vatican.

The Vatican has had more than its share of public relations problems, and I had always heard, as many have, that Pope Pius XII was either silent during the

Holocaust or even complicit. As I began to review the evidence for myself, cracks began to form in what I thought I knew to be true. Although it still seems to me that the Vatican supported Fascist governments to an extent, it is abundantly clear to me that the papal household and the Nazis had a deep gutwrenching hatred for each other.

Nazi intelligence documents that name Pope Pius XII as a collaborator in the famous Valkyrie plot to assassinate Hitler, Nazi plans for the invasion of the Vatican and the assassination of Pius XII, and documents that show how Pius XII used his own life as

leverage to halt the arrest of the Roman Jews.

Every day of this trip to Rome got more and more exciting to me as someone who is interested in military affairs, history and religion. At one point I told Gary that I needed to find a basement, because these jaw dropping experiences required me to find something deeper than floor level to facilitate the further extension of my dentition.

The most noteworthy part of my trip was of course meeting Pope Francis himself during a public audience where we presented him with a coin to commemorate a trip he had made to Israel. I spoke some broken Spanish to him and he shook my hand with the tired but bright eyes of a man carrying the burdens of being both a political and spiritual leader who is trying his best to make a difference in a chaotic world.

"Noblesse oblige," is a phrase I kept hearing during my trip. It means with nobility and station, comes great obligation.

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Covenant of Protection from Prophet Muhammad Commands Muslims to Protect Jews and Christians Until the End of Time

Pave the Way Foundation (PTWF) has identified and brought to light an original document from the Prophet Muhammad, indicating that Muslims must protect the "people of the book" (Jews and Christians) and their churches until the end of time. This covenant of protection was given to the monks of the St. Catherine monastery in Egypt, in 628 CE. The

original, which remains in the monastery, is imprinted with the hand of the Prophet Muhammad himself.

Pave the Way Foundation works to identify and eliminate non-theological obstacles between the faiths throughout the world. This covenant of protection of the Jeews and Christians was discovered through the foundation's work to encourage Islamic support for re-opening the Greek Orthodox Halki Seminary in Turkey, closed since 1971.

Recently, PTWF issued five letters to the Turkish government, signed by a group of international Muslim leaders, requesting that the seminary be reopened. The letters cited the fact that this covenant instructs the followers of Muhammad to protect the people of the book and not to interfere with the houses of their religion. The document serves as religious basis for the request to re-open the Halki seminary.

The covenant is translated as:

"This is a message from Muhammad ibn Abdullah, as a covenant to those who adopt Christianity, near and far, we are with them.

Verily I, the servants, the helpers, and my followers defend them, because Christians are my citizens; and by God! I hold out against anything that displeases them.

No compulsion is to be on them. Neither are their judges to be removed from their jobs nor their monks from their monasteries. No one is to destroy a house of their religion, to damage it, or to carry anything from it to the Muslims' houses.

Should anyone take any of these, he would spoil God's covenant and disobey His Prophet. Verily, they are my allies and have my secure charter against all that they hate.

No one is to force them to travel or to oblige them to fight. The Muslims are to fight for them.

If a female Christian is married to a Muslim, it is not to take place without her approval. She is not to be prevented from visiting her church to pray.

Their churches are to be respected. They are neither to be prevented from repairing them nor the sacredness of their covenants.

No one of the nation (Muslims) is to disobey the covenant till the Last Day (end of the world)."

Commenting on this most important document, PTWF Advisor Sheikh Syed Agha Jafri stated, "During these days when violence in the name of religion is commonplace, it is even more significant to raise worldwide awareness of this covenant of protection.

The document gives a clear order of protection, in the name of Islam, of the people of the book, means the Jews and the Christians. It is likely that very few Muslims around the world are aware that this covenant exists, even amongst the Muslim population.

This should be trumpeted worldwide to oppose those whose private agendas have insulted and sullied Islam by encouraging violence in its name."

Gary Krupp, President of PTWF, stated, "The enemies of peace are the extremists that exist within each of our faiths. Religious violence comes about from the 'tail wagging the dog' where extreme minorities instigate hatred and violence, violating benevolent precepts common to the Abrahamic faiths. If peace is ever to be achieved, Jews must take responsibility for Jewish extremists, Christians must take responsibility for Christian extremists, and Muslims must take responsibility for Muslim extremists."

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
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
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
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Top Ten People

is inadequate, since many deserving people were not chosen. But the list serves a purpose: it presents to all of us examples of heroic action, of courageous fidelity, of sacrificial love, of zeal for justice—in short, of virtue to be imitated.

We chose two women and eight men; we could just as easily have chosen two men and eight women.

1. ALICE VON HILDEBRAND

A Catholic philosopher who has defended the faith for a lifetime

2. FATHER PEDRO OPEKA

A missionary in Africa for 30 years who has saved thousands from life on garbage heaps

3. José Henriguez

The "spiritual guide" of the 33 miners who were buried, then saved, this year in Chile

4. WENDY WRIGHT

An American woman who is one of the leading voices in the world in defending innocent life

5. Brother Benedetto Possamato

An Italian religious who visits the world's poorest nations and constructs clinics for those without medical care We have chosen humble missionaries who work in obscurity but who have brought the love of Christ to thousands around the world.

And we have chosen Princes of the Church, cardinals who are close advisors of the Pope, who are carrying out important tasks of great delicacy with courage and energy.

All are Catholics except one: Gary Krupp. Though Jewish, Krupp, together with his wife, has become one of the greatest defenders of Pope Pius XII.



GARY KRUPP

ruth is a precious commodity, though that is often forgotten nowadays. People who love the truth, search for it, and are committed to finding it are rare figures. That is why Gary Krupp is so remarkable.

As a young man growing up in New York, he heard and read disturbing things about the Catholic Church, and in particular, its leader, at the time of the Second World War (1939-1945), Pope Pius XII: that Pius had "failed the Jewish community" during the Holocaust through his "silence," "indifference," and "passivity." Since Gary is Jewish, he was quite sensitive to these charges. He became angrier and angrier. "No one," he recalls today, "was more opposed to Pius XII than I."

Then, something unexpected happened. Despite his misgivings about the Church, his line of work as a developer of medical facilities brought him into close relations with the Vatican. In 2000, John Paul II made him the 7th Jewish papal night in history — a Knight

Commander of the Order of St. Gregory the Great — after Krupp saved Italian Catholic hospitals millions of dollars in equipment acquisition costs over 25 years through his free consultation work.

After he retired, Gary and his wife, Meredith, started the Pave the Way Foundation, an organization dedicated to identifying and eliminating non-theological obstacles to better relations between the world's religions. In 2006, Krupp helped facilitate the donation to the Vatican Library of one of the most important Christian manuscripts in the world, the Bodmer Papyrus (containing portions of the Gospels of St. Luke

and St. John and dating to 175 A.D.). On January 22, 2007, the papyrus was presented to Pope Benedict XVI.

Krupp and his wife then turned their attention to the ongoing dispute over Pius XII. Krupp familiarized himself with the major anti-Pius literature until he knew all its claims, inside out. Then, methodically, he began examining the veracity of each charge, consulting experts, studying primary documents, and interviewing key witnesses from the wartime period. After months of research, something close to shock set in. Gary found "unpleasant truths" all right, but not the sort he had imagined.

What he discovered was that almost everything he had heard and read about Pius XII was not only false, but positively defamatory.

Pius XII, it turned out, was among the greatest benefactors of Jews in modern times.

Determined to right a historical wrong, Gary utilized Pave the Way's resources, bringing in new contacts, and moved into action. He began writing op-ed pieces and appearing on television and radio shows to spread his message, sometimes in the face of stiff resistance. The anti-Pius establishment, he quickly learned, does not like being challenged.

In 2008, Pave the Way sponsored a three-day symposium in Rome on Pius XII, bringing together some of the top Pius specialists in the world. It garnered international attention and ended with a supportive speech by Benedict XVI, who has since declared Pius XII "Venerable." Pave the Way has also published a huge illustrated volume highlighting evidence supporting Pius XII, and continues to compile documentary evidence clearing his good name.

Even the mainstream media has taken note. Early last March, the *New York Times* published a front-page article profile of Gary, under the title, "Wartime Pope has a Huge Fan: A Jewish Knight." The article was uneven, at best, but also a sign that Krupp could no longer


be ignored. The Times piece led many people to Pave the Way's website (www.ptwf.org), where they could examine the abundance of evidence primary archival documents, interviews with first-hand witnesses, scholarly articles, etc. — discussing and documenting the evidence surrounding Pius XII. Among Pave the Way's files are revelations about Pius XII's efforts to help persecuted Jews and resist anti-Semitism, before and after he became Pope; accounts of his involvement in plots to overthrow Hitler (Pius was actually cited by the Nazis themselves as a co-conspirator); and a striking first-

hand testimony (now available on You Tube) from Archbishop Giovanni Ferrofino, a papal representative, who worked closely with Pius to help rescue 10,000 endangered Jews out of Nazi-occupied Europe, and get them to safety in the Dominican Republic.

Krupp has never claimed to be an academic or a professional historian; he is simply an ordinary citizen in search of truth. But he also knows that the quality of the evidence, not the number of degrees someone has, should determine that; and he has been more than happy to allow the evidence he has gathered speak for itself.

For his efforts on behalf of truth and historical justice, *Inside the Vatican* is pleased to honor Gary Krupp as one of its "Top Ten" people of 2010.

A Jew at the Vatican

n January, 2005, he brought to the Vatican 160 personalities from the Jewish world to thank John Paul II "for all he has done to draw the Catholic Church closer to the people of Israel." It became a historic meeting with the Polish Pope a few months before his death. Few people knew that this New York businessman was one of the three Jews at that time (now there are seven) invested in 2000 into the Pontifical Equestrian Order of St. Gregory the Great. Today, after the commitment through his foundation "to remove the nontheological obstacles among religions," Gary Krupp is engaged in a difficult battle "to reestablish the historical truth about how Pius XII saved over 800,000 Jews" from Nazi rage. Even the New York Times dedicated a front page article to him last year. This is a sign that even the main media outlets can no longer ignore this charismatic 64-year-old Jewish philanthropist, "enthused with Pope Pacelli." Krupp numbers among his friends American busi-

nessmen and politicians, regularly meets Israeli ministers and rabbis, and for 11 years has been part of the pontifical family.

CHILDREN OF ONE GOD. Born into a Jewish family in the Big Apple, Krupp recalls that it was his mother, through her secular education which respected pluralism, who sowed the seeds leading him in 2002 to found the Pave the Way Foundation.

"When I was small my mother taught me how each of us could pray differently to God but how we all believed in the one God. This, along with the friendship of our Irish Catholic neighbors, allowed me to grow up without the fear or rejection of Christians which occurs with many practicing Jews," he explains.


During his life, which led him to head a well-known medical equipment company in New York, his admiration grew for the humanitarian work the Catholic Church does in the world.

By the end of the 1980s the fame of this businessman, highly esteemed by the New

York archdiocese, had reached the Vatican. On Long Island and in the Bronx, he had opened the first diagnostic centers using CAT scans and magnetic imaging. He also was the main provider of equipment to dialysis centers in the metropolitan area. Thus, in 1989 he was contacted by Bishop Riccardo Ruotolo, then president of the hospital founded by Padre Pio in San

Giovanni Rotondo.

In a little more than a decade, Krupp had provided at no cost equipment valued at \$25 million to the House for the Relief of the Suffering. In 2000 this earned him investiture in the Pontifical Equestrian Order of St. Gregory the Great.

CREATING TIES. "The great honor John Paul II gave me, by admitting me with a small number of other Jews to the pontifical family, encouraged me to strengthen the ties between Catholics and Jews and between the Catholic Church and the State of Israel," he explains.

Thus, the Pave the Way Foundation was born. It is a non-denominational

organization for cooperation among religions and has members of various faiths. After having embraced the idea of convincing Israel to turn over the Cenacle (Upper Room) in Jerusalem to the Catholic Church (an initiative still unfulfilled), Krupp succeeded in another mission impossible. In 2006, the Apostolic Library authorized the loan to the state Museum of Israel of the manuscripts of Maimonides, among the treasures of the Vatican. The next year, Krupp convinced a Lebanese millionaire to peel off a seven figure check for the donation to the Holy See of the precious Bodmer Papyrus, presumably the oldest Gospel in the world, appearing around 150 A.D. Other cultural projects are underway with the Orthodox Patriarchate in Athens, the Franciscan Custody of the Holy Land and with the Grand Rabbinate of Israel.

THE POPE WHO SAVED THE JEWS. The harshest battle started when Krupp became interested in the periodic polemics on the role of Pope Pacelli in protecting Jews dur-

ing World War II.

"I, myself, grew up with the idea that he did nothing to save the Jews. Nobody was more anti-Pius XII than I," he says today with a smile. "Can you imagine my surprise when I discovered that the ideas I grew up with were false?"

During the past three years, Krupp has gathered and filmed testimony of survivors saved by religious and priests who had received precise instructions from the Holy See to protect as many Jews as possible. These included the Vatican diplomat, Archbishop Giovanni Ferrofino, who died last year at 98 years of age. On assignment from the Pope, he succeeded in obtaining safe conducts for 10,000 Jews who found refugee in the Dominican Republic.

Krupp organized a congress in Rome, opposed by the local Jewish community, to make public the results of his investigation. Above all, he has made available on the foundation Web site a large portion of the documentation available on Pacelli.

Part of the Jewish establishment does not like him. Others accuse him of acting like an amateur in the minefields of historical research and relations among states.

He shrugs this off: "I'm not a professional historian. I'm only a citizen in search of the truth."

The evidence gathered speaks for itself. He repeated it in January, invited by the Olympus of the U.S. press, the National Press Club of Washington, to offer his views on Pacelli. He was part of a series on religion and the press. After the article in the New York Times, the visits to the foundation website have grown continuously.

Unlike many of the interreligious organizations Pave the Way Foundation did not issue a protest or a press release of condemnation but instead set out to find out the truth of this action.

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

Was Pope Pius XII a friend to the Jews or was he Hitler's pope? As Jews, I think that most of us have grown up with the mindset that he did little to help the Jews during the Holocaust or even that he assisted in Hitler's plan to eradicate the Jews, killing millions in the process.

This battle of "did he do enough to help the Jews?" has been raging since 1963. Just like a war, there are two sides, dug in to their trenches and holding their positions. The Catholic Church, as recently as mid-December 2009, took the next step toward Eugenio Pacelli's (Pope Pius XII) canonization. If the process continues, he will at some future time be named a saint. This decision has caused a virtual uprising amongst Jewish groups and scholars, sparking the next battle in this war of opinion.

The earlier analogy of being "dug in" rings true with many of Pope Pius XII's detractors. They are so dug in that they will not look at the evidence, preferring to hold their positions. One could suppose that they worry about their own reputation, whether they would be embarrassed or whether their strength and power would be lessened by any proof that they had supported the wrong side for decades. Or is it simply that long held beliefs, however incorrect, die hard?

One may question why this simple controversy still matters in today's world. It's all water under the bridge, isn't it? Pacelli has been dead for 50 years. Perhaps it shouldn't matter. Yet this issue has driven a wedge between Catholics and Jews that will have long-term adverse effects on any hope of good relations between the groups. This issue, if left unresolved, could also reverse many of the good works done by Pope John Paul II, who too is being advanced toward sainthood, through which he helped the Jewish people and made unprecedented strives towards improving torn relations between these two great peoples.

At Pave the Way Foundation, our mission is to remove obstacles that come between religious groups. This issue is the most serious rift right now between Jews and Catholics, which impacts over 1.1 billion people. Over three years ago, we embarked upon a research project to discover the truth. We have been compiling evidence from many countries (over 5000 documents) and conducting and filming interviews with the remaining eyewitnesses, those who can tell us what really happened, what they heard with their own ears, what they saw with their own eyes.

We ask only that anyone concerned with the issue LOOK at the evidence and make up their own mind. Jewish historian, theologian and Israeli Ambassador, Pinchas Lapide, stated that Pius XII saved as many as 860,000 Jews (today possibly 20% of the world's Jewish population). Albert Einstein, Golda Meir, Chief Rabbi of Palestine Herzog, Chief Rabbi of Rome Toaff, and the heads of every Jewish organization who today are condemning Pius XII all showered praise upon him during his lifetime. Just recently on December 24, 2009, famed Nazi hunter Serge Klarsfeld defended Pius XII in France. Were all these people, who lived through the war utterly and completely misguided? Come to our website at www.ptwf.org, review the evidence and decide for yourself.

But first, to understand why Pave the Way Foundation undertook this project and to explain why the project is VITAL to future Catholic/Jewish relations, we describe how PTWF began and what we do.


On July 29, 2000. Gary Krupp, a Jewish business man in New York received a telephone call from the Vatican Ambassador to the United Nations, Archbishop Renato Martino. The Archbishop informed Gary that after nearly two decades of his donated work to help a hospital in Italy, Pope John Paul II had just knighted him to the Pontifical Knighthood of St. Gregory the Great, a Vatican State Order. As a Jewish man he had just joined an exclusive group of Jews in history to have been so honored.

Gary and his wife Meredith took this honor as a calling to change their lives and to use this highly respected position to make a meaningful change in Catholic/Jewish and Vatican/Israeli relations. Although Gary is secular, he is a passionate Zionist with a practical view on fighting anti-Semitism and anti-Israeli sentiment worldwide.

He tested his new position, when asked by Rabbi Benjamin Blech and the members of the Maimonides Research Center of Haifa and the United States to make a request that had previously been denied. Gary contacted the Vatican State and asked if he could bring a delegation of important Jewish scholars and Rabbis from around the world to the Vatican Library to see the writings of Moses Maimonides, a 13th century physician, Rabbi and scholar. The request was granted and in 2002 this providential event took place, paving the way to a personal relationship with the Vatican State that has led to a myriad of exciting and unprecedented projects among the faiths.

With the help of Mr. Norman Weisfeld, President of the Maimonides Institute in New York, they formed Pave the Way Foundation (PTWF) in order to foster positive relations between the religions through gestures and by addressing pressing non-theological issues of discord in order to fight anti-Semitism and the use of religion as a tool to justify violence and to further personal agendas. The driving force quietly behind this work since 2003 is that of PTWF's Chairman Elliot M. Hershberg, whose take no prisoners attitude has enabled PTWF to engage controversial subjects simply because they should rather than avoiding disturbing issues because of fund raising concerns.

Pave the Way Foundation has changed the course of history between faiths through some incredible projects. In 2005, Pave the Way initiated the largest Jewish audience in history to greet and thank Pope John Paul II for all he had done for the Jewish people and for the state of Israel. In 2007, PTWF initiated the first loan in history from the Vatican Library to the State of Israel . The Mishneh Torah of Maimonides and other manuscripts were loaned to the Israel Museum in Jerusalem. Soon after "paving the way" to these cultural exchanges, Israel loaned the Vatican a Rembrandt and a Botticelli for the 600th anniversary of the Basilica of St. Peter.















PTWF addressed problems in tourism by developing a training manual for the Israeli security personnel at Ben Gurion Airport in order to teach proper etiquette in dealing with the diverse inter-religious pilgrims entering Israel. Gary personally intervened and worked to improve relations with the Greek Orthodox and Armenian Churches in Israel. He is involved with the development of a new Palestinian Muslim third party, which seeks to make peace with Israel, build a transparent government and vastly improve infrastructure.

PTWF proudly initiated "Project Baby" where one months' supply of baby formula, diapers and baby toys are given to poor Jewish, Christian and Muslim mothers in Israel. The unique element is that the money to purchase these gifts comes from surprising sources. For example the money for the Jewish baby gifts in Israel was donated by the Islamic Center of Long Island. Recently, we procured and distributed new blankets to a senior home of Holocaust survivors from Eastern Europe.

PTWF was successful in bringing the Israeli government back to the negotiation table in order to finalize a



long promised commitment to uphold vital legal and fiscal agreements with the Vatican, which were begun when diplomatic relations were established in 1994, but have since fallen by the wayside.

Personally as a Jew, Gary Krupp feels that we are suffering under the worst anti-Semitism in history today with enemies like Islamic extremists, the Iranians and a growing number of new enemies like Venezuela and many others. We must come to recognize who the enemies of today are. The Catholic Church is not the enemy of the Jewish people and in fact has asked for forgiveness for all of its historical offenses against Judaism. They have also been the best customer of Israeli tourism since 1948.

Pave the Way identified the private sale and located a Catholic donor to acquire the Bodmer Papyrus, the oldest written version of the Gospels of St. John and St. Luke and presented it to Pope Benedict XVI in January 2007. This is now one of the Vatican most prized religious manuscripts.


This brings us back to the beginning of this story, and to Pave the Way's most recent and perhaps most important undertaking so far. In early 2006, Gary and Meredith were having lunch with the Apostolic Nuncio to Israel, Archbishop Antonio Franco. The Nuncio asked if they could intercede with a very disturbing problem. He said the Holocaust Memorial of Yad Vashem in Jerusalem had placed a very hurtful and historically incorrect placard of remarks next to its portrait of Pope Pius XII.

The Krupps, both Jewish, had grown up hating Pius XII, believing him to be an anti-Semite and a Nazi collaborator, and so they shrugged off the request, feeling they did not want to get involved. But then events took a turn that made it impossible for them to look away.

Upon their return to New York, they received a phone call from a friend and PTWF board member, Rabbi Joseph Potasnik. The Rabbi asked if they would help a Jewish author and former Washington Post correspondent, Dan Kurzman, gain access in the Vatican for his research on a book he was writing on Pope Pius XII. They insisted that the mission of PTWF is to remove obstacles between the faiths and that they did not want to involve the organization in any activity that would negatively impact Catholic-Jewish relations. Rabbi Potasnik asked them to meet with Mr. Kurzman anyway, to which they agreed.

On April 7, 2006 the meeting took place. World renowned novelist and writer, Dan Kurzman told them that he was writing a book about a secret and little known plot to kidnap Pope Pius XII in 1942, to kill the Curia, the central governing body of the entire Roman Catholic Church, and to seize the Vatican. They were incredulous as to how it could be possible that a collaborator and ally of Hitler, Pius XII, would be the target of such a plan. He explained that the exact opposite was true.

Dan said his information was based on extensive research and primarily on an exhaustive personal interview with SS-Obergruppenführer and General of the Waffen SS, General Karl Freidrich Otto Wolff, who had served as Chief of Personal Staff to the Reichsführer-SS (Heinrich





Himmler) and SS Liaison Officer to Hitler. He had interviewed Karl Wolff just after his release from prison in 1974.

This information was stunning. Pius XII has been donned "Hitler's Pope". He is a man about whom so many damning books, and even a play, have been written, regarding his silence and cold hearted lack of concern for Jewish suffering during World War II that the Krupps shuttered to even hear his name.

With this kernel of information, however, they became very curious and called a friend, Oded Ben Hur, then Israel's Ambassador to the Holy See. They asked him if he had ever heard of this kidnapping plot. He hadn't, but stated that it would be a huge story, if it were true.

Next, they contacted a close friend and historian at Yad Vashem, and was told, "We heard something about this, but it only shows that Pacelli (Pius) was simply too frightened to act." Something seemed dreadfully wrong.

In the course of further discussions, and as their interest grew, the Krupps received a telephone call from the Vatican's Ambassador to the United Nations, Archbishop Celestino Migliore. He told them that he thought they should meet with a certain Sister Margherita Marchione in New Jersey.

They drove to Sister Margehrita's Catholic convent community in Morristown, NJ, and met with this engaging, then 82-year-old nun, who has written over 10 books in defense of Pope Pius XII. Through this meeting, their eyes were opened to a reality that was literally shocking. But before long, shock turned to anger. They discovered that they had been deceived by those

whom they trusted most for historical accuracy, the scholars and historians.

As they delved further into the history of this papacy and the secret works of Eugenio Pacelli, examining real documents and recording eyewitness testimony, they came to the conclusion that this subject had been totally misrepresented. How did this happen and who was to blame?

It seems to have started with the fictitious play, by Rolf Hochhuth, called, The Deputy, written in 1963, during the Cold War. Following that, came a flurry of books, supporting negative theories about this papacy and era. The Krupps' research later uncovered absolute proof that this play, and its impact, was a well crafted plan called "Seat Twelve" hatched and implemented by the KGB against the Catholic Church.

This deception and obvious distortion of fact was further complicated by one nagging question: Why wouldn't the Vatican open the archives of the war years and the papacy of Pope Pius XII? What, if anything, are they hiding?

In 2007, Pope Benedict XVI ordered the early opening of the archives of Pope Pius XI. Why? Because the Vatican had finally completed the cataloging and now scholars and historians could come and study at least 65% of Pacelli's life as Nuncio to Germany and as Secretary of State under Pius XI, his predecessor. It comes as quite a shock that to this day, literally none of the critics or institutions have bothered to come to the open archives to attempt to uncover the truth. This lack of scholarly and academic rigor, as a matter of due process, is stunning and potentially impacts the relations of over one billion Catholics and Jews.

As they moved the investigation further, a close friend of the Krupps', Monsignor Robert Sarno, of the Congregation oft the Causes of the Saints, suggested they meet with Father Peter Gumpel, Relator (High Judge) to the Cause of Pius XII and Father Paolo Molinari, Postulator to the Cause. They proceeded to have a most incredible and revealing first meeting with Fr. Peter. He recommended that they contact William Doino, Dimitri Cavalli and Professor Ronald Rychlak for more help. After contacting these scholarly individuals and learning of their extraordinary personal research, they became personally committed to righting this terrible wrong.

After almost two years of private research, they made a case to the Board of Directors at Pave the Way Foundation and were given the "ok" to take this project on. Not all board members were happy with this decision but they agreed with the project, since the retrieval of documents and testimonies, to which Gary has unique access, could only help legitimate historians. They did this with the full knowledge that they were opening a beehive of resentment, anger and pain, proving that the long held beliefs of most Catholics and Jews was simply wrong. Yet they knew that, in the furtherance of the mission of Pave the Way Foundation, they had no choice. PTWF's goal and mission is to eliminate obstacles between the faiths and if ever there were an obstacle, this was it.

After personally flying to France to interview Msgr. Giovanni Ferrofino,

and to London to interview Sir Martin Gilbert and many others, they were convinced that they were correct in their assessment of Pacelli's secret actions to save Jewish lives, probably more than all of the worlds' political and religious leaders of the period combined. There are perhaps 3 million Jews who are alive because of his secret policies and his direct intervention.


Personally, as Jews, the Krupps were determined to make history right, especially considering how Eugenio Pacelli had been treated after his death by the very people he acted in so many ways to save. This they considered a basic Jewish responsibility, having nothing to do with the Roman Catholic Church.


In Judaism, one of the most important obligations is that of charity. According to Maimonides, one of the highest levels of charity is "anonymous", where the recipient was never aware of who helped him. In the case of Pacelli, his anonymous charity was the very tool his critics have used to surgically strip him of any credit for the acknowledged acts he ordered, and which so many nuncios and priests acted on, following a verbal chain of command, beginning at "the top", with papal instructions. Those critics allowed and encouraged every negative accusation against Pacelli. This is a "Shonda," a Jewish shame, which Pave the Way Foundation is determined to correct.

On June 18, 2008, the organization brought many Jewish Holocaust survivors to the Vatican. They met these extraordinary people through the work of Vincent Marmorale and Elizabeth Bettina Nicolosi, who were studying the lifesaving actions of the Italian people during the war. All of these people wanted desperately to thank the Pope personally for the individual actions taken by the Catholic Church in saving their lives during the war years. At that meeting with Pope Benedict XVI, a three-day symposium was announced, to be held September 15-17, 2008, in Rome. At that event, Pave the Way would make public its findings and provide a open forum for the defenders of Pacelli to make their case, based on documented facts and painstaking research, as well as his detractors.

Invitations were sent to all of the legitimate critics of Pope Pius XII and to the important Holocaust Centers in Jerusalem, Washington, and New York, asking them to attend the symposium. PTWF offered to set up teleconferencing if participants did not wish to or could not physically attend. Finally they suggested that questions be sent in advance of the symposium, to pose to the experts.

The official position of the Holocaust Memorials is that they will wait for the Vatican Archives of the war years to completely open before rendering a decision on Pius XII. If this is the case, why then has none of the institutions or critics come to Rome to study the archives that have already been opened prior to the war years? Although presentation of evidence and the reliance on eye witness testimony is the fundamental basis of establishing guilt





or innocence universally, this is simply not acceptable by archival historians when analyzing historical events.

One by one, the critics declined the invitation to try to confront these allegations by inspecting genuine documents and hearing from eye witnesses. PTWF even offered to pay for travel to Rome. In the end the critics said they would not attend because it was not a "scholarly


investigation" and accused Pave the Way of hosting a "one sided symposium." They also did not like the idea of such a presentation of historical evidence in front of everyday people.

Nonetheless, on September 15, 2008, the symposium was convened. Honored panelists included. Jesuit Historian Father and realtor Peter Gumpel, Professor Ronald Rychlak, William Doino. Sister Margherita Marchione, Dan Kurzman, Andrea Tornielli, Dr. Eugene Fisher,

Father Dennis McManus and George Blumenthal. For three days, participants poured over hundreds of documents and listened to eyewitness testimonies and comments from various experts. At the end of the symposium, videotaped interviews with many of the attendees revealed that a large percentage of these people had changed their minds about the negative

opinions they had held of Pius XII.

On September 18, 2008 our delegation of 80 participants traveled to the summer residence of the Pope Benedict XVI, where Gary Krupp delivered a statement to His Holiness on the findings and made a promise to continue to search out documents and seek the truth. Pope Benedict XVI then made an impassioned statement to us, in public defense of his predecessor.



News of this event traveled around the world and opened this 46 year old "infection" to the light of public scrutiny.

Since garnering international attention to this debate, multiple filmmakers have become interested in these events, some even beginning work on documentaries and movies based on the facts that were presented.


Pave the Way Foundation is also proud to have the support of a




tolight, an application to this section must be made. It was further decided that the organization must initiate a case for Eugenio Pacelli toberecognized as "Righteous Among Nations".

Przy pomocy założonej przeze mnie organizacji Pave the Way Foundation zbieram na calym świecie dokumenty dotyczące tych działań Piusa XII.

Co jest w tych dokumentach?

rawda. Wyłania się z nich obraz papieża, który we wprost fana-tyczny sposób walczył o uratowanie europejskich Żydów. Choćby ta-ki przykład, który powinien pana zainteresować: w październiku 1943 roku Pius XII, przy pomocy swojego delega-ta w Tokio, ocalił 460 uczniów jesziwy w Mirze. Zostali ewakuowani do Szan-ghaju. Tysiące Żydów udało się również wywieźć do Ameryki Południowej.

Na przykład do Dominikany. Papież przez całą wojnę wysyłał tam około 1,6 tysiąca Żydów rocznie. Zadanie to wykonywał jego specjalny wysłannik monsignore Giovanni Fer-rofino. On zresztą żyje do dziś, ma 98 lat i jest arcybiskupem. Może pan go o to zapytać. Ferrofino dwa razy w roku otrzymywał zaszyfrowany tele-gram prosto od Piusa XII, który tylko on mógł odcyfrować. Papieź pisał w

nim, że potrzebuje tyle i tyle wiz. Ferrofino jechal wówczas do dominikańskiego dyktatora gen. Rafaela Trujillo i .w imjenju Ojca Świetego Piusa XII" żądał wydania tych dokumentów.

Nigdy o tym nie slyszalem. Bo to ja odkrylem te historie. Gdv opowiedziałem o tym w Watykanie, tamtejsi eksperci także byli zasko-czeni. A takich przypadków było przecież bardzo dużo. To Pius XII na-klaniał admirała Miklosa Horthyego, żeby powstrzymał deportacje wę-gierskich Żydów do Auschwitz. Tylko ta interwencja uratowała 200 tysięcy ludzi. Grozil też ekskomuniką księdzu Józefowi Tiso, jeżeli bedzie stosować represje wobec Żydów. Je go specjalny wyslannik, ojciec palotyn przekazywał pieniądze na ucieczkę Żydów, m.in. z Polski do Szwajcarii i Portugalii.

Wietu Żydów uratowało się również, nie wyjeżdżając z okupowanej Pol-ski. Przetrwali w klasztorach czy na plebaniach.

Oczywiście. Rola Kościola była tu olbrzymia. To księża i zakonnicy wydawali ludziom metryki chrztu, organizowali ich ucieczki, ukrywali. Kościół katolicki był wielkim przedsiębiorstwem ratowania Żydów

Może oni to robili z dobrego serca,

wbrew papieżowi.
To niemożliwe. Bo instytucie kościelne pomagały Żydom nie tylko w Polsce, ale w calej okupowanej Euro-pie. To nie mogła być więc oddolna inicjatywa kilku poczciwych proboszczów. Dokumenty wskazuja, że była to skomplikowana, zaplanowa na w detalach operacja, której mozg znajdował się w Watykanie. Tym mo-zgiem był Pius XII. Gdy Niemcy próbowali wywieżć rzymskich Żydów. Watykan ukrył co najmniej 7 tysięcy osób. I to mialoby się stać wbrew papieżowi, pod samym jego nosem? Absurd. Mało tego, wiemy, że papież wykładał na pomoc Żydom woje prywatne pieniądze. Pius XII (Eugenio Pacelli) pochodził z zamożnej, arystokratycznej rzymskiej rodziny. Umieral bez pieniędzy.

Czy wiemy, co papież sądził o prze-śladowaniach Żydów przez Trzecią Rzesze?

ył nimi oburzony i wstrząśnięty. Reagował bardzo nerwowo, gdy część jego starań kończyła się fiaskiem. Watykańscy dyplomaci jeździli po całym świecie i pytali rozmaite rząpotayriswiecie pyłantoznaierzą dy: ilu Żydów możecie przyjąc? Ame-rykanie odpowiadali: "ani jednego". Brazylijczycy: "ani jednego". Kanadyj-czycy: "ani jednego". Itak dalej. Wszyst-ko to doprowadzało Piusa do rozpaczy. Znamy przekazy, że uderzał pięścią w stól i krzyczał: "Dlaczego Amerykanie nie rozumieją, że musimy uratować tę społeczność!?".

Amerykanie nie chcieli przyjąć Ży-dów? Przecież doskonale wiedzieli, co wyrabiają z nimi Niemcy.

Tak, a mimo to nie kiwnęli palcem. Choćby statek "St. Louis" z 900 niemieckimi Żydami na pokładzie, który w 1939 roku został zawrócony z Ameryki do Europy. Nie muszę panu mówić, co się stało z jego pasażerami. Wychwalamy dziś Roosevelta, który był obojętny wobec losu Żydów, a nienawidzimy Piusa XII, który robil wszystko, by ich ratować

Krytycy Plusa XII najczęściej zarzucają mu "milczenie wobec Zagłady". Co by się stało, gdyby papież oficjal-nie potępił Holokaust?

To by była katastrofa! Cale szczęście, że nic takiego nie zrobił.

Rozumiem, że przypuszcza pan, iż wywołatoby to jeszcze większe re-

To nie jest przypuszczenie, tylko pewność. Arcybiskup Utrechtu w 1942 roku potępił deportacje ho-lenderskich Żydów. Reakcja Niemców była natychmiastowa. Aresztowania zintensyfikowano i objęły one po raz pierwszy Żydów. którzy nawrócili się na katolicyzm. W ten sposób do Auschwitz trafiła m.in. – kanonizowana później – za konnica Edyta Stein. Znamy również relacje więżniów obozów koncentracyjnych. Gdy tylko w ra-diu watykańskim czy "L'Osservatore Romano" pojawiała się choćby najmniejsza antyniemiecka sugestia, choćby kilka słów w obronie Żydów. natychmiast strażnicy zaostrzali re-zym wobec więżniów-katolików. Obniżano im racje żywnościowe, byli bici, wyzywani - .co ten wasz śmierdzący papież znowu wymyśla" a nawet mordowani. A w prasie
 Trzeciej Rzeszy ukazywały się niewybredne karykatury szkalujące papieża.

Papież zachował się więc

Oczywiście. A mimo to dziś, post factum, właśnie tego domagają się od niego jego krytycy: "papież powinien niego jego krytycy: "papież powini był potępić Zagładę". Ci ludzie nie mają najmniejszego pojęcia o re-aliach tamtej wojny. Dlaczego Pius zachował milczenie? By ocalić życie wielu ludzi. Gdyby potępił działania Trzeciej Rzeszy, nic by to nie dało. Już widzę Hitlera, jak po słowach pa pieża posypuje głowę popiolem, przeprasza i wypuszcza Żydów z obozów. Takie potępienie byłoby więc pustym gestem, którego nega-tywne konsekwencje byłyby olbrzymie. Papież nie tylko nikomu by nie pomógł, nie tylko naraziłby wielu ludzi na śmierć, ale stracilby również możliwość dalszego pomagania Żydom.

Dlaczego?

Bo Kościolowi udało się uratować tylu Żydów, gdyż zachował immunitet swoich instytucji. Niemcy w zasadzie nie mieli prawa wchodzić na teren klasztorów, pałaców bisku-pich i tym podobnych budynków. Wyobraźmy sobie teraz, że papież na lacu Świętego Piotra potępia Holokaust. Następnego dnia Niemcy łamią immunitet kościelny i w calej Europie gestapo wkracza do budynków kościelnych. Dlaczego jednak Watykan po prostu nie otworzy archiwów i nie przetnie wszelkich spekulacji?

Dlaczego? Nie można było otworzyć naraz archiwów Piusa XII Piusa XII?

oże opowiem panu, jak w praktyce wygląda takie "otwarcie archiwów", Archiwiści watykańscy segregują i zszywa-ja wszystkie dokumenty w skoroszyty. Każda strona dostaje stempel z numerem, zostaje streszczona, a na końcu przystawia się do niej watykańską pieczęć. A z okresu papiestwa Piusa XII mamy 16 milionów stron dokumentów! Do tej pory zajmowało się tym tylko trzech ludzi. Papież Bene dykt XVI podwoił czy potroil ten ze spól. Więcej ludzi do tego przydzielić się już nie dało, gdyż muszą to być znakomicie wyszkoleni specjaliści, godni zaufania, spelniający wymogi zpieczeństwa

i dyskrecji. W przeszłości zdarzało się bowiem, że dokumenty były kradzione, niszczone, a nawet zmieniane

Powiedział pan kiedyś, że części klu-czowych dokumentów i tak nigdy nie uda się odnaleźć.

Tak, bo były natychmiast niszczo-ne przez papieza lub jego otoczenie. Siostra Pascalina Lehnert, która opiekowała się jego apartamentem, opowiadała, jak zastała Piusa XII osobiście palącego w kuchni waty-kańskiego pałacu dokument dotyczący pomocy Żydom. Pod kontec wojny żył w ciągłym zagrożeniu wkryczeniem Niemośw do Watyka-nu. Palit te dokumenty, by nie wpadły w ręce gestapo lub pracujących dla niego szpiegów, od których roilo się w Watykanie.

W lakim stopniu to zagrożenie było

General SS Karl Wolff we wrześniu 1943 roku otrzymal od Hitlera rozkaz przygotowania planu "neutralizacji papieża". Watykan miał zostać zajęty, kuria wymordowana, a Pius XII wy wieziony do Liechtensteinu. Tam miano go zamordować. Watykan doskonale się orientował, że w Berlinie snute są takie plany. Papież rozkazal nawet swojej Gwardii Szwajcarskiej, żeby pod żadnym pozorem nie otwierała ognia, gdy Niemcy wkroczą. Obrona mogla spowodować tylko masakrę. Papież nakazał zabezpieczyć też watykańską bibliotekę i zbiory muzeum na wypadek agresji. Przygotował również specjalny plan, jak pokrzyżować Niemcom szyki

Na czym polegał ten plan?

6 września 1943 roku Pius XII zwo-łał kardynalów. Powiedział, że gdy Niemcy wkroczą na teren Watykanu, nie aresztują Piusa XII, ale zwyklego księdza Eugenio Pacellego. Miał bo wiem przygotowane na biurku pismo o abdykacji, Gdy tylko Niemcy mieli postawić nogę w granicach Stolicy Apostolskiej, planowal je podpisać. Wszyscy kardynalowie mieli zaś natychmiast wyjechać do Portugalii, zwołać konklawe na wygnaniu i wybrać nowego papieża. Jak pan widzi, Pius XII żył wówczas jak w oblężonej twierdzy. Czy tak Hitler traktowalby "swojego" papieża? Szpiegowal go i planowal go zamor dować, gdyby rzeczywiście Pius był "niemieckim kolaborantem"?

Czy wiemy, jakie zdanie miał Pius XII o narodowym socjalizmie?

Brzydził się Hitlerem i jego meto-dami. I to od początku, od lat 20., gdy Hitler dopiero zaczynał swój marsz po władzę. Pacelli był wtedy w Niemczech i pisał o narodowym socjalizmie z pogardą. To była dla niego pogańska ideologia. Nazywał ją "naj-większą herezją naszych czasów". W

jest emerytowanym biznesmenem i filantropem z biznesmenem i filantropem z Nowego Jorku. W 2003 r. zalożył fundację Pave the Way, której celem jest pomoc w pojednaniu między religia-mi. Misją jego życia jest obrona dobrego imienia Piusa XII. Jan Paweł II uhonorował go Orderem świętego Grzegorza Wielkiego, jest bildma osoba pochodzenia. jest siódmą osobą pochodzenia żydowskiego, która otrzymala to prestiżowe odznaczenie. Wielo krotnie pośredniczyt w negocjacjach dyplomatycznych

między Izraelem a Watykanem. Działalność Kruppa nie podoba się jed-nak wielu przedstawicielom środowisk żydowskich w USA. Zajmująca się zwalczaniem antysemityzmu Liga przeciwko Zniestawieniu oskarżyła go ostatnio, że w sprawie Plusa XII prowadzi "kampanię dezinformacyjną".



raporcie szefa RSHA Ernsta Kaltenbrunnera sporządzonym po zamachu na Hitlera z 20 lipca 1944 roku mowa jest o tym, że Pius XII był rzem. powiązany ze spiskowcami. Wiemy również, że gdy generalowie Wehr-machtu sondowali, czy papież

mógłby pośredniczyć w tajnych roz-mowach pokojowych z aliantami zachodnimi, on odparl, że byłoby to możliwe, tylko gdyby w Rzeszy zmienil się rząd. Innymi słowy: gdyby usumieto Hitlera.

Często się mówi, że Pius XII jako przedstawiciel konserwatywnego skrzydła Kościola był nastawiony antyjudalstycznie. A co za tym idzie, był antysemita.

Obie te sprawy nie mają ze sobą nic wspólnego. Poglądy religijne pa-pieża nie miały wpływu na jego stosunek do Żydów. ie mieszam się do takich spraw. Jestem Zydem i nie moją sprawą jest to, ktoma zostać katolickim świętym. Jako Żyd uważam natomiast, że Pius XII powinien zostać uhonorowany w jerozolimskim instytu-cie Yad Vashem jako Sprawiedliwy wśród Narodów Świata. Moja fundacja stara się wpłynąć w tej sprawie na Yad Vashem. Na razie bezskutecznie.

Nie dziwi mnie to. W instytucie znajduje się obecnie plansza ze zdjęciem Piusa z niepochlebnym komenta-

Tak, to haniebne. To, co tam napisano, to zwykle klamstwo. Negatywny stosunek Życiów do Piusa XII jest dla mnie bardzo bolesny. On uratował tylu naszych rodaków, a my odplacamy mu w taki sposób. Obawiam się, że Żydzi będą musieli to odpokutować. Sam przepraszam Plusa XII ża to, że hwistalem n mim okropne rzeczy. Przez długie lata zy łem w otoczeniu, które myślało w taki sposób. Ślepo wierzylem w po-wtarzane o nim brednie, był dla mnie szwarccharakterem. Dziś glęboko tego żałuje.

Amerykańskie środowiska żydow-skie ostro pana atakują. Jest pan oskażany o prowadzenie, "ikampanii dezinformacyjnej". Krytykują pana rabini i organizacje zwalczające antysemityzm

To straszliwi hipokryci. Cały czas powtarzają, że chcą pelnej jawności, domagają się ujawnienia dokumen-tów. Ja właśnie to robię. Problem w tym, że prawda im nie odpowiada, że dokumenty nie pasują do ich teorii. A to, że dokumenty te publikuje Żyd, budzi jeszcze większą agresję. Już za kilka lat, gdy archiwa watykańskie się otworzą, wszystko się wyjaśni.

Nie jest chyba jednak łatwo iść wbrew opinii niemal całego swojego

Ależ to jest mój święty obowiązek właśnie jako Żyda! Muszę bronić pamięci tego wielkiego człowieka, który nie był Żydem, a mimo to uratowal tyle żydowskich istnień. Przecież Pius XII wcale nie musiał tego robić. Jego zadaniem była ochrona katolików i Kościoła. A mimo to tak silnie, bezinteresownie zaangażował sie w pomaganie żydowskim bliżnim. Zdradzę zresztą panu, że ja też mam mocne plecy. Swego czasu spotkalem się z najwazniejszymi rabinami w Rzymie i w Izraelu. Przedstawilem im, jakie mam zamiary. Część z nich była przeciw, ale zdecydowana więk-szość powiedziała, że chce przede wszystkim poznać prawdę. Na koniec powiem panu pewną żydowską maksymę. Jeden z najważniejszych rabinów w historii judaizmu Majmonides (1135 - 1204) powiedział kiedyś, że nawet jeżeli cały świat w coś wierzy, nie oznacza to, że jest to prawdą. Lodwrotnie, jeżeli cały świat w coś nie wierzy, nie oznacza to, że jest to nieprawdą. Ja walczę o prawdę, i będę to robił, nawet jeżeli wszyscy ludzie na ziemi będą mieli inne zdanie.

More than 8,000 pages of the Actes et Documents du Saint-Siège relatifs à la Seconde Guerre Mondiale edited by Jesuits Pierre Blet, Angelo Martini, Robert A. Graham and Burkhart Schneider (Vatican City, Vatican Publishing House, 1965-1981), will be available free of charge on the Internet. The Holy See complied with a request of the Pave the Way Fondation (PTWF) to digitalize and publish 5,125 documents of the Vatican Secret Archives dated March 1939 - May 1945. Gary Krupp, a New Yorker of Jewish descent, is Founder-President of the PTWF, which aims to remove obstacles between religions.

"In the furtherance of our mission we have recognized the papacy of the war time Pope Pius XII as a source of friction impacting over one billion people", Krupp told Jesús Colina of the Zenit Agency.

In defense of Pius XII

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A decade ago, Long Beach resident Gary Krupp was knighted by Pope John Paul II, becoming only the seventh Jewish papal knight in history.

Now, Krupp, who gained the honor mainly for helping to build an Italian hospital, is using his post and his nonprofit foundation to wade into the controversy over Pope Pius XII.

Pope Benedict XVI has helped stir the controversy by moving Pius toward sainthood, a move that has set off protests among Jewish groups and critics who contend Pius did not do enough to denounce the Holocaust or help Jews hide or escape.

Krupp disagrees, and believes the historical record shows that Pius, who was pope from 1939 to 1958, went to extensive lengths to protect Tews.

He says the Vatican has made available to him and his researchers hundreds of documents from previously closed files on Pius that describe his efforts during World War II.

The documents show "that he was not a Nazi sympathizer, that he hated Nazism far more than Communism. He was not anti-Semitic," said Krupp, 62.

He added that Pius performed numerous acts "to save Jews and do positive things for the Jewish people."

Historians have questioned

why Pius never publicly condemned the Holocaust and whether he indeed acted to help save Jews. The Catholic Church says he worked behind the scenes to avoid retaliation from Nazi and Italian fascist authorities.

Krupp has come under attack from some historians who scoff at his credentials as a researcher and believe the Vatican may be using him. He brushes the critiques off, and says he is merely unearthing - and digitalizing - the documents so that bona fide historians can see them and clear Pius' name themselves.

He said he thinks some of the attacks come because his findings are contradicting previously held ideas about Pius.

"We are attacked by scholars but not because what we are finding is not relevant . . . they criticize us for looking," he said. "They should be cheering us."

Krupp, who heads the nonprofit Manhattan-based Pave the Way Foundation, dedicated to promoting interreligious understanding, said he met personally with Pope John Paul II five times and with Benedict XVI seven times since he became pope.

In 2008 he hosted a threeday conference on Pius XII near Rome that was attended by Benedict XVI.

Friend to the Jews

Pius XII's real wartime record

GARY L. KRUPP

RECENT papal decree moved Pope Pius XII, among others, closer to sainthood - returning to the forefront the controversy over his role in World War II and the Holocaust.

Growing up Jewish in Queens, I never dreamt I would be defending the man I once believed to be a Nazi sympathizer and an anti-Semite. But my work since 2002 with my wife, Meredith, and the Pave the Way Foundation has led me to this point.

We founded Pave the Way to identify and eliminate nontheological obstacles between religions. Thus, despite our early prejudices, we decided to investigate the papacy of Pius XII (Eugenio Pacelli), one of today's greatest sources of hurt between Jews and Catholics.

After years of research in documentary evidence and eyewitness testimony, what we found shocked us. We found nothing but praise and positive

news articles concerning Pius' actions from every Jewish, Israeli and political leader of the era who lived through the war.

A few articles in the postwar era suggested that he should have done more to confront the Nazis - but it wasn't until 1963, in the wake of the fictitious play "The Deputy" (written five years after Pius died), that accusations began flowing that he had failed to act, that he was a cold-hearted Nazi sympathizer who couldn't care less about the Jewish people.

The evidence strongly suggests this was part of a KGB-directed and -financed bid to smear Pius, a Soviet disinformation campaign meant to discredit the Catholic Church, which at that time was profoundly anti-Communist.

In any case, the facts simply don't match what so many have come to believe about Pius.

It is unquestionable that Pius XII intervened to save countless Tews at a time most nations even FDR's America - refused to accept these refugees. He issued false baptismal papers and obtained visas for them to emi-

grate as "Non Aryan Catholic-Jews." He smuggled Jews into the Americas and Asia. He ordered the lifting of cloister for men and women to enter monasteries, convents and churches to hide 7,000 Jews of Rome in a single day.

Among the 5,000 pages of documents that Pave the Way has located, there is abundant evidence that Pacelli was a lifelong friend of the Jews. Some highlights:

In 1917, at the request of World Zionist Organization Director Nachum Sokolow, Nuncio Pacelli intervened with the Germans to protect the Jews of Palestine from extermination by the Ottoman Turks.

In 1925, Pacelli arranged for Sokolow to meet with Pope Benedict XV to discuss a Jewish homeland in Palestine.

• In 1930, Pacelli supported the German bishops' orders excommunicating anyone who joined "the Hitler Party."

In 1938, Pacelli intervened to defeat a Polish anti-kosher-

In 1939, A.W. Klieforth, the US consul general based in Cologne, Germany, wrote a confidential letter to Washington reporting on the "extreme-

ness" of Pacelli's hatred of National Socialism and of Hitler.

In 1947, at the United Nations, he encouraged the 17 Catholic countries out of the 33 in favor to vote for the partitioning of Palestine to create the State of Israel.

• A 1948 deposition by Gen. Karl Wolff, the SS commandant for Italy, revealed the Nazis' wartime plan to kidnap the pope, kill countless cardinals and seize the Vatican.

But the personal tales may be more compelling. Pacelli's childhood best friend was Guido Mendes, an Orthodox Jewish boy. He tells how Pacelli shared Shabbat meals with him. Mendes taught him Hebrew, and Pacelli helped him to emigrate to Palestine in 1938.

Pius XII's detractors prefer to criticize rather than simply look at the evidence. Two years ago, Pope Benedict XVI ordered the opening of the Vatican's archives up to 1939, containing much evidence of Eugenio Pacelli's activities leading up to his papacy. According to the sign-in sheets, few of Pius' critics have bothered to come to the archives to view the material.

Pinchas Lapide, a Jewish historian, theologian and Israeli ambassador, stated that the actions and policies of Pius XII saved as many as 860,000 Jews.

Were all these witnesses who lived through the war misguided?

Locals react to Pope stepping down

Many surprised but supportive of decision

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On Feb. 11, Pope Benedict XVI announced that he would be stepping down from his position as leader of the Roman Catholic Church at the end of the month. It was the first time in centuries that a pope has stepped down from his position.

People all over the world were shocked to hear the news. Following the near 30-year term of Pope John Paul II, Benedict XVI served from 2005. The pope made his announcement after announcing the canonization of new saints during the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes.

"At this time I ask all the faithful, consecrated men and women, deacons, priests and bishops of this diocese to join me in prayer for this extraordinary Pontiff," said Bishop William Murphy of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, "a holy and wise man who with great sacrifice gave himself totally to the Church which has benefited mightily from his many human gifts of intelligence and wisdom and even more from his spiritual gifts of faith and hope and love as he taught, governed and prayed for the Church showing us

always the face of God who is love."

Many who know the pope were surprised by his sudden announcement.

"I got a call from Europe at about 4 a.m. to alert me to this. And we were all quite shocked," said Gary Krupp, a former Rockville Centre resident and president of the Pave the Way Foundation. "Nobody really expected it. It was a very sad thing for us, because he is a friend."

Krupp had worked with the Vatican and had visited on many occasions. During Pope Benedict XVI's tenure, Krupp met with him 19 times. He was even knighted by the pope and his predecessor.

"There were hints about it, because we were at the Vatican about 10 times a year," Krupp said. "And when you talk to different people, people start saying things and hint, 'well, he's not feeling as strong as he used to be.' So there were hints, but just to take this position at this point was quite remarkable."

Many local Catholics were surprised by the news, but supportive of the pope's decision.

"The affects of his time as pope will endure long after all of us have passed, such as his efforts to help Anglicans reunite with

the Catholic Church, his gestures of unity towards the Orthodox Churches and other peoples throughout the world, his work on the celebration of the Holy Mass (both in the New Translation and in the Latin Extraordinary Form), his crystal clear writings and teachings, and his efforts to address the scandalous crises that have so hurt the Church in recent years," said Father Eric Fasano of Our Lady of Good Counsel Church in Inwood. "Though we are deeply saddened to see him leave the Chair of Saint Peter, our prayers and Ioving gratitude should be with our Holy Father as he continues to serve God courageously."

Fasano said that stepping down as he did
— admitting he was not well enough to serve
his position — took courage and honesty on
the pope's part. "Such honesty and selfawareness is rare, especially among those
with earthly power," he said.

"I admire and respect him for whatever his reason for stepping down as Pope is," said Valley Stream resident Ann Massa-Garofalo. "He felt he could no longer carry out his responsibilities for the benefit of the Catholic Church and Catholics all over the world and we would be much better with someone healthier and stronger to oversee the church. It took a lot of strength for him to do this."

A Recent History of Papal Acts Impacting Jewish Catholic Relations. What Does the Future Hold After Benedict XVI?

Having endured 2000 years of persecution, Jews may have a justified distrust of Christians. Today some Christians have expressed support for the enemies of Israel, further fueling this potential for distrust. Mindful of this reality, we must also acknowledge those Christian individuals and groups who have made positive efforts in support of Jews. Specifically we should take a look at the Roman Catholic Church's actions in recent decades, attempting to reverse centuries of hostility towards Jews, in an official capacity.

The church's October 1965 Declaration on the Relation of the Church with Non-Christian Religions (Nostra Aetate) made a clear statement. The document, released by Pope Paul VI and originated by Pope John XXIII before his death, was deliberate and steadfast. The declaration decries all displays of anti-Semitism made at any time by anyone. These powerful words have guided the church's actions throughout the ensuing decades. The impact of modern papacies since the 1960's represent important symbolic trends towards friendlier relations in the current

Moreover, our work with Pave the Way Foundation (PTWF) has uncovered evidence (including large numbers of documents, news reports and acknowledged historical events) showing that this relationship with the Jewish people was



atrocities against the Jewish people for centuries, along with the lies of Blood Libel and the Protocols of Zion.


Ultimately, Pope John XXIII died before Nostre Aetate was released. His successor, Pope Paul VI, was another member of the Roman Curia during the wartime papacy of Pius XII, Giovanni Montini. Paul VI announced Nostre Aetate on October 28, 1965.

Pope Paul VI also ordered a team of Jesuit historians to comb through the official diplomatic documents of the WWII wartime Secret Archives, currently closed under canonical seal, to publish the Acts and Documents of the Holy See during the Second World War. These 11 volumes in 12 books identify over 9000 diplomatic documents which, he hoped, would prove that the allegations of his predecessor Pope Pius XII were wrong. The intent was to end the new false allegations, which endangered Jewish -Catholic relations. Pave the Way Foundation asked for and was given permission to digitize this collection along with the Acts of the Holy See 1909-1965. The contents are available to historians on our website www.ptwf.org and on the Vatican website: http://www.vatican.va/archive/attiufficiali-santa-sede/index en.htm worldwide to study this important resource.

Most of the Jewish world is more familiar with the next Bishop of Rome, Pope John Paul II, himself a victim of Nazi forcefully moved forward far earlier than the 1960's, by Pope Pius XII (Eugenio Pacelli.) Posted on our website (www.ptwf.org) are numerous original documents and news reports of this surprising reality.

Pacelli's love for the Jewish people began with his childhood relationship with an Orthodox Jewish friend, Guido Mendes. Young Eugenio attended Shabbat meals at the Mendes home, and learned to speak some Hebrew. He borrowed books of the great Rabbis from his friend. This spiritual link to the origins of Christianity influenced Pacelli's relationship with the Jewish people, beginning when he entered the priesthood and ultimately ascended to the Seat of St. Peter on March 2nd, 1939. Documents show that it was Pacelli's direct action from 1917 through 1947 that ultimately led to the creation of the modern state of Israel.

As Pope Pius XII, his directives instructed Catholics worldwide to do everything possible to save the Jews from the onslaught of Nazism. Upon Pacelli's death in 1959, his successor was the Vatican's Ambassador to Bulgaria, Archbishop Angelo Roncalli (Pope John XXIII). Carrying his predecessor's policies forward, Pope John XXIII is today widely regarded as a hero to the Jewish people. Most notably he is praised for his issuance of false baptismal papers and other actions to save Jews during the Shoah. Later in his papacy, he is credited with convening the Second Vatican Council, which culminated with the historic declaration, Nostre Aetate. The declaration absolved Jews of the crime of deicide, the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. Deicide was historically used to justify

brutality in his native Poland. (John Paul II succeeded the brief papacy of John Paul II who died soon after his election). Without question the Jewish world has come to acknowledge John Paul II as one of the great Catholic leaders, who further enhanced Catholic-Jewish relations with demonstrated gestures. Most significantly, similar to Pope Pius XII's formation from his Jewish friend Guido Mendes, John Paul II's childhood Jewish friend Jerzy Kluger, (PTWF advisor in Italy until his death in 2011) had an historical impact on this great man's future actions towards the Jewish people.

John Paul instituted normalization with the State of Israel in 1994. He visited Israel March 2000, placing his prayer for forgiveness of Jewish persecution throughout Christian history in the Kotel. He mourned the murdered Jewish martyrs of the Shoah in the Hall of Remembrance at Yad Vashem, and most significantly was the first Pope since St. Peter to visit the Great Synagogue in Rome as gesture of brotherhood. His personal devotion to the Jewish people was quietly pointed out after his death when he remembered the former Chief Rabbi of Rome Elio Toaff in his will. Rabbi Toaff so welcomed Pope John Paul II to the synagogue April 13, 1986 with the words of Psalm 118:26 "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord."

PWF had the honor of thanking Pope John Paul II with the largest private Jewish audience in history January 18, 2005, as we recognized his historic gestures to the Jewish people and to Israel. We brought 168 Jewish leaders from around the world to thank this great pontiff. A Conservative,

Orthodox, and Reform rabbi each blessed the Pope in the Papal palace. The video of this historic event is on our website: www.ptwf.org. Sadly, this was his last major audience as he fell ill 11 days later.

Having a personal relationship with Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger before he was elected Pope April 19, 2005, gave us the opportunity to discuss Jewish-Catholic, and Vatican-Israeli relations with this wonderfully brilliant, yet shy man. This relationship would prove invaluable with our reaching out to him after his election.

Pope Benedict XVI previously held the post of the president of the Holy office or the sacred congregation for the doctrine of the faith for 24 years. In his capacity, he had the responsibility to write much of the edicts of the church and its relations with the Jewish people and Israel. We knew that, as pope, he would move the church along the same path of reconciliation as his predecessors. Pope Benedict XVI was different, however. His devotion to faith and personal drive caused him to take positions which were controversial but would have a far reaching impact.

May 28, 2006, Pave the Way Foundation was honored to join Pope Benedict during his pilgrimage to Poland and his historic visit to Auschwitz-Birkenau. On that special day when he prayed at the monument to martyrs, a rainbow appeared in the sky over the camp, which seemed to

signify G-ds approval of this significant

When he made his pilgrimage back home to Regensburg, Germany, his remarks to the Muslim leaders on September 12, 2006, stirred much controversy and even evoked death threats as he condemned the use of religion to justify violence. He publicly quoted the 14th=century Byzantine emperor Manuel II Palaiologos. Such a statement took enormous courage, but he said what he believed needed to be said in light of increased worldwide violence in the name of Islam.

One of his important acts caused an extreme negative reaction from the Jewish world on January 21, 2009. Pope Benedict XVI lifted the ban of excommunication against the Lefebvre followers in the illicit Society of Pope Pius X. This act was an attempt to not only unify his church, but also to neutralize this extreme rightwing group of over 1 million breakaway Catholics, and to bring them back into the teachings of the Catholic Church. The pope wanted to put an end to this groups absolute denial of the declaration of the Second Ecumenical Council and especially its objection to the modern church's relations with other faiths as declared in Nostre Aetate. One of the illicitly ordained Bishops of this group was Richard Williamson who gained notoriety as a holocaust denier.

One difficulty of this action was that no one, including many priests and Bishops, knew that all Benedict's decree did was to legally allow the Vatican Holy Office to talk to this group and to convince them to accept the dictates of the Vatican Council. The world and many Catholics thought that this community, including Bishop Williamson, was welcomed back to full communion with the Church. This was absolutely incorrect. PTWF acted immediately after this to convince Vatican officials to clarify this misconception, which they did three days later.

The Pope stood steadfast and resolute on demanding the recognition of Jewish Catholic relations. Since this group would not budge on their position, the results of negotiations have failed and the group remains excommunicated from the worldwide Catholic Church. It should also be noted that Bishop Williamson was thrown out of the Society because of his bigoted and ignorant statements on the holocaust.

May 11, 2009 Pope Benedict XVI followed in his predecessor footsteps by returning to Israel. He laid a wreath at Yad Vashem's memorial in Jerusalem, and said that the Holocaust victims "lost their lives but they will never lose their names."

May 2010- PTWF brought the head of AIPAC to personally meet with the pope to ask the Vatican to lodge a protest against the threats from Iran against State of Israel.

The Pope personally agreed to do this. Soon after that meeting, the Vatican received a scathing letter back from the Iranian government basically telling them to mind their own business.

March 2, 2011: Pope Benedict XVI Issued a sweeping exoneration of Jews for the death of Christ in his Book "Jesus of Nazareth" released March 10.

In conclusion, when we follow th acts of these historic leaders of the Roman Catholic Church, we can reach only one conclusion. Its unrelenting commitment to improving and continuing Jewish-Catholic reconciliation and cooperation can only move forward. We Jews should try to embrace Catholics as brothers and sisters, especially since anti-Semitism has increased worldwide due to the biased media and extremist demonization. We need every friend we can get.

Pave the Way Foundation (PTWF) applauds the recent efforts of the Muslim community, especially that of Dr. Mehmet Gormez, Head of the Religious Affairs Directorate, the highest religious authority in Turkey, in speaking out in favor of re-opening the Halki Seminary in Turkey. On July 5, 2012, Dr. Mehmet Gormez, made an historic visit to the Ecumenical Patriarch of Constantinople, Bartholomew I, and declared his support for reopening the Halki Seminary in the name of Islam.

In 1971, the Turkish government closed the Halki seminary, which is the oldest and most important religious education institution in the Orthodox Church. This followed earlier Turkish Government decrees requiring that the Patriarch must be a Turkish citizen, creating a grave crisis for the Christian Orthodox Church affecting more than 300 million Christian Orthodox faithful (the second largest Christian denomination in the world). Even after Dr. Gormez historic visit. Turkish Deputy Prime Minister Bekir Bozda reportedly stated that reopening Istanbuls Halki Greek Orthodox Seminary is not on the agenda of the government right now.

Pave the Way Foundation works to identify and resolve obstacles between religions. Becoming aware of this 41-year-old obstacle, the organization took action, and is now working to normalize inter-religious relations by attempting to reopen the seminary using a religious, rather than political justification. PTWF collaborated with the Interfaith Institute at the Islamic Center of Long Island, along with Muslims from many nations, in support of the reopening of the Halki Seminary in the name of Islam.

In May of this year, PTWF sent five letters to the Turkish government containing the Muslim request for Halkis reopening together with the religious justification cited. The request is based on an actual covenant of protection for the "people of the book" (a term used to describe Jews and Christians) guaranteed by the hand-printed signature of the Prophet Muhammad. In 628 AD, the monks of St. Catherine in Egypt requested that they be given protection from the Muslims. This covenant guarantees Islamic protection of the Christians and their churches from all of his followers until the end of time. Gary Krupp, President of Pave the Way Foundation, said, "We were delighted when Dr. Gormez made his historic visit to the Ecumenical Patriarch and stated his support of this important gesture made by Muslims to help a Christian cause. This historic visit sustains the legitimacy of our Islamic request made just weeks earlier. We remain very optimistic that the government of Turkey will open the seminary and see the wisdom in restoring religious tolerance.

PTWF Board Chairman Elliot Herhsberg said, Each American President since the closing of the Halki Seminary has asked the Turkish government to consider reopening it to no avail. Pave the Way Foundation has elected to take a different route by making the request on a religious rather than political



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PTWF Board of advisors member Sheikh Syed Agha Jafri said, During these days when violence in the name of religion is commonplace, it is even more significant to raise worldwide awareness of this covenant of protection. The document gives a clear order of protection, in the name of Islam, of the people of the book. It is likely that very few are aware that this covenant even exists, even amongst the Muslim population. This should be trumpeted worldwide to oppose those whose private agendas have insulted and sullied Islam by encouraging violence in its name.

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The Pope's Jewish Knight

Last week, a rare manuscript of one of Maimonides' major works returned from an exhibition in Germany to its home in the Vatican Library. According to the library's procedures, two years must pass before one of its loaned artifacts is allowed outside again. In September, the Maimonides manuscript, written by a scribe in the 15th century, will go on display in Jerusalem. "I paved the way for that to happen," said Gary Krupp, a Jewish resident of Long Island who met Pope John Paul II four times and has a network of acquaintances in the Vatican bureaucracy but is little known in the wider Jewish community. The Vatican Library's loan to the Israel Museum will go forward, despite the pope's passing. "Nothing is changed with his death," Krupp

(www.pavethewayfoundation.org), an independent, interfaith organization under whose auspices he negotiated the loan of Maimonides' Mishna Torah and of three other centuries-old Jewish manuscripts. In the three years since Krupp founded Pave the Way, the foundation has become a major conduit between the Catholic Church and the Jewish community, and Krupp, who describes himself as a Conservative Jew but not particularly observant, is arguably one of the most effective Jewish voice in high Catholic circles. That's Commander Krupp, his title since being knighted by Pope John Paul II in 2000. Of some 2,000 people in the world invested as a Knights Commander of the Pontifical Order of St. Gregory the Great, the Catholic Church's highest honor for a layperson, he is among only seven Jews so feted. The only other ones alive now are American conductor Gilbert Levine and British philanthropist Sigmund Sternberg.Krupp was knighted in recognition for his decade of volunteer work on behalf of Casa Sollievo Della Sofferenza, a Catholic-sponsored hospital four hours from Rome. Krupp, who made a living in medical business development with an expertise in high-tech diagnostic equipment, was introduced to the hospital administrators by Long Island bishops of long acquaintance. He advised the hospital in obtaining state-of-the-art equipment. It was a natural fit," he said. "I grew up with Catholics," in Flushing, Queens. After being knighted, he left the business world to establish Pave the Way and work full time in interfaith relations. "My access was unique," he said. Krupp gathered a board of directors and advisers that includes Christian and Muslim clergy, as well as rabbis from the major denominations of Judaism. They concentrate on political, cultural and educational activities. "Nothing having to do with theology." Krupp calls John Paul II "the most

marvelous man I have ever met." After a few trips to Israel and several to Italy, he numbers among his friends Israeli leaders and Vatican officials. "When I write a letter [to someone in the Vatican], they respond." They have to, he said. "I'm a member of the household.""He's a wonderful man, an unofficial diplomat," said Rabbi David Rosen, the American Jewish Committee's international director of interreligious affairs, who has worked with Krupp for several years. "He has a deep commitment to promoting Jewish-Catholic relations. He's made a very important contribution."Lacking a personal fortune or title in a major organization, Krupp has spent a decade operating off the Jewish radar screen, using his personal connections in the Catholic hierarchy to do such things as help revive the nearly dormant diplomatic negotiations between the Holy See and Israel, organize the international delegation of 160 Jewish leaders who gathered in the Vatican in January to thank Pope John Paul II for his advocacy of Jewish interests, promote Catholic pilgrimage to Israel — and to arrange the Vatican Library's loan of the Jewish manuscripts. Pave the Way didn't send out press releases announcing these accomplishments. "I'm not looking for notoriety," said Krupp, who works with his wife Meredith, the foundation's director, on Pave the Way projects. "I concentrate on getting a job done."He calls the manuscript loan "an ancillary benefit," a small act that shows good will.Krupp did not attend the funeral of John Paul II. "I was contacted by Rome — there are no special provisions for papal knights."But he will be in the Vatican soon, he said. "I'll probably be going back there after the election of the new pope." n

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In Letter to Bishops, Pope Admits 'Mistakes'

MADRID — Pope Benedict XVI has written an unusually personal letter to bishops worldwide explaining why he revoked the excommunication of a Holocaust-denying bishop and admitting mistakes in how the Vatican handled the case.

The letter; which the Vatican will release Thursday, is a further attempt to calm the waters after Benedict pardoned four schismatic bishops, including Richard Williamson, who in a television interview broadcast in January said that there had been no Nazi gas chambers.

The revocation provoked worldwide outrage and caused Catholics and Jews alike to question-Benedict's commitment to ecumenism and the reforms of the Second Vatican Council.

In passages of the letter that appeared on Wednesday in the Italian newspaper Il Foglio, the Vatican admitted "mistakes" in handling the case, and said that in the future it would pay more attention to how news spreads over the Internet.

A YouTube video of Bishop Williamson's television interview, in which he denies the Holocaust, was widely viewed online in the days before the pope lifted the excommunications in late January.

The four belong to the ultraconservative Society of St. Pius X. They had been excommunicated by Pope John Paul II after being consecrated without a papal mandate, causing the only formal schism in the church.

In passages from the pope's letter posted Wednesday on the blog of a veteran Vatican reporter, Andrea Tornielli, Benedict said he considered revoking the excommunication "a modest act of mercy" toward the bishops,

whose ordinations were "valid but illicit."

"Instead," Mr. Tornielli quotes the letter saying, "it suddenly appeared something completely different: as the denial of reconciliation between Christians and Jews."

The blog posting said the pope wrote that he had been "saddened" that "even Catholics, who should have been better able to understand things," instead seemed poised with "a hostility ready for the attack." He added that he thanked "the Jewish friends who quickly helped remove the misunderstandings and to re-establish the atmosphere of friendship and trust."

The Vatican spokesman, the Rev. Federico Lombardi, said he had no comment on the letter before its official publication.

In May, Benedict will make his first papal visit to the Holy Land, with stops expected in Jordan, Israel and the Palestinian territories: In news accounts this week, Archbishop Antonio Franco, the apostolic nuncio to the Holy Land, said Benedict would not enter the Holocaust museum at Yad Vashem in Jerusalem because it had a contentious plaque criticizing Pope Pius XII for not doing enough to help save Jews during the Holocaust.

The legacy of Pius is a main sticking point in Vatican-Jewish relations. Benedict, like other popes, has said Pius worked "secretly and silently" to save Jews.

Father Lombardi said that the pope would visit the Holocaust memorial at Yad Vashem, as John Paul II did on his historic visit to Israel in 2000, but that a museum visit had never been considered.

The pope is also expected to visit Al Aksa Mosque in Jerusalem, Father Lombardi said.

On Thursday, Benedict is expected to meet a delegation from the chief rabbinate of Israel at the Vatican.

Wartime pope's secret heroism

DOCUMENTS THAT show the wartime pope saved tens of thousands of European Jews from the Nazis have been discovered in the Vatican's

The 300 pages reveal that Pope Pius XII directly ordered convents, monas-teries and Catholic churches to hide Jews from the Gestapo.

He also helped Jews to escape to safe countries, requesting the Brazilian government to receive 3,000 "non-Aryans" and persuading the Dominican Republic to grant visas for a further 11,000 people.

The documentation from the recently-opened archives has now been posted online by the Pave the Way Foundation, a largely Jewish group invited by Yad Vashem, the Holocaust remembrance authority,

to investigate the role of the wartime

They provide further evidence to counter accusations that Pius was passive and silent in the face of the Holocaust.

Such accusations began in 1963, five years after the death of Pius, with the play, *The Deputy*, written by German Communist Rolf Hochhuth with the help of the KGB. It contained information revealed by Lt General Ion Mihai Pacepa, the highest ranking KGB agent ever to defect.

The claims against Pius have been expanded in recent years by such writers as John Cornwell, author of Hitler's Pope: The Secret History of Pius XII.

Gary Krupp, president of the Pave the Way Foundation, said that correcting the record was a matter of justice.

"Personally, as a Jew, I must state that correcting this perversion of history has really nothing to do with the Catholic Church," he said.

"It is in the interest of Jewish justice that we must acknowledge the efforts of one man, during a period when as a people we were abandoned by the rest of the world.

"It is time to recognise Pope Pius XII for what he really did rather than what he did not say."

Mr Krupp added: "From what I have seen, this is the greatest hero of World War II, without question.

"This man had German guns just 200 yards from his windows and still managed to save thousands of Jews. It is astonishing what this man actually accomplished - and did secretly.

"This wasn't Hitler's pope, this wasn't

a collaborator, this was a man Hitler was plan-ning to kill. There is not one shred of evidence that supports the 'Hit-ler's pope' theory".

The latest documentation was discovered in the secret Vatican

archives by Dr Michael Hesemann, a German historian who believes the record of Pius has been badly misrepresented.

The material includes the diary of a nun who explained how Pius asked religious houses to shelter Jews after the Gestapo arrested 1,007 people in a sweep of Rome on October 16 1943.

The nun wrote that "in these grievous situations the Holy Father wishes to save his sons, also the Jews, and orders that in convents hospitality be given to these persecuted people, and also the monasteries of enclosure must adhere to this desire of the Supreme Pontiff".

The policy saved about 5,000 lives, nearly 85 per cent of the Jewish

population of Rome, and in 1946 led to the conversion of the Chief Rabbi, Israel Zolli.

He took Eugenio as his baptismal name in honour of the pope, formerly Cardinal Eugenio Pacelli.

The latest discovery also offers evidence that, contrary to popular claims, not only was Pius never an antisemite, he was pro-Zionist in his sympathies.

As Papal Nuncio (equivalent to ambassador) to Bavaria in 1917, he intervened through the German government to assure the Jews of Palestine that they would be protected from any harm from the Ottoman Turks.

Dr Hesemann said that Pacelli also directly contacted the World Zionist Organisation representative Nachum Sokolov, and used his influence to arrange for him to meet Pope Benedict XV in 1917 to discuss a Jewish homeland in Palestine.

In 1926, Pacelli encouraged Catholics in Germany to join the Committee Pro-Palestina, which supported Jewish settlements in Palestine.

In 1938 he opposed a Polish bill outlawing shechitah because he felt that the move represented the "grave persecution" of the Jewish people.

The papers include a 1939 US foreign service document in which the US consul-general to Cologne reported how the "new Pope" had surprised him by his extreme hatred of the Nazi regime and Adolf Hitler, and how he had supported the German bishops' opposition to Nazism.

Historians will have full access to the Vatican archives dealing with the pontificate of Pius XII only after 2013.

Archivists will then have finished filing 16 million documents into 15,430 folders and 2,500 dossiers.

Yad Vashem, which is expecting a visit from Pope Benedict in May during his visit to Israel, is reserving its final judgment about Pius until its historians have studied the archives.

However, some Jewish historians, such as the late Pinchas Lapide, have estimated that the Catholic Church under Pius saved between 700,000 and 850,000 Jews from the Nazis.

This was mostly managed by providing sanctuary or passage to safe countries but also by intervening, when practicable, to stop their round-up in occupied countries.

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ADDRESS OF HIS HOLINESS BENEDICT XVI AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE SYMPOSIUM ORGANIZED BY THE "PAVE THE WAY FOUNDATION"

Hall of the Swiss, Castel Gandolfo Thursday, 19 September 2008

Dear Mr Krupp, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I am happy to meet with you at the conclusion of the important symposium organized by the *Pave the Way Foundation*. I know that many eminent scholars have participated in this reflection on the numerous works of my beloved predecessor - the Servant of God Pope Pius XII - accomplished during the difficult period around the time of the second world war. I warmly welcome each of you especially Mr Gary Krupp, President of the Foundation, whom I thank for the kind words expressed on your behalf. I am grateful to him for informing me how your work has been undertaken during the symposium. You have analyzed without bias the events of history and concerned yourselves only with seeking the truth. I also greet those accompanying you on this visit, as well as your family members and loved ones at home.

The focus of your study has been the person and the tireless pastoral and humanitarian work of Pius XII, *Pastor Angelicus*. Fifty years have passed since his pious death here at Castel Gandolfo early on the ninth of October 1958, after a debilitating disease. This anniversary provides an important opportunity to deepen our knowledge of him, to meditate on his rich teaching and to analyze thoroughly his activities. So much has been written and said of him during these last five decades and not all of the genuine facets of his diverse pastoral activity have been examined in a just light. The aim of your symposium has been precisely to address some of these deficiencies, conducting a careful and documented examination of many of his interventions, especially those in favour of the Jews who in those years were being targeted all over Europe, in accordance with the criminal plan of those who wanted to eliminate them from the face of the earth. When one draws close to this noble Pope, free from ideological prejudices, in addition to being struck by his lofty spiritual and human character one is also captivated by the example of his life and the extraordinary richness of his teaching. One can also come to appreciate the human wisdom and pastoral intensity which guided him in his long years of ministry, especially in providing organized assistance to the Jewish people.

Thanks to the vast quantity of documented material which you have gathered, supported by many authoritative testimonies, your symposium offers to the public forum the possibility of knowing more fully what Pius XII achieved for the Jews persecuted by the Nazi and fascist regimes. One understands, then, that wherever possible he spared no effort in intervening in their favour either directly or through instructions given to other individuals or to institutions of the Catholic Church. In the proceedings of your convention you have also drawn attention to his many interventions, made secretly and silently, precisely because, given the concrete

situation of that difficult historical moment, only in this way was it possible to avoid the worst and save the greatest number of Jews. This courageous and paternal dedication was recognized and appreciated during and after the terrible world conflict by Jewish communities and individuals who showed their gratitude for what the Pope had done for them. One need only recall Pius XII's meeting on the 29th of November 1945 with eighty delegates of German concentration camps who during a special Audience granted to them at the Vatican, wished to thank him personally for his generosity to them during the terrible period of Nazi-fascist persecution.

Ladies and Gentlemen, thank you for your visit and for the research you have undertaken. Thanks also to the *Pave the Way Foundation* for its ongoing activity in promoting relationships and dialogue between religions, as witnesses of peace, charity and reconciliation. It is my great hope that this year, which marks the fiftieth-anniversary of my venerated predecessor's death, will provide the opportunity to promote in-depth studies of various aspects of his life and his works in order to come to know the historical truth, overcoming every remaining prejudice. With these sentiments I invoke upon you and the proceedings of your symposium an abundance of divine blessings.

è per me un vero piacere incontrarvi al termine dell'importante simposio promosso dalla Pave the Way Foundation, che ha visto la partecipazione di eminenti studiosi per riflettere insieme sull'opera generosa compiuta dal mio venerato Predecessore, il Servo di Dio Pio XII, durante il difficile periodo del secolo scorso, che ruota attorno al secondo conflitto mondiale. A ciascuno di voi rivolgo il mio più cordiale benvenuto, Saluto in modo particolare il Sig. Gary Krupp. Presidente della Fondazione, e gli sono grato per i sentimenti espressi a nome di tutti i presenti. È passato inezzo secolo dal suo pio transito, avvenuto qui, a Castel Gandolfo nelle prime ore del 9 ottobre 1958, dopo una malattia che ne ridusse gradualmente il vigore fisico. Questo anniversario costituisce una importante opportuni-

tà per approfondirne la conoscenza, per meditarne il ricco insegnamento e per analizzare compiutamente il suo operato. Tanto si è scritto e detto di lui in questi cinque decenni e non sempre sono stati posti nella giusta luce i veri aspetti della sua multiforme azione pastorale. Scopo del vostro simposio è proprio quello di colmare alcune di tali lacune, conducendo una attenta e documentata analisi su molti suoi interventi, soprattutto su quelli a favore degli ebrei che in quegli an-

Basta ricordare l'incontro che Pio XII ebbe, il 29 novembre del 1945, con gli 80 delegati dei campi di concentramento tedeschi, i quali in una speciale udienza loro concessa in Vaticano, vollero ringraziarlo personalmente per la generosità dal Papa dimostrata verso di loro, perseguitati durante il terribile periodo del nazifascismo.

Gentili Signore e Signori, grazie per questa vostra visita e per il lavoro di ricerca che state compiendo. Grazie alla Pave the Way Foundation per la costante azione che dispiega nel favorire i rapporti e il dialogo tra le varie Religioni, in modo che esse offrano una testimonianza di pace, di carità e di riconciliazione. È mio vivo auspicio infine che quest'anno, che ci ricorda il 50" della morte di questo mio venerato Predecessore, offra l'opportunità di promuovere studi più approfonditi sui vari aspetti della sua persona e della sua attività, per giungere insieme a conoscere la verità storica, superando così ogni restante pregiudizio. recently had two encounters in Rome which I thought you might be interested in hearing about. The first was with members of the cast of the film version of the novel Angels and Demons by Dan Brown, published in 2000 — the "prequel" to The Da Vinci Code — which is scheduled for release in 2009. Some scenes for this upcoming film were shot recently during nearly a day and night on the street directly leading to St. Peter's Basilica, the Via della Conciliazione. It is the same street where my office at the Congregation for Eastern Churches is located, and within sight of my residence.

To put my "encounter" in context, it is helpful to give a brief summary of the story's plot. A Harvard "symbologist," Robert Langdon, by examining a symbol found "seared" upon the chest of a murdered physicist, recognizes "the resurgence of an ancient secret brotherhood known as the Illuminati." This organization embarks upon a "final phase" of its vendetta "against its most hated enemy - the Catholic Church." An "unstoppable bomb" is hidden in Vatican City and set to detonate. Two of the main characters (Langdon and Vittoria Vetra) purportedly attempt "to assist the Vatican in a desperate bid for survival."

The director for Angels and Demons is, as with The Da Vinci Code, Ron Howard, with Tom Hanks playing the role of Langdon, becoming, according to the online American Chronicle, "the highest paid actor for a single film."

But Howard met with a snag. The diocese of Rome decided to bar the producers from using two churches in Rome as sites for the movie.

Undeterred, the film-makers persisted, obtaining permission to film on *Via della Conciliazione*.

This is where I had the opportunity to interact directly with about 20 of the hundreds of crew members who frequented the street and adjacent areas.

They walked. They talked. They paused at coffee bars. I decided to dress casually and to mingle. Many were content to "take a break" and spoke very openly over a *cappucino*, thinking that I was just an amiable tourist.

What were their comments? Those of one person who described himself as a "production official" were quite typical: "The wretched Church is against us yet again and is making problems. There are some of us who are friends with Dan Brown (the author of the book and executive producer of the movie). Like most of us, he often says that he would do anything to demolish that detestable institution, the Catholic Church. And we will triumph. You will see."

I remarked calmly: "Excuse me, but I am not sure that I actually understand your position."

His reply, with several others chiming in their approval, was: "Within a generation there will be no more Catholic Church, at least not in Western Europe. And really the media deserves to take much of the credit for its demise.

"We see the same success now happening everywhere, even across North America. The public is finally getting our message: the Catholic Church must be weakened and eventually it must disappear from the earth. It is humanity's chief enemy. This has always been the case.

"Look at this pathetic Pope and his predecessor. Both have tried frantically to reverse the trend. But their efforts faced doom because we are too strong. And we have radio, television, Hollywood, the music and video industries, along with just about every newspaper which exists, all saying the same thing.

"It is more than many of us would have dared to hope just a few years back. It is a kind of revolution, and the colleges and universities, as well as the young, are on our side, too. Everywhere you turn the

Church has become reduced to ruins. And ruins are all that should be left!"

The Rome diocese was prudent to declare its refusal.

For beneath the movie's disguise of "saving the Vatican" lurks the familiar anti-Catholic rhetoric. There are many misrepresentations generated by the "debate about which is to be trusted – science or religion." Not surprisingly, there is total disregard for the affinities between those two spheres — as made clear by the Pontifical

Academy of Sciences. And there are the usual allegations of Vatican conspiracy and cover-up (e.g., the murder of a Pope), and of sexual impropriety (a Pope is the biological father of one priest in the story). Fraudulent theological claims are set forth (e.g., Langdon tells a class of university students that the origin of the Eucharist is found in Aztec religion and the Church simply appropriated and manipulated the ritual). The list goes on (e.g., the suggestion that Jesus was married).

The web encyclopedia, *Wikipedia*, though sometimes not a completely trustworthy source of information, does manage to identify several of the book's most glaring errors and declares that Brown is "a poor researcher of history."

My second encounter was far more edifying. I serve on the Rome board of advisors of the Pave the Way Foundation, based in New York. The organization was co-founded in 2002 by Gary and Meredith Krupp, with the purpose of promoting interreligious relations "through cultural, technological and intellectual gestures." The range of those "gestures" is as extensive as it is impressive. The motivation for Pave the Way is perhaps best expressed in its mission statement: "The time has come that we must now recognize the dangers of ignorance, which begets bigotry, apathy and silence." (www.ptwf.org)

What is remarkable is that the Krupps, a Jewish couple, have embraced, among their many causes, that of Catholic-Jewish dialogue. When the Krupps visit Rome, their "team" regularly meets and we exchange insights on

whatever the Foundation's current projects are.

Our latest gathering was especially noteworthy and joyful because on June 18, Pave the Way arranged for a "group of Holocaust survivors" to be "received in audience" by Pope Benedict XVI. These "Jewish survivors were all very grateful for the opportunity to (...) thank the Pope for the intervention of the Roman Catholic Church for saving their lives during World War II" (*Zenit*).

And there is more to come. In September, Pave the Way will host a symposium in Rome with various experts who will be panelists and who will analyze what is known to date about the Church's role during the Holocaust and with a particular focus upon Pope Pius XII. "The audience will be more than 100 mostly Jewish religious, education and community leaders from around the world."

Meanwhile, press reports say Vatican archivists studying the Church's records from the 1940s continue to prepare thousands of documents to be opened.

The net result of their efforts, like that of this crucially important symposium, will surely be to bring us closer to the truth of who is responsible for the appalling injustice done to the reputation of the heroic Pius XII.

The "demons" have had their say for long enough. Let us pray that some "angels" may finally be heard and believed!

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Other: Vatican shares artifacts with Israel

The Vatican will present the works of Moses Maimonides, one of the most influential figures in modern Jewish thought to Israel for scholarly study. With this gesture, the Vatican hopes to continue to bridge the divide between Jews and Christians worldwide.

The loaning of the manuscripts is also viewed as an offering to resolve other political and social disagreements in Israel, including Hebrew University's partial use of a convent since 1948 that the Vatican wants back, and property tax exemptions for religious institutions.

Catholic News Agency reports that later this month, Pope John Paul II will receive a delegation of about 160 rabbis, cantors and American lay Jews who wish to thank the Pope for his years of good will and hard work toward bridging cultural and religious divides between the two faiths. There, they will discuss the display of the priceless artifacts for the first time in Israel.

Gary Krupp, who helped to make the loan happen, reported to the Sun-Sentinel that the benefit of this loan and future gestures like it ?would be astronomical.?

Maimonides was a 12th century sage from Egypt known for, among other things, the first codification of Jewish law. His writings have greatly influenced both Jewish and Christian thought for centuries.

The one of a kind document, recorded by a scribe in the 1400?s is one of the few remaining records of Maimonides after Jewish opponents who considered him a heretic burned much of his original work.

During the Middle Ages, the Catholic Church safeguarded many of the major works of western thought, and retains many original documents within its archives.

The Maimonides manuscript is among at least three other medieval manuscripts, which could be on display at the Israel Museum as early as this May.

Krupp was happy to report that the Vatican had maintained the documents perfectly.

Israeli government and religious leaders of the Catholic and Jewish faiths attended the opening of the exhibit of the Maimonides Manuscripts at the Israel Museum. The exhibit opened on Tuesday, September 27th with numerous dignitaries in attendance.

Gary Krupp KCSG, and Meredith Krupp founders of the Pave the Way Foundation, led a delegation of religious leaders from the Jewish and Christian faiths to celebrate this important gesture of inter-religious cooperation. In attendance were the two chief rabbis of Israel, Archbishop Pietro Sambi, Apostolic Nuncio to Israel and the Holy Land, Fr. Raffaele Farina SBD, Prefect to the Vatican Library, Dr. Claudia Montuschi, Director of Loans for the Vatican library, Zvi Tal, of the Israeli foreign ministry, and Ambassador Moshe Fox, former Consul General for Israel in Washington DC.

" This is the first time in history these manuscripts have been on Israeli soil, representing a new level of cooperation and cultural exchange between the Holy See and the State of Israel, " said Gary Krupp KCSG, President and founder of Pave the Way Foundation, " The future looks extremely promising for many other historic advances between the Catholic Church and the Jewish people. We will continue to promote these gestures of good will to open more areas of communication and cooperation. "

Friend to the Jews

Pius XII's real wartime record

GARY L. KRUPP

RECENT papal decree moved Pope Pius XII, among others, closer to sainthood - returning to the forefront the controversy over his role in World War II and the Holocaust.

Growing up Jewish in Queens, I never dreamt I would be defending the man I once believed to be a Nazi sympathizer and an anti-Semite. But my work since 2002 with my wife, Meredith, and the Pave the Way Foundation has led me to this point.

We founded Pave the Way to identify and eliminate nontheological obstacles between religions. Thus, despite our early prejudices, we decided to investigate the papacy of Pius XII (Eugenio Pacelli), one of today's greatest sources of hurt between Jews and Catholics.

After years of research in documentary evidence and eyewitness testimony, what we found shocked us. We found nothing but praise and positive

news articles concerning Pius' actions from every Jewish, Israeli and political leader of the era who lived through the war.

A few articles in the postwar era suggested that he should have done more to confront the Nazis - but it wasn't until 1963, in the wake of the fictitious play "The Deputy" (written five years after Pius died), that accusations began flowing that he had failed to act, that he was a cold-hearted Nazi sympathizer who couldn't care less about the Jewish people.

The evidence strongly suggests this was part of a KGB-directed and -financed bid to smear Pius, a Soviet disinformation campaign meant to discredit the Catholic Church, which at that time was profoundly anti-Communist.

In any case, the facts simply don't match what so many have come to believe about Pius.

It is unquestionable that Pius XII intervened to save countless Tews at a time most nations even FDR's America - refused to accept these refugees. He issued false baptismal papers and obtained visas for them to emi-

grate as "Non Aryan Catholic-Jews." He smuggled Jews into the Americas and Asia. He ordered the lifting of cloister for men and women to enter monasteries, convents and churches to hide 7,000 Jews of Rome in a single day.

Among the 5,000 pages of documents that Pave the Way has located, there is abundant evidence that Pacelli was a lifelong friend of the Jews. Some highlights:

In 1917, at the request of World Zionist Organization Director Nachum Sokolow, Nuncio Pacelli intervened with the Germans to protect the Jews of Palestine from extermination by the Ottoman Turks.

In 1925, Pacelli arranged for Sokolow to meet with Pope Benedict XV to discuss a Jewish homeland in Palestine.

In 1930, Pacelli supported the German bishops' orders excommunicating anyone who joined "the Hitler Party."

In 1938, Pacelli intervened to defeat a Polish anti-kosher-

In 1939, A.W. Klieforth, the US consul general based in Cologne, Germany, wrote a confidential letter to Washington reporting on the "extreme-

ness" of Pacelli's hatred of National Socialism and of Hitler.

In 1947, at the United Nations, he encouraged the 17 Catholic countries out of the 33 in favor to vote for the partitioning of Palestine to create the State of Israel.

• A 1948 deposition by Gen. Karl Wolff, the SS commandant for Italy, revealed the Nazis' wartime plan to kidnap the pope, kill countless cardinals and seize the Vatican.

But the personal tales may be more compelling. Pacelli's childhood best friend was Guido Mendes, an Orthodox Jewish boy. He tells how Pacelli shared Shabbat meals with him. Mendes taught him Hebrew, and Pacelli helped him to emigrate to Palestine in 1938.

Pius XII's detractors prefer to criticize rather than simply look at the evidence. Two years ago, Pope Benedict XVI ordered the opening of the Vatican's archives up to 1939, containing much evidence of Eugenio Pacelli's activities leading up to his papacy. According to the sign-in sheets, few of Pius' critics have bothered to come to the archives to view the material.

Pinchas Lapide, a Jewish historian, theologian and Israeli ambassador, stated that the actions and policies of Pius XII saved as many as 860,000 Jews.

Albert Einstein, Golda Meir, the chief rabbi of Palestine, the chief rabbi of Rome and the heads of every Jewish organization showered praise upon him during his lifetime.

Were all these witnesses who lived through the war misguided?

Gary L. Krupp is president of the Pave the Way Foundation, which has many of the documents noted here online at ptwf.org and which will soon publish a book with the main evidence in English, Hebrew, Spanish and French.

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



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Local East Enders Are Granted An Audience With John Paul II

I can remember as a teenager attending a mass gathering with thousands of people in attendance when Pope John Paul II visited Long Island. I went with my mother, grandmother and sister and vividly recall watching him in the distance as he slowly rode by in his motorcade. Although physically far away, he was omnipresent.

On January 18th, an historic meeting took place at the Apostolic Palace in the Vatican City State of Rome. Five members of the Monte family of Montauk and more than sixty Rabbis from across the globe, along with seventy five others, bringing the total to 140 individuals, met as a group with Pope John Paul II.

The purpose of this gathering was to give thanks, pay tribute and show support of His Holiness for all his hard work on behalf of the Jewish people and for his efforts towards creating peace among different religions throughout the world. Considering the current state of affairs, the significance of this special day was perhaps even more powerful and spiritual than anticipated.

Commendatore Gary L. Krupp, President of the Pave the Way Foundation, a New York based organization dedicated to bridging the gap between religions in the name of world peace, organized the event, and just happens to be a very close friend of the Monte family. He extended an invitation to thank them for their continuous support of his organization.

Recently back from this journey, Paul Monte took a few minutes to share details of his visit with me. He told me that it was a life-changing experience and he was grateful to have been able share it with several members of his family. His father, Angelo Monte Sr., who recently celebrated his 85th birthday, had never been to Italy and certainly had never met the Pope, and was thrilled and humbled. Also in attendance was Nick Monte, Lola Monte (Nick's wife), and Paul's brother, Chip.

On the morning of the meeting, the group was informed that everyone might not have the opportunity to personally meet the Pope. Eighty-four years old, he has battled with many ailments and needs to be careful not to over-exert himself.

That morning, nine buses drove the group to the Vatican. At approximately 11:30 a.m., the visitors were escorted to Sala Clementina in the Apostolic Palace where they were asked to wait. Less than half an hour later Pope John Paul II entered the room. Commendatore Krupp delivered his spiritual words of thanks, three of the Rabbis, each representing a different sect of the Jewish Faith, bestowed their blessings on His Holiness and then the Pope warmly greeted the group and thanked everyone for coming. He gave words of encouragement and reinforced the accomplishments of the Pave the Way Foundation. "We must gather all the religions together in the name of peace," he added. He ended with a pontifical blessing on all the members of the group and a heartfelt Shalom.

Everyone applauded and then patiently waited their turns. Gary Krupp stayed at the Pope's side while each person shared a brief but intimate moment with him. Paul, Angelo Sr., Nick, Lola, and Chip were at the end of the line and were unsure if they would be able to meet the Pope. And then, His Holiness motioned to continue and they all made their way toward him. Each stood before the Pope while he took their hands and nodded his head. Each member of the delegation was handed a pontifical medallion or a set of rosary beads as a remembrance of this historic visit.

Paul mentioned that the entire group was silent for quite a while after their encounters. "Being in his presence, an amazing warm feeling came over me when I shook his hand," Chip Monte said.

Gary Krupp was honored in 2000 by The Holy See and Pope John Paul II, and was invested as a Knights Commander of the Pontifical Order of St. Gregory the Great, making him only the seventh Jewish man in history to be honored this way. His work and dedication continues to grow, gaining common ground among various religious groups.

It can sometimes be difficult to watch the news and read the papers these days. Society deals with adversity in different ways. If we work together to educate our children and open their hearts, our future generations will be in a better place. It takes many individuals to form a group and a special bond. The Pave the Way Foundation is just one example of how we can make that happen.

A New Front in the Pius Wars

A film being screened at Cannes portrays the wartime pope as a hero who saved 800,000 Jews. The truth is far less inspiring

B ACK IN 1999, British author John Cornwell published a controversial and widely publicized book called Hitler's Pope: The Secret History of Pius XII. The title was misleading on two levels: first, in that it implied and depicted Pius as a faithful Nazi; second, in that it assumed the man's story long had been kept a secret.

Six years later came a counterblast in the shape of *The Myth of Hitler's Pope*: How Pope Pius XII Rescued Jews from the Nazis by David G. Dalin, who is not only Jewish but also a rabbi.

So there we had it. A liberal Catholic accusing a pope of Nazism; a Jewish academic and ordained cleric praising the wartime pontiff as a friend of anti-Nazism and the Jewish people. The twenty-first-century Pius wars had begun.

And now, another front has opened, with the making by Catholic director and writer Liana Marabini of a movie called *Shades of Truth*, which will be shown at this month's Cannes Film Festival. The title does not appear to refer to the more famous and similarly named film about sado-masochism. However, it is somewhat painful to watch—a one-sided hagiography presenting a man who utters progressive aphorisms as he strides along Vatican hallways shaming his contemporaries as they fail to properly empathize with Europe's poor Jews. It also makes the outlandish claim that Pius saved 800,000 Jewish lives, a boast that even his most aggressive academic supporters would never make.

In one scene, which naturally is used in marketing materials for the film, Pius is shown wearing a yellow star pinned to his papal cassock. It never happened in real life, of course; and even in *Shades of Truth*, the scene is confined to a dream sequence. So it's misleading at best, if not noisily dishonest.

But imagine if the leader of world Catholicism really had worn such a symbol of degradation and genocide? Urban legend long has had it that the King of Denmark wore such a star as he rode the streets of Copenhagen in his carriage; it's not true, but the point is that those who knew him always accepted the anecdote because it was authentic to his character and attitude toward his Jewish subjects. The King of Morocco actually did request yellow stars for himself and his family when told that Moroccan Jews would have to wear them. And this from an Arab Muslim monarch living under occupation. But with Pius, the story simply doesn't fit. Even in dream.

HE STORY of Eugenio Pacelli, elected to the papacy in March 1939 as Pius XII, is complex. Anyone searching for absolute purity of motive and some sort of anachronistic philosemitism and embrace of modern pluralism will be disappointed. He was a man of his time and his faith: obsessively frightened of Communism and its campaign against the Church; obviously unaware of who would triumph in the Second World War. His official actions consistently reflected these fears and uncertainties.

Pius XII almost certainly had no personal animus against Jewish people, always rejected the eugenics and intolerance of National Socialism, and on a personal level did what he could to save the lives of Jews around him. Before he became Pope, Cardinal Pacelli drafted the papal encyclical condemning Nazi racism and had it read from every pulpit. As Pope, he had the Vatican use its assets to ransom Jews from the Nazis, ran an elaborate escape route, and hid Jewish families in the papal palace of Castel Gondolfo. In 1945, Rabbi Herzog of Jerusalem, for example, thanked Pius, "for his lifesaving efforts on behalf of the Jews during the occupation of Italy." When the pontiff died in 1958, Golda Meir, then Israeli foreign minister, delivered a eulogy at the United Nations praising the man for his work on behalf of her people.

For almost a generation, in fact, it was considered a political absolute that the Church was a member of a coalition of victims during the Second World War, and Pius was mentioned alongside Churchill and Roosevelt as part of the team of morally correct wartime leaders. It was only in the 1960s that the conversation around this issue began to change, partly because of the work of a German playwright named Rolf Hochhuth, who alleged in his 1963 play *The Deputy* that the Vatican not only had ignored the suffering of the Jews but tacitly and sometimes explicitly had supported the Nazis. The truth, however, is more of a via media than a via dolorosa.

While the Pope did not issue an outright attack on the Nazis' treatment of the Jews, his supporters argue that this was because the leaders of the Catholic Church in Holland had made just such a public statement condemning the Nazi deportation of the Jewish people. In response the Germans had arrested and murdered every Dutch Jewish convert to Catholicism they could find. (Tragically, those arrests and deportations were only a matter of time anyway.)

Pius was such a friend of the Jews, the argument continues, that when the Chief Rabbi of Rome, Israel Zolli, converted to Roman Catholicism after the war, he took Pius's name, Eugenio, in his christening as a tribute to the Pope's work on behalf of the Jews. That's also true but doesn't really change much. On a personal level, as noted above, Pius certainly did what he could to save lives; but on a public level—where multitudes could be saved—he did far less.


Pius was not "Hitler's Pope," and the Nazis always considered him a threat. His failure was that he never made that threat a reality by speaking out resolutely against the Holocaust, invariably terrified of what would happen to the world's Catholics if he did and advised by some around him that the alternative to the Germans was the Soviets. It's an understandable dilemma, but a defiant Pope could have influenced hundreds of millions of Catholics, many of them serving in armies allied to the Germans. The risk would have


been enormous, but Christianity isn't supposed to be about safety and complacency.

Thus there are indeed numerous shades of truth around Pope Pius. Unfortunately, this risible movie only deepens the polarization and so makes it more difficult for a reasonable analysis to take place. The late Sir Martin Gilbert, one of the finest historians of the Holocaust and the Second World War and a man I was fortunate enough to call a friend, once put it like this:

This was a pre-Vatican II Catholic Church in the middle of a war that, for the most part, was not between Germans and the west but Nazis and Stalinists. If, say, John Paul II had been Pope, the story may have been different. Throw in subsequent rifts between the Catholic right and left, and the regrettable politicization of the Shoah and truth is extremely difficult to find.

The entire political and religious landscape has changed today, and some of these old battles obscure contemporary truths. Pius didn't act particularly badly for a man of his era but, I suppose, he did act particularly normally. For someone thought to be the direct successor to St. Peter, given the keys of the kingdom by Jesus Christ, that's just not good enough, no matter how well that truth is shaded.









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

Secret Archives Show Vatican Tried to Stop Armenian Genocide

The evidence for Pope Francis' condemnation of Turkey's extermination of Christians

VATICAN CITY — Why did Pope Francis' controversial comments on Sunday about the "Armenian Genocide" cause such a furor in Turkey?

To help understand the true history behind the 1915-16 atrocity, Aleteia interviewed the German historian and author, Dr. Michael Hesemann, who was in Rome for Sunday's Mass in St. Peter's Basilica commemorating the 100th anniversary of the genocide, otherwise known as Metz Yeghern [the Great Evil].

The atrocity involved the Ottoman government's systematic extermination of its minority Armenian subjects inside their historic homeland which lies within the territory constituting present-day Turkey. The total number of people killed in what is also known as the Armenian Holocaust is estimated at between 1 and 1.5 million.

In a new book entitled, *The Armenian Genocide* [Völkermord an den Armeniern], Hesemann reveals for the first time the content of never-before-published documents on "the greatest crime of World War I," and how Pope Benedict XV and Vatican diplomacy tried to stop the deportations of the Armenians into the Syrian desert, save the victims and prevent the massacre of an entire people.

In this interview, Hesemann shares his findings, which include evidence of Masonic involvement, and expresses both his admiration for Pope Francis for drawing attention to the genocide of Christians and ethnic minorities, and his disappointment over the absence of the German Ambassador to the Holy See at Sunday's commemorative Mass.

Dr. Hesemann, what led you to write a book on what documents contained in the Vatican Archives reveal about the Armenian Genocide?

Actually it was a kind of coincidence. I work as an historian for the "Pave the Way Foundation" in an intensive study of all the aspects of the life of Eugenio Pacelli, the man who eventually became Pope Pius XII.

From 1917-1925, Pacelli was Nuncio in Munich, so I went through the files of the Apostolic Nunciature in Munich, only to discover one folder with the title "Persecution of the Armenians".

I opened it and found a letter of the Archbishop of Cologne, Cardinal von Hartmann, to the Chancellor of the Reich, Graf (Count) Härtling, in which he calls the persecution of the Armenians "not less brutal than the persecutions of the Christians in the first centuries of Christianity." The Archbishop requested an urgent German intervention, unfortunately in vain.

In the same file I found a copy of a letter written by Pope Benedict XV to the Sultan, asking for mercy for the innocent Armenians. These documents both touched me and aroused my curiosity. I

felt I had just touched the tip of an iceberg and was sure I would find more data, and indeed I did — some 2500 pages so far.

I soon realized that no historian had ever worked with most of these documents, and that all this information was obviously unknown even to the leading experts on the Armenocide.

Given the importance of their content, I decided to write a book, putting the documents in the context of what we already know about the events of 1915-18.

What was the most surprising and unexpected insight you discovered in the Vatican Archives about the Armenian genocide?

The most surprising insight was that the Armenian genocide was in fact just part of a bigger plan — the extermination of all non-muslim minorities in the Ottoman Empire.

The ruling "Young Turk" movement came in contact with European ideas of nationalism and the concept that only a homogenous state can be a strong state. That is why they believed that the weakness of the Ottoman Empire was caused by its multi-religious and multi-ethnic character.

They wanted to "heal" this "weakness" by eliminating all foreign elements, which first meant the Christians who numbered 19% of the population in early 1914. Besides the Armenians, also Aramaic and Assyrian Christians, Catholic and Greek Orthodox Christians were persecuted and murdered.

The Turkish claim of a conspiracy between Russia and some Armenian leaders was nothing but a lie to justify those measures. If that were really the case, why did they kill innocent women and children, too? And why didn't they spare the other Christian groups, which were never under suspicion? Indeed, the Turkish Secretary of the Interior, Talaat Bey, quite frankly told Johann Mordtmann of the German Embassy, according to a report to Berlin: "The (Turkish) government uses the war to get rid of our internal enemies — the indigenous Christians of all denominations — without diplomatic interventions by foreign nations."

This is also what we read in some of the Vatican documents, e.g. a report written by Fr. Michael Liebl, an Austrian Capuchin missionary, who learned in Samsun: "Not the Armenians, the Christians were sentenced (to death) at a secret meeting of the Young Turks 5 or 6 years ago in Thessaloniki."

What measures did Benedict XV take diplomatically to help save the Armenians from deportation into the Syrian desert?

Already in June 1915, the Vatican had a vague idea of what had happened in Eastern Anatolia. One month later, there was no doubt about the horrible massacres carried out against most of the male Armenian population. For the whole of August 1915, Msgr. Dolci — the Apostolic Delegate in Constantinople — did everything humanly possible to interfere diplomatically — without any success.

When drastic reports reached the Vatican in September 1915, Pope Benedict XV wasted no more time and decided to act. He sent an autograph to Sultan Mehmet V, pleading for mercy for the Armenians. The Turks refused even to receive it. For two months, Msgr. Dolci tried everything to present it to its addressee, but it was not received by the Sultan.

Only when he asked both the German and the Austrian ambassador for help was he granted an audience. When another four weeks later the Sultan answered, most of the deportations were already completed. All promises of the Turks to end the massacres or spare one group or the other — or to let them return home — turned out to be lies.

In December, Pope Benedict referred to the failure of any diplomatic intervention in his allocution to the Cardinals at the Consistory of December 6, 1915. In it, he spoke of "those sorrowful people

of the Armenians, almost completely driven into their extermination."

In June 1916, the Armenian Catholic Patriarch had to inform the Holy See: "The project of the extermination of the Armenians in Turkey is still going on. (...) The exiled Armenians ... are continuously driven into the desert and there stripped of all vital resources. They miserably perish from hunger, disease and extreme climate. (...) It is certain that the Ottoman government has decided to eliminate Christianity from Turkey before the World War comes to an end. And all this happens in the face of the Christian world."

Why is this only coming to light now?

Well, good question. Of course, the files from the pontificate of Benedict XV have only been open since the 1990s. Besides this, not too many historians have access to them. And perhaps just nobody had any idea what he would find there - it's only a guess.

Among the documents contained in your book, you include a letter written by the Superior of the Capuchins in Ezrurum, Fr. Norbert Hofer, to the Vatican in October 1915, which states: "The punishment of the Armenian nation (for alleged uprisings) is merely a pretext used by the Masonic Turkish government to exterminate all Christian elements in this country."

Many readers may be surprised to hear mention of the Masons in relation to the Armenian Genocide, particularly in light of the desire at the time to unite Turkey, with Sunni Islam as the state religion? Can you explain how the Masons factor into the Armenian genocide, and who are the "Young Turks" which you referred to earlier?

Yes, of course. It would have been easy and rather populist to blame Islam for the Armenian genocide, especially as we are facing the horrible events of our own time in the very same region, with Islamic States' massacre against Christians and Yazidis in the north of Syria and the Iraq.

But none of the responsible politicians, neither Talaat nor Enver nor Cemal Pasha, was a fanatic Muslim. The Young Turks were anything but fundamentalists. They were a young, revolutionary movement started by Turkish academics who had studied in most cases in Paris, where they came in contact with both the ideals of Masonry and European nationalism. Many of them were accepted by Masonic lodges and indeed the lodge of Thessaloniki became a kind of national headquarters for them.

Talaat Bey — the man responsible for the Armenocide — was even Grandmaster of the Grand Orient of the Turkish Masonry. That's a historical fact. The ideology of the Young Turks can be described as "proto-fascism." Only race did not play any role as the unifying element, since there is nothing like a "racially pure" Turk. Rather, it was substituted by religion, namely Sunni Islam.

Islam was therefore instrumentalized for political reasons. It gave all those who were involved in the killings a rationale, a justification for their deeds. But behind it was the master plan of a political ideology, which misused religion for its purposes, and so sought the homogenization of the Turkish nation.

As an historian who has studied in depth the events and circumstances surrounding the Armenian genocide, particularly those documented in the Vatican archives, what do you make of Turkey's reaction to Pope Francis' statements on Sunday in which he called the Armenian massacre a "genocide"?

I am very grateful to the Holy Father. On Sunday, we not only saw a beautiful, worthy and solemn commemoration of the Armenian martyrdom, we also experienced the victory of truth over diplomacy.

If you know how fanatically Turkey tries every means to debunk the events of 1915-1916, if you

follow the chronology of their threats against nations much bigger and more powerful than the Vatican — nations such as France, Germany and the US — you get an idea what it takes to stand up and call a "genocide" what was indeed the first genocide of the 20th century. Thank you, Pope Francis! What a great, wonderful, political pope who indeed acted as the moral conscience of the world and taught us that, as Christians, we should never be afraid of the truth.

The Turkish reaction to his brave remark could be expected. It is always the same. They claim that the Pope was misinformed, although he knows the truth from his own archives. By the way, when will the Turks open theirs?

The Turks even spoke of racism. Should we now assume that, from the Turkish point of view, it is not racist at all to kill nearly a whole nation, a religious and ethnic group, but it is racist to call this a genocide?

It is so sad that the Turks don't realize how they exclude themselves from the community of civilized nations by such acts. I mean, I am German and my nation committed the most horrible crime in history, the Shoah. But at least we admitted what we did, we deeply regret it and we tried anything possible for reconciliation and compensation.

As a Catholic, I believe that every sin and every crime can be forgiven, if you only confess and regret. But what you neither regret nor confess cannot be forgiven either. Turkey only has one chance to overcome the trauma and guilt of the darkest chapter of its history, and that is to confess and regret! And we will all forgive. If not, these wounds will always be wide open, even after 100 years.

What lessons does the history of the Armenian Genocide hold for us today, particularly in light of the present day persecution of Christians in Africa and the Middle East?

If there is one lesson we should learn from the Armenian genocide, it is this: Never turn around, never look away when your brother suffers persecution.

We all, all nations of the civilized world and first of all Germany — Turkey's ally — share the Turkish guilt, because we allowed this to happen. By opportunism, by giving other topics priority, by what Pope Francis rightly called "the globalization of indifference," which is so evil. "Cain, where is your brother Abel?" That's why nobody can ever say that he has nothing to do with the Armenian genocide, the holocaust or the fate of our Christian brothers in Syria and Iraq.

For ignoring their fate and their suffering makes us guilty, too. Not preventing a crime which happens before your very eyes makes you an accomplice of the perpetrator. We should never be ignorant, we should never be indifferent, but rather learn to act responsibly.

This is why I was so very ashamed that, of all the diplomats present in St. Peter's Basilica that morning commemorating the Armenian martyrs, the one who was missing was Annette Schavan, the German Ambassador to the Holy See. Especially since, as I explained before, Germany as Turkey's ally holds a special responsibility for their martyrdom. In her case, opportunism won over the truth. And that is a shame. We can only be people of the future if we are not afraid of the past.

Film on Pope Pius XII Debuts at Vatican

Monday's Premier of "Shades of Truth" Also Marked Late Pope's Birthday

Many are still convinced Pope Pius XII did not help the Jews during World War II and much skepticism still surrounds his pontificate.

In a film that debuted Monday in the Vatican, the protagonist, an Italian-American investigative journalist and a Jew, had this same mentality—at first.

The movie, "Shades of Truth," shows David Milan's journey as he was commissioned to do an investigation on Pope Pius XII, which brought him from New York to Rome to the Holy Land and other parts of Europe, as well as his love story and its ups and downs.

Despite his initial resistance, the writer was determined to find the truth, even if that meant overturning his views to recognize all that Pope Pius XII did to save the lives of thousands of Jews.

Realizing that Pius XII had been wrongly considered "Hitler's Pope," the skeptical journalist sees his previously held convictions dismantle with each passing page and eyewitness, even through the research and knowledge of his own loved ones.

Written and directed by filmmaker Liana Marabini, the movie which premiered on the anniversary of the birth of Eugenio Pacelli in 1876 and his election as Pope with the name of Pius XII in 1939, starred actors Christopher Lambert, Gedeon Burkhard, David Wall, Marie-Christine Barrault, Giancarlo Giannini, Remo Girone, among others.

Produced by Condor Pictures, in association with Liamar Media World, the film is based on the content of about 100,000 pages of documents and testimonies of Jewish Holocaust survivors that, due to Pope Pius XII's intervention, were saved from deportation.

The director, an admirer of the wartime Pontiff, studied for years these testimonies, along with the diplomatic activity that allowed him to save the lives of 800,000 Jews.

Gary Krupp, the Jewish director of Pave the Way Foundation, is known for his foundation's deep investigation into Pope Pius XII and whether he helped the Jews. Krupp, in the film and in an interview with ZENIT, has admitted he grew up hating Pope Pius XII, but then, after thorough research by scholars in the Vatican and the

Holy Land, realized he "was a hero." Vast documentation verifying the Pope's efforts is available on the foundation's website.

In fact, a moving part of the film, which some leaving the theater told ZENIT, was hearing how upon observing how greatly Pius XII helped the Jews in Rome, Rome's Chief Rabbi at the time converted to Catholicism and took the name Eugenio.

The film's director admits that the work of Gary and his wife Merry on Pope Pius XII was an inspiration behind this film.

Some of the actors in the film, as well as the Krupps, expressed to ZENIT their hope that this would show the world the "truth" about Pope Pius XII, that, "He was a hero, who helped the Jews," and must be better understood.

Many officials of the Roman Curia, journalists, actors, researchers, and even royalty were on hand for the premier as well as a press conference prior to the debut.

Pope Benedict XVI declared his predecessor Venerable in 2009. In 2014, Pope Francis announced his intention for the Vatican Secret Archives be opened to scholars in order to further study his predecessor's role during WWII. During his return flight from the Holy Land, the Holy Father said that Pius XII's beatification has been stalled due to the lack of a an approved miracle.

Grand Mufti of Jerusalem Issues Fatwa Condemning Murder of Copts



In Wake of Recent Tragedies, Pave the Way Foundation Learns Grand Mufti Visited Rabbis, Egyptian, Jordanian Embassies to Express Condolences

The Grand Mufti of Jerusalem and Palestine and the preacher of the Al-Aqsa Mosqu has condemned the murder of the 21 Egyptian Copts in Libya.

His Eminence Sheikh Muhammad Hussein, the Grand Mufti, said, "This criminal assault is incompatible with religion and the noble moral values," reported the International Shia News Agency Shafaqna English.

"It is but a form of spreading corruption in the land and the spirit of conflict and division between members of the Arab peoples," he continued. "It aims at unsettling security and stability in the Arab and Muslim World and realizing suspicious goals of parties lying in wait for the Ummah along with its security and values."

The group which carried out the criminal act, the religious leader described as "astray," "without values and morals that divine religions call for."

"Islam forbids any act that threatens the lives of safe and peaceful people," the Grand Mufti underscored, noting that the religion upholds that the human soul is protected and honored, and that Islam is a religion of tolerance, peace, justice, and love.

The Islamic leader also reaffirmed his belief that Arab peoples will overcome this crisis with wisdom and perseverance to make those who target them with evil, chaos, and sectarian strife, miss their opportunity to realize such a criminal incident

In addition, he presented his warm condolences to the Arab Republic of Egypt, its president, government and people, especially the Coptic community on this momentous calamity.

Pave the Way Foundation has "a warm and friendly relationship" with the Grand Mufti of Jerusalem, says Gary Krupp, who co-founded the foundation with his wife, Merry.

He told ZENIT that while in Israel, they met with the Grand Mufti on Feb 16. At that time, Krupp said, His Eminence gave Krupp his Fatwa condemning the murders of the Coptic Christians.

"The Muffi told me personally," Krupp said, "that he went to the synagogue to express his condolences to the Rabbis on the murder of the Jews in France, he visited the Egyptian and Jordanian Embassies to offer his condolences on the murder of the Coptic Christians and the Jordanian pilot."

Krupp lamented that although "the highest number of media personnel per capita in the world is in Jerusalem, not one person published this important story." He explained that after Pave the Way had it translated and put it out, it was picked up by one Arabic paper with the full English translation.

Pave the Way Foundation is an organization dedicated to bridging the gap between religions and cultures through education and interreligious dialogue. According to their website, they "strive to eliminate the use of religion as a tool which, historically has been used, by some, to achieve personal agendas and to cause conflicts."

Jewish historian honored by the Vatican speaks at Saint Stephen

n March 14, 2015, Gary
Krupp, a member of the papal
household and most decorated Jewish person in Vatican
history, came to Saint Stephen the First
Martyr parish in Sanford. Knighted by
Pope John II to the order of Saint Gregory
the Great in 2000, Krupp shared with the
audience of 120 people his ongoing efforts
to reveal the truth about Pope Pius XII,
and that Pope's efforts to save Jewish lives
during World War II.

Krupp also spoke of the Pave the Way Foundation, which he founded with his wife, Meredith, 12 years ago. According to Krupp, Pave the Way is "the only organization in the world devoted to removing obstacles among the major world religions through gestures of goodwill." Krupp's philosophy is simple: when gestures of goodwill are extended, trust develops and obstacles are overcome.

Knighted by Saint John Paul II because of the charitable

work he did for Padre Pio Hospital, Krupp found himself in the perfect position to speak to the Vatican on behalf of rabbis and scholars who had previously been denied the opportunity to view the writings of Maimonides, the texts of which were kept in the Vatican library. As a result, through his diplomatic relations with the Vatican, Krupp arranged for a group of rabbis to view the writings of this great Jewish philosopher, texts they had longed to read in their original form. These rabbis were received by Pope John Paul II in the largest Jewish audience in history and his last private

audience before his death in 2005. Thus, with this first gesture of goodwill, the idea for Pave the Way Foundation was born.

Pave the Way Foundation also arranged for the donation to the Vatican library of the Bodmer Papyrus, the oldest written version of the Gospels of St. John and St. Luke, containing the oldest written version of the Lord's Prayer (circa 175-225 AD). The Bodmer Papyrus was presented to Pope Benedict XVI in 2007.

When it comes to Pope Pius XII, Krupp has an intensely personal reason for pursuing his years' long efforts to restore the Pope's good name. Growing up, Krupp believed Pope Pius XII was "Hitler's Pope." Krupp said this began with a smear campaign created by the Russian KGB with production of the play The Deputy in 1963. As a Jew, Krupp admits to growing up hating the Pope. "I was lied to," he says. Krupp noted that in the years between 1939 and 1948, no negative news articles were written about the Pope. Only after the smear campaign did the Pope's reputation as a Nazi sympathizer start to spread.

After reviewing tens of thousands of original documents and interviewing World War II Holocaust survivors who had been personally rescued by the actions of the Pope, Krupp discovered that the Roman Catholic Church saved as many as 847,000 Jews, from whom 25 percent of the world's 16 million Jews today are descended.

Through Pave the Way, Gary and Meredith Krupp, along with the support of scholars and contributors, the truth about Pope Pius XII is now coming to light.

Secret Archives Show Vatican Tried to Stop Armenian Genocide

The evidence for Pope Francis' condemnation of Turkey's extermination of Christians

VATICAN CITY — Why did Pope Francis' controversial comments on Sunday about the "Armenian Genocide" cause such a furor in Turkey?

To help understand the true history behind the 1915-16 atrocity, Aleteia interviewed the German historian and author, Dr. Michael Hesemann, who was in Rome for Sunday's Mass in St. Peter's Basilica commemorating the 100th anniversary of the genocide, otherwise known as Metz Yeghern [the Great Evil].

The atrocity involved the Ottoman government's systematic extermination of its minority Armenian subjects inside their historic homeland which lies within the territory constituting present-day Turkey. The total number of people killed in what is also known as the Armenian Holocaust is estimated at between 1 and 1.5 million.

In a new book entitled, *The Armenian Genocide* [Völkermord an den Armeniern], Hesemann reveals for the first time the content of never-before-published documents on "the greatest crime of World War I," and how Pope Benedict XV and Vatican diplomacy tried to stop the deportations of the Armenians into the Syrian desert, save the victims and prevent the massacre of an entire people.

In this interview, Hesemann shares his findings, which include evidence of Masonic involvement, and expresses both his admiration for Pope Francis for drawing attention to the genocide of Christians and ethnic minorities, and his disappointment over the absence of the German Ambassador to the Holy See at Sunday's commemorative Mass.

Dr. Hesemann, what led you to write a book on what documents contained in the Vatican Archives reveal about the Armenian Genocide?

Actually it was a kind of coincidence. I work as an historian for the "Pave the Way Foundation" in an intensive study of all the aspects of the life of Eugenio Pacelli, the man who eventually became Pope Pius XII.

From 1917-1925, Pacelli was Nuncio in Munich, so I went through the files of the Apostolic Nunciature in Munich, only to discover one folder with the title "Persecution of the Armenians".

I opened it and found a letter of the Archbishop of Cologne, Cardinal von Hartmann, to the Chancellor of the Reich, Graf (Count) Härtling, in which he calls the persecution of the Armenians "not less brutal than the persecutions of the Christians in the first centuries of Christianity." The Archbishop requested an urgent German intervention, unfortunately in vain.

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felt I had just touched the tip of an iceberg and was sure I would find more data, and indeed I did — some 2500 pages so far.

I soon realized that no historian had ever worked with most of these documents, and that all this information was obviously unknown even to the leading experts on the Armenocide.

Given the importance of their content, I decided to write a book, putting the documents in the context of what we already know about the events of 1915-18.

What was the most surprising and unexpected insight you discovered in the Vatican Archives about the Armenian genocide?

The most surprising insight was that the Armenian genocide was in fact just part of a bigger plan — the extermination of all non-muslim minorities in the Ottoman Empire.

The ruling "Young Turk" movement came in contact with European ideas of nationalism and the concept that only a homogenous state can be a strong state. That is why they believed that the weakness of the Ottoman Empire was caused by its multi-religious and multi-ethnic character.

They wanted to "heal" this "weakness" by eliminating all foreign elements, which first meant the Christians who numbered 19% of the population in early 1914. Besides the Armenians, also Aramaic and Assyrian Christians, Catholic and Greek Orthodox Christians were persecuted and murdered.

The Turkish claim of a conspiracy between Russia and some Armenian leaders was nothing but a lie to justify those measures. If that were really the case, why did they kill innocent women and children, too? And why didn't they spare the other Christian groups, which were never under suspicion? Indeed, the Turkish Secretary of the Interior, Talaat Bey, quite frankly told Johann Mordtmann of the German Embassy, according to a report to Berlin: "The (Turkish) government uses the war to get rid of our internal enemies — the indigenous Christians of all denominations — without diplomatic interventions by foreign nations."

This is also what we read in some of the Vatican documents, e.g. a report written by Fr. Michael Liebl, an Austrian Capuchin missionary, who learned in Samsun: "Not the Armenians, the Christians were sentenced (to death) at a secret meeting of the Young Turks 5 or 6 years ago in Thessaloniki."

What measures did Benedict XV take diplomatically to help save the Armenians from deportation into the Syrian desert?

Already in June 1915, the Vatican had a vague idea of what had happened in Eastern Anatolia. One month later, there was no doubt about the horrible massacres carried out against most of the male Armenian population. For the whole of August 1915, Msgr. Dolci — the Apostolic Delegate in Constantinople — did everything humanly possible to interfere diplomatically — without any success.

When drastic reports reached the Vatican in September 1915, Pope Benedict XV wasted no more time and decided to act. He sent an autograph to Sultan Mehmet V, pleading for mercy for the Armenians. The Turks refused even to receive it. For two months, Msgr. Dolci tried everything to present it to its addressee, but it was not received by the Sultan.

Only when he asked both the German and the Austrian ambassador for help was he granted an audience. When another four weeks later the Sultan answered, most of the deportations were already completed. All promises of the Turks to end the massacres or spare one group or the other — or to let them return home — turned out to be lies.

In December, Pope Benedict referred to the failure of any diplomatic intervention in his allocution to the Cardinals at the Consistory of December 6, 1915. In it, he spoke of "those sorrowful people

of the Armenians, almost completely driven into their extermination."

In June 1916, the Armenian Catholic Patriarch had to inform the Holy See: "The project of the extermination of the Armenians in Turkey is still going on. (...) The exiled Armenians ... are continuously driven into the desert and there stripped of all vital resources. They miserably perish from hunger, disease and extreme climate. (...) It is certain that the Ottoman government has decided to eliminate Christianity from Turkey before the World War comes to an end. And all this happens in the face of the Christian world."

Why is this only coming to light now?

Well, good question. Of course, the files from the pontificate of Benedict XV have only been open since the 1990s. Besides this, not too many historians have access to them. And perhaps just nobody had any idea what he would find there - it's only a guess.

Among the documents contained in your book, you include a letter written by the Superior of the Capuchins in Ezrurum, Fr. Norbert Hofer, to the Vatican in October 1915, which states: "The punishment of the Armenian nation (for alleged uprisings) is merely a pretext used by the Masonic Turkish government to exterminate all Christian elements in this country."

Many readers may be surprised to hear mention of the Masons in relation to the Armenian Genocide, particularly in light of the desire at the time to unite Turkey, with Sunni Islam as the state religion? Can you explain how the Masons factor into the Armenian genocide, and who are the "Young Turks" which you referred to earlier?

As a Catholic, I believe that every sin and every crime can be forgiven, if you only confess and regret. But what you neither regret nor confess cannot be forgiven either. Turkey only has one chance to overcome the trauma and guilt of the darkest chapter of its history, and that is to confess and regret! And we will all forgive. If not, these wounds will always be wide open, even after 100 years.

What lessons does the history of the Armenian Genocide hold for us today, particularly in light of the present day persecution of Christians in Africa and the Middle East?

If there is one lesson we should learn from the Armenian genocide, it is this: Never turn around, never look away when your brother suffers persecution.

We all, all nations of the civilized world and first of all Germany — Turkey's ally — share the Turkish guilt, because we allowed this to happen. By opportunism, by giving other topics priority, by what Pope Francis rightly called "the globalization of indifference," which is so evil. "Cain, where is your brother Abel?" That's why nobody can ever say that he has nothing to do with the Armenian genocide, the holocaust or the fate of our Christian brothers in Syria and Iraq.

For ignoring their fate and their suffering makes us guilty, too. Not preventing a crime which happens before your very eyes makes you an accomplice of the perpetrator. We should never be ignorant, we should never be indifferent, but rather learn to act responsibly.

This is why I was so very ashamed that, of all the diplomats present in St. Peter's Basilica that morning commemorating the Armenian martyrs, the one who was missing was Annette Schavan, the German Ambassador to the Holy See. Especially since, as I explained before, Germany as Turkey's ally holds a special responsibility for their martyrdom. In her case, opportunism won over the truth. And that is a shame. We can only be people of the future if we are not afraid of the past.

A New Front in the Pius Wars

A film being screened at Cannes portrays the wartime pope as a hero who saved 800,000 Jews. The truth is far less inspiring

B ACK IN 1999, British author John Cornwell published a controversial and widely publicized book called Hitler's Pope: The Secret History of Pius XII. The title was misleading on two levels: first, in that it implied and depicted Pius as a faithful Nazi; second, in that it assumed the man's story long had been kept a secret.

Six years later came a counterblast in the shape of *The Myth of Hitler's Pope*: How Pope Pius XII Rescued Jews from the Nazis by David G. Dalin, who is not only Jewish but also a rabbi.

So there we had it. A liberal Catholic accusing a pope of Nazism; a Jewish academic and ordained cleric praising the wartime pontiff as a friend of anti-Nazism and the Jewish people. The twenty-first-century Pius wars had begun.

And now, another front has opened, with the making by Catholic director and writer Liana Marabini of a movie called *Shades of Truth*, which will be shown at this month's Cannes Film Festival. The title does not appear to refer to the more famous and similarly named film about sado-masochism. However, it is somewhat painful to watch—a one-sided hagiography presenting a man who utters progressive aphorisms as he strides along Vatican hallways shaming his contemporaries as they fail to properly empathize with Europe's poor Jews. It also makes the outlandish claim that Pius saved 800,000 Jewish lives, a boast that even his most aggressive academic supporters would never make.

In one scene, which naturally is used in marketing materials for the film, Pius is shown wearing a yellow star pinned to his papal cassock. It never happened in real life, of course; and even in *Shades of Truth*, the scene is confined to a dream sequence. So it's misleading at best, if not noisily dishonest.

But imagine if the leader of world Catholicism really had worn such a symbol of degradation and genocide? Urban legend long has had it that the King of Denmark wore such a star as he rode the streets of Copenhagen in his carriage; it's not true, but the point is that those who knew him always accepted the anecdote because it was authentic to his character and attitude toward his Jewish subjects. The King of Morocco actually did request yellow stars for himself and his family when told that Moroccan Jews would have to wear them. And this from an Arab Muslim monarch living under occupation. But with Pius, the story simply doesn't fit. Even in dream.

HE STORY of Eugenio Pacelli, elected to the papacy in March 1939 as Pius XII, is complex. Anyone searching for absolute purity of motive and some sort of anachronistic philosemitism and embrace of modern pluralism will be disappointed. He was a man of his time and his faith: obsessively frightened of Communism and its campaign against the Church; obviously unaware of who would triumph in the Second World War. His official actions consistently reflected these fears and uncertainties.

Pius XII almost certainly had no personal animus against Jewish people, always rejected the eugenics and intolerance of National Socialism, and on a personal level did what he could to save the lives of Jews around him. Before he became Pope, Cardinal Pacelli drafted the papal encyclical condemning Nazi racism and had it read from every pulpit. As Pope, he had the Vatican use its assets to ransom Jews from the Nazis, ran an elaborate escape route, and hid Jewish families in the papal palace of Castel Gondolfo. In 1945, Rabbi Herzog of Jerusalem, for example, thanked Pius, "for his lifesaving efforts on behalf of the Jews during the occupation of Italy." When the pontiff died in 1958, Golda Meir, then Israeli foreign minister, delivered a eulogy at the United Nations praising the man for his work on behalf of her people.

For almost a generation, in fact, it was considered a political absolute that the Church was a member of a coalition of victims during the Second World War, and Pius was mentioned alongside Churchill and Roosevelt as part of the team of morally correct wartime leaders. It was only in the 1960s that the conversation around this issue began to change, partly because of the work of a German playwright named Rolf Hochhuth, who alleged in his 1963 play *The Deputy* that the Vatican not only had ignored the suffering of the Jews but tacitly and sometimes explicitly had supported the Nazis. The truth, however, is more of a via media than a via dolorosa.

While the Pope did not issue an outright attack on the Nazis' treatment of the Jews, his supporters argue that this was because the leaders of the Catholic Church in Holland had made just such a public statement condemning the Nazi deportation of the Jewish people. In response the Germans had arrested and murdered every Dutch Jewish convert to Catholicism they could find. (Tragically, those arrests and deportations were only a matter of time anyway.)

Pius was such a friend of the Jews, the argument continues, that when the Chief Rabbi of Rome, Israel Zolli, converted to Roman Catholicism after the war, he took Pius's name, Eugenio, in his christening as a tribute to the Pope's work on behalf of the Jews. That's also true but doesn't really change much. On a personal level, as noted above, Pius certainly did what he could to save lives; but on a public level—where multitudes could be saved—he did far less.


Pius was not "Hitler's Pope," and the Nazis always considered him a threat. His failure was that he never made that threat a reality by speaking out resolutely against the Holocaust, invariably terrified of what would happen to the world's Catholics if he did and advised by some around him that the alternative to the Germans was the Soviets. It's an understandable dilemma, but a defiant Pope could have influenced hundreds of millions of Catholics, many of them serving in armies allied to the Germans. The risk would have


been enormous, but Christianity isn't supposed to be about safety and complacency.

Thus there are indeed numerous shades of truth around Pope Pius. Unfortunately, this risible movie only deepens the polarization and so makes it more difficult for a reasonable analysis to take place. The late Sir Martin Gilbert, one of the finest historians of the Holocaust and the Second World War and a man I was fortunate enough to call a friend, once put it like this:

This was a pre-Vatican II Catholic Church in the middle of a war that, for the most part, was not between Germans and the west but Nazis and Stalinists. If, say, John Paul II had been Pope, the story may have been different. Throw in subsequent rifts between the Catholic right and left, and the regrettable politicization of the Shoah and truth is extremely difficult to find.

The entire political and religious landscape has changed today, and some of these old battles obscure contemporary truths. Pius didn't act particularly badly for a man of his era but, I suppose, he did act particularly normally. For someone thought to be the direct successor to St. Peter, given the keys of the kingdom by Jesus Christ, that's just not good enough, no matter how well that truth is shaded.

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


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



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A Recent History of Papal Acts Impacting Jewish Catholic Relations. What Does the Future Hold After Benedict XVI?

Having endured 2000 years of persecution, Jews may have a justified distrust of Christians. Today some Christians have expressed support for the enemies of Israel, further fueling this potential for distrust. Mindful of this reality, we must

also acknowledge those Christian individuals and groups who have made positive efforts in support of Jews. Specifically we should take a look at the Roman Catholic Church's actions in recent decades, attempting to reverse centuries of hostility towards Jews, in an official capacity. The church's October 1965 Declaration on the Relation of the Church with Non-Christian Religions (Nostra Aetate) made a clear statement. The document, released by Pope Paul VI and originated by Pope John XXIII before his death, was deliberate and steadfast. The declaration decries all displays of anti-Semitism made at any time by anyone. These powerful words have guided the church's actions throughout the ensuing decades. The impact of modern papacies since the 1960's represent important symbolic trends towards friendlier relations in the current era.

Moreover, our work with Pave the Way Foundation (PTWF) has uncovered evidence (including large numbers of documents, news reports and acknowledged historical events) showing that this relationship with the Jewish people was forcefully moved forward far earlier than the 1960's, by Pope Pius XII (Eugenio Pacelli.) Posted on our website (www.ptwf.org) are numerous original documents and news reports of this surprising reality.

Pacelli's love for the Jewish people began with his childhood relationship with an Orthodox Jewish friend, Guido Mendes. Young Eugenio attended Shabbat meals at the Mendes home, and learned to speak some Hebrew. He borrowed books of the great Rabbis from his friend. This spiritual link to the origins of Christianity influenced Pacelli's relationship with the Jewish people, beginning when he entered the priesthood and ultimately ascended to the Seat of St. Peter on March 2nd, 1939. Documents show that it was Pacelli's direct action from 1917 through 1947 that ultimately led to the creation of the modern state of Israel.

As Pope Pius XII, his directives instructed Catholics worldwide to do everything possible to save the Jews from the onslaught of Nazism. Upon Pacelli's death in 1959, his successor was the Vatican's Ambassador to Bulgaria, Archbishop Angelo Roncalli (Pope John XXIII). Carrying his predecessor's policies forward, Pope John XXIII is today widely regarded as a hero to the Jewish people. Most notably he is praised for his issuance of false baptismal papers and other actions to save Jews during the Shoah. Later in his papacy, he is credited with convening the Second Vatican Council, which culminated with the historic declaration, Nostre Aetate. The declaration absolved Jews of the crime of deicide, the

crucifixion of Jesus Christ. Deicide was historically used to justify atrocities against the Jewish people for centuries, along with the lies of Blood Libel and the Protocols of Zion.

Ultimately, Pope John XXIII died before Nostre Aetate was released. His successor, Pope Paul VI, was another member of the Roman Curia during the wartime papacy of Pius XII, Giovanni Montini. Paul VI announced Nostre Aetate on October 28, 1965.

Pope Paul VI also ordered a team of Jesuit historians to comb through the official diplomatic documents of the WWII wartime Secret Archives, currently closed under canonical seal, to publish the Acts and Documents of the Holy See during the Second World War. These 11 volumes in 12 books identify over 9000 diplomatic documents which, he hoped, would prove that the allegations of his predecessor Pope Pius XII were wrong. The intent was to end the new false allegations, which endangered Jewish - Catholic relations. Pave the Way Foundation asked for and was given permission to digitize this collection along with the Acts of the Holy See 1909-1965. worldwide to study this important resource.

Most of the Jewish world is more familiar with the next Bishop of Rome, Pope John Paul II, himself a victim of Nazi brutality in his native Poland. (John Paul II succeeded the brief papacy of John Paul I who died soon after his election). Without question the Jewish world has come to acknowledge John Paul II as one of the great Catholic leaders, who further enhanced Catholic-Jewish relations with demonstrated gestures. Most significantly, similar to Pope Pius XII's formation from his Jewish friend Guido Mendes, John Paul II's childhood Jewish friend Jerzy Kluger, (PTWF advisor in Italy until his death in 2011) had an historical impact on this great man's future actions towards the Jewish people.

John Paul instituted normalization with the State of Israel in 1994. He visited Israel March 2000, placing his prayer for forgiveness of Jewish persecution throughout Christian history in the Kotel. He mourned the murdered Jewish martyrs of the Shoah in the Hall of Remembrance at Yad Vashem, and most significantly was the first Pope since St. Peter to visit the Great Synagogue in Rome as gesture of brotherhood. His personal devotion to the Jewish people was quietly pointed out after his death when he remembered the former Chief Rabbi of Rome Elio Toaff in his will. Rabbi Toaff so welcomed Pope John Paul II to the synagogue April 13, 1986 with the words of Psalm 118:26 "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord."

Pave the Way Foundation had the honor of thanking Pope John Paul II with the largest private Jewish audience in history January 18, 2005, where we recognized his historic gestures to the Jewish people and to the State of Israel. We brought 168 Jewish leaders from around the world to thank this great pontiff. A Conservative, Orthodox, and Reform rabbi each blessed the Pope in the Papal palace on that historic day. The video of this historic event is on our website, www.ptwf.org . Sadly, this was to be his last major audience as he fell ill 11 days later. vHaving a personal relationship with Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger before he was elected Pope April 19, 2005, gave us the opportunity to discuss Jewish-Catholic, and Vatican-Israeli relations with this wonderfully brilliant, yet shy man. This relationship would prove invaluable with our reaching out to him after his election.

Pope Benedict XVI previously held the post of the president of the Holy office or the sacred congregation for the doctrine of the faith for 24 years. In his capacity, he had the responsibility to write much of the edicts of the church and its relations with the Jewish people and Israel. We knew that, as pope, he would move the church along the same path of reconciliation as his predecessors. Pope Benedict XVI was different, however. His devotion to faith and personal drive caused him to take positions which were controversial but would have a far reaching impact.

May 28, 2006, Pave the Way Foundation was honored to join Pope Benedict during his pilgrimage to Poland and his historic visit to AuschwitzBirkenau. On that special day when he prayed at the monument to martyrs, a rainbow appeared in the sky over the camp, which seemed to signify G-ds approval of this significant act.

When he made his pilgrimage back home to Regensburg, Germany, his remarks to the Muslim leaders on September 12, 2006, stirred much controversy and even evoked death threats as he condemned the use of religion to justify violence. He publicly quoted the 14th-century Byzantine emperor Manuel II Palaiologos. Such a statement took enormous courage, but he said what he believed needed to be said in light of increased worldwide violence in the name of Islam.

One of his important acts caused an extreme negative reaction from the Jewish world on January 21, 2009. Pope Benedict XVI lifted the ban of excommunication against the Lefebvre followers in the illicit Society of Pope Pius X. This act was an attempt to not only unify his church, but also to neutralize this extreme rightwing group of over 1 million breakaway Catholics, and to bring them back into the teachings of the Catholic Church. The pope wanted to put an end to this groups absolute denial of the declaration of the Second Ecumenical Council and especially its objection to the modern church's relations with other faiths as declared in Nostre Aetate. One of the illicitly ordained Bishops of this group was Richard Williamson who gained notoriety as a holocaust denier.

One difficulty of this action was that no one, including many priests and Bishops, knew that all Benedict's decree did was to legally allow the Vatican Holy Office to simply talk to this group and to convinced them to accept the dictates of the Vatican Council. The world and many Catholics thought that this community, including Bishop Williamson, was welcomed back to full communion with the Church. This was absolutely incorrect. PTWF acted immediately after this announcement to convince Vatican officials to clarify this misconception, which they did three days later.

The Pope stood steadfast and resolute on demanding the recognition of Jewish Catholic relations. Since this group would not budge on their position, the results of negotiations have failed and the group remains excommunicated from the worldwide Catholic Church. It should also be noted that Bishop Williamson was thrown out of the Society because of his bigoted and ignorant statements on the holocaust. May 11, 2009 Pope Benedict XVI followed in his predecessor footsteps by returning to Israel. During his visit he laid a wreath at Yad Vashem's memorial in Jerusalem, and said that the Holocaust victims "lost their lives but they will never lose their names."

May 2010 - PTWF brought the head of AIPAC to personally meet with the pope to ask the Vatican to lodge a protest against the threats from Iran against State of Israel. The Pope personally agreed to do this. Soon after that meeting, the Vatican received a scathing letter back from the Iranian government basically telling them to mind their own business.

March 2, 2011: Pope Benedict XVI Issued a sweeping exoneration of Jews for the death of Christ in his Book "Jesus of Nazareth" released March 10.

In conclusion, when we follow that acts of these historic leaders of the Roman Catholic Church, we can reach only one conclusion. Its unrelenting commitment to improving and continuing Jewish Catholic reconciliation and cooperation can only move forward no matter who the next pope will be. As Jews we should try to embrace Catholics as brothers and sisters, especially since the current level of anti-Semitism has increased worldwide due to the biased media and extremist demonization. As Jews and Israelis we need every friend we can get.

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
